CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. The terms of sale are strictly cash on delivery to the highest bidder unless special arrangements have been made prior to the sale.
2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots; to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act in behalf of the seller. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute his decision shall be final.
3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect is returnable, but only within five days of receipt and in any case it must be received by the auctioneer within four weeks from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received and the following lots may not be returned for any reason whatsoever: Lots containing ten or more stamps; Lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; Lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of faults. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. Mail bidders will be notified of the amount of their purchases. All mail bidders who have established credit with us must make payment within three days after receipt. We reserve the right in our sole and absolute discretion to demand cash payment at the time a lot is knocked down to any bidder who has not previously established credit with us or whose account is in arrears. In the event any buyer refuses to pay cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to re-offer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. ARIZONA TERRITORIAL COVERS

The Sheldon H. Dike Collection

Sheldon H. Dike, Ph.D., of Albuquerque, New Mexico has been a leading student of Arizona Postal Markings for more than a quarter of a century. He is the author of "Arizona Territorial Postmark Catalogue" recently published and a comprehensive compilation of virtually every Arizona Territorial postmark on record.

His collection is the largest and most comprehensive collection of Arizona Territorial markings ever to be offered at auction, yet it represents only the first part of one of the largest collections of its kind ever put together. The second portion is to be offered at a later date.

As all collectors of territorial postmarks know, there is little choice of condition of some covers which are of extreme rarity. In cases where only one, two or three covers are known, they must be accepted in such condition as they exist for one has really no choice of quality. It should be noted, however, that in a great many instances of extremely rare covers with faults, the postmarks and dates are clear and unmistakeable.

In preparing this collection for sale we have been guided by Dr. Dike's research notes as to rarity, the number of covers known, the early and late dates of use and other such factors. We are also guided by his valuations, which will be found in parentheses at the end of the description of the lot.

It will be noted that the period of use has a great influence on value. Also that the value of the postmarks is greatest on cover, and is, to some extent, diminished when on post cards or government postal Cards.

Unless otherwise noted, the covers bear contemporary frankings or are entire stamped envelopes of the proper period. No special mention of condition of the stamps is given except in a few instances where the stamp or stamps may be seriously defective. Otherwise average condition is to be expected. As the postmarks are of prime importance we stress the clarity of the strike where it is essential.

The "Types" are those given in Dr. Dike's "Arizona Territorial Postmark Catalog". The book illustrates virtually every type in addition to explicit notation of dates and styles. It is a most valuable work for the library of anyone interested in Territorial postmarks and can be obtained from us at the published price of \$15.00, post-paid.
