Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By placing a bid on any lot, the bidder acknowledges acceptance of and will be bound to these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lot numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to one or more of the following conditions: (i) the lot is subject to a minimum final bid (''reserve''), below which it will not be sold, (ii) the Galleries have advanced monies to the seller and have a financial interest in the lot, (iii) the Galleries have guaranteed the seller a minimum sale price, and (iv) the Galleries may have ownership interest in the lot, either in part or whole. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without reserve.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails

- to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated with the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price, plus interest accrued on the purchase price at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate from the date of payment, and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise
- Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.

Terms and Abbreviations Used in Descriptions

Centering

The width of margins and the centering of the design within perforations are graded in strict accordance with the Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue standards. The following grades are used in this catalogue:

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering, used to describe stamps which are of superior grade for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with design a bit closer to one side. Please note that this grade is superior to the one on which Scott Catalogue retail prices are based.

Fine (F): Imperforate stamps may have smaller than usual margins and perforated stamps will be noticeably off-center. Issues before 1890 may have the design touched in places. If used, fairly lightly cancelled.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations may cut into.

Good (G): Average off-centered example with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for multiples and rarities.

Gum

Stamps issued before 1900 should not be expected to have original gum unless specifically stated in the description. 20th Century issues may be expected to have original gum unless described otherwise. Terms used to describe the condition of gum are as follows:

Mint: As issued by the post office and never hinged.

Original Gum (O.G.): Stamp retains full original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be present or entirely removed. Early 19th century stamps should be expected to show crackling and toning in gum, which occurs naturally over time.

Part Original Gum: Up to half of the gum is missing, but the remaining portion is original.

Disturbed Original Gum: The gum is original to the stamp, but has been noticeably affected by hinge removal and/or humidity, mount glazing, etc.

Hinge Mark: Noticeable area where hinge has been removed and gum has been redistributed. Stamps described with hinge marks may not be returned because of gum disturbance.

Hinge Remnant (H.R.): All or part of hinge remaining affixed to gum.

Covers

Minor nicks, tears and slight reduction from opening are to be expected in 19th century covers. Folded letters normally have tears in the reverse and file folds, which will not be mentioned unless they affect the stamps or markings. Light cleaning of covers is an accepted form of conservation and is not grounds for return of a lot. The terms "Extremely Fine", etc., are meant to convey the overall appearance of cover, not the condition of an individual stamp.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, U.S. stamps are catalogued according to the Scott 1992 U.S. Specialized Catalogue or Volume I (previous editions have been used to catalogue certain Special Printings). Scott 1992 Standard Catalogue Volumes 1-4 have been used for British and foreign stamps. The 1992 Stanley Gibbons British Commonwealth Catalogue and other foreign catalogues are cited where appropriate.

Catalogue values are indicated by decimal figures in the right column (for example, "175.00"). Stamps in extremely fine quality and items for which catalogue values are not available have been given estimate ranges (for example "E. 750-1,000"). Lots offered subject to a reserve will never be reserved for more than the estimate (usually a fraction of the estimate).

Introduction

Our nation's first general issue postage stamps—the 5c and 10c 1847—will celebrate their 150th anniversary in a few years. Not since 1947, when the great 1947 Centenary celebration took place, has so much attention been focused on this issue. Therefore, it is timely and fortunate that Dr. Leonard Kapiloff, his family and the foundation which bears his name have chosen to sell the major portion of the 1847 Issue collection assembled and exhibited by Dr. Kapiloff over many years. Based on my 60 years of experience as a professional in philately and with all due respect to the many great 1847 collections dispersed over the years, I feel safe in saying that the Kapiloff collection is the finest and most comprehensive 1847 cover collection ever assembled. Considering all of the items he has amassed, their quality and rarity, and the remarkable story which together they tell, Dr. Kapiloff has accomplished himself as one of the great collectors in American philately.

"Doc" Kapiloff is a dentist by training, but he has not filled a tooth in many years. Instead, he has built a successful business in real estate development and publishing. I have known "Doc" Kapiloff since he and his brother were stamp collectors in the 1930's. I have watched this 1847 collection grow from infancy to its Grand Prix International award-winning status. Many of the items in this sale came from collections our firm has handled in the past—Dick, Matthies, Rohloff and Rust among the great names—and until very recently, "Doc" had been adding items to enhance the collection.

