William Walker, The Nicaraguan "Revolution" of 1856, Lawyer & 10 Entrepreneur, Walker's First Great "Revolutionary" Endeavor was the taking of the Baja. (Early 1850's). Shortly thereafter he tried to capture Sonora, Mexico but was chased out by the Mexicans & was tried in the U.S. for treaty violation (not convicted). In 1856, he & 57 men went to Nicaragua & overthrew the Gov't. establishing a military regime. An election was held later & Walker was voted President. Later on Walker & his men were attacked & captured by Com. Hiram Paulding & returned to U.S. He was tried & convicted for treaty violation but later escaped back to Nicaragua where he was captured by the British & turned over to the Honduran Gov't. which executed him by firing squad in 1860.
