

CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. The terms of sale are strictly cash on delivery to the highest bidder unless special arrangements have been made prior to the sale.
- 2. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots; to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act in behalf of the seller. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute his decision shall be final.
- 3. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect is returnable, but only within five days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received. The following lots may not be returned for any reason whatsoever: Lots containing ten or more stamps; Lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; Lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of any faults. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 4. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. Mail bidders will be notified of the amount of their purchases. All mail bidders who have established credit with us must make payment within three days after receipt. We reserve the right in our sole and absolute discretion to demand cash payment at the time a lot is knocked down to any bidder who has not previously established credit with us or whose account is in arrears. In the event any buyer refuses to pay cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to re-offer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
- 5. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they must be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. FOREWORD

Our Rarity Sales have long been features of the annual philatelic calendar but we celebrate Bicentennial Year with an auction of such particular magnificence that it is certain to be regarded as one of the most important Rarity Sales ever held.

It is redundant to detail items in our foreword when full description can be found in the catalogue. However, we single out a few special items without apology because this is the Bicentennial Year and we are proud to offer some pieces so particularly fitting to the occasion. First—we open the sale with one of the greatest Bicentennial covers in existence—a letter addressed to The Hon. John Hancock, Philadelphia, and postmarked New York, July 4, 1776—an unqualified First Day Cover of the United States as a nation. There are other important historic pieces, notably a land grant to a Revoluionary War officer, signed by George Washington and other members of his cabinet. There is a beautiful Free Frank of John Adams and a fine Thomas Jefferson Free Frank. Also offered is the first discovered Free Frank of James A. Garfield as President.

The Bicentennial recalls the great Centennial celebration of a hundred years ago, in honor of which the very rare and desirable Special Printings and Re-Issues of 1875 were created. Of this group of Special Printings we offer the only known complete sheets of the Government Reproductions of the 5c and 10c 1847 issue. There are choice Re-Issues and a remarkable group of Special Printings of the "Bank Note" issues. Outstanding is a complete set on hard paper with sheet margin attached.

We could fill many pages just mentioning the many superlative rarities, both United States and Foreign in the sale, but we prefer that you get the details from the catalogue itself where each lot is meticulously described and virtually all are illustrated.

In keeping with our custom, each lot will be displayed in full color on a screen, as it comes up for sale. Light refreshments will be served following the auction. As seating is limited, advance reservations are advisable. A note or a call to our office will take care of it. An appropriate souvenir of the occasion will be given to those making advance reservations.