Whenever an important collection is dispersed, I feel some regret in seeing a lifetime accomplishment undone. However, any regrets are overcome by the satisfaction of seeing new collectors acquire items they have long admired and desired. As we approach 1997 and the 150th anniversary of the first U.S. postage stamps, I hope that many collectors will take this opportunity to acquire covers that display the 5c Franklin and 10c Washington in their best form. A comparable sale could take a lifetime to occur again.

A block of four without gum is contained in the permanent collection on display at the Swiss PTT Museum. The rarity of the 10c 1847 in unused block form is substantiated by the fact that none was contained in the great collections formed by Slater, West, Caspary, Moody, Lilly or Grunin.

The combined use of United States 1847 Issue and Canadian stamps was possible for only 38 days from April 23, 1851, when the first Canadian stamp was made available, until June 30, 1851, the last day that the U.S. 1847 Issue was valid. Only two such legitimate mixed frankings on mail from Canada are recorded: the cross-border letter offered in this sale, and the 24c rate cover to England with a strip of five 5c 1847 stamps (now in the Ishikawa collection). This cover was highlighted in the tenth sale of the Dale-Lichtenstein collection (H.R. The 1847 Issue was not shipped to post offices in California, and only two examples of its usage there are known to us. This transcontinental usage at the 40c rate is the only recorded 10c 1847 cover sent *from* California to New York. The addressee, the firm of Howland & Aspinwall, was a major international trading concern and financial backer of the Pacific Mail Steamship Company.

The block of fourteen and strip of ten discovered by Major Cleveland H. Bandholtz in 1927 are the largest recorded off-cover multiples of the 10c 1847 stamp. Both are contained in the Hirzel collection on permanent display at the Swiss PTT Museum. Next in size is the unused block of six with original gum, now part of the Ishikawa collection. The used block of six that once highlighted the Benjamin K. Miller collection at The New York Public Library was divided into smaller units after its theft from the Library. Three unused blocks of four are recorded, and another three used blocks are known. Of the 10c 1847 strips, units larger than a pair are very scarce. A few strips of four are known on covers, generally paying the 40c transcontinental rate. Strips of five are great rarities on or off cover. A strip of six is the largest size multiple known on cover. Only two such strips on cover are recorded: the six-times 10c rate folded letter from New Orleans to New York City via Mobile, which is offered in this sale, and the cover to France with the Philadelphia Railroad straightline.

The largest recorded 10c 1847 multiples are the used off-cover block of fourteen and strip of ten from the Bandholtz discovery, which are now part of the permanent Swiss PTT Collection. Of the multiples on cover, a strip of six is the largest size unit, which is recorded on at least two covers (see lot 148). One known cover from Panama to Mexico bears eight stamps and a portion of a ninth, the other part of which was torn away (ex DeVoss, now in the Ishikawa Collection). This double 40c rate cover from New York City to San Francisco bears the second greatest number of 10c 1847 stamps on a single cover, and is the largest *intact* multiple rate franking we record.

This 5c and 10c 1847 combination cover and its companion from the Noble correspondence have aroused considerable debate among students of international mails of the period. The 25c postage represents a 15c overpayment of the 10c rate from Baltimore to Boston, which was the actual port of departure, despite the New York routing instructions at upper left. This letter was carried by the Europa, a Cunard line steamship which sailed on Sept. 26 and arrived at Halifax on Sept. 27 (the date of the Halifax receiving backstamp). Faced with such a gross overpayment of the internal U.S. postage, Creighton C. Hart and his colleague, the late Susan McDonald, both expressed serious doubts about the authenticity of the two 25c franked Noble covers in articles appearing in The Chronicle (Feb. 1980, Feb. 1985 and Feb. 1986). However, other knowledgeable philatelists have taken an equally strong position that the cover is entirely genuine. Stanley M. Piller defended this particular cover's authenticity in a rebuttal to Hart's articles (The Chronicle, Feb. 1986). Mr. Piller has speculated that the sender, anticipating that the letter would fail to reach New York City in time for the Niagara's sailing, expeditiously added a 10c stamp; then, concerned that the letter might exceed the half-ounce limit for a single rate, he added another 10c stamp. Regardless of why such an overpayment occured, in favor of its authenticity are the physical ties between the stamps and the lettersheet; specifically, the blue "10" handstamp is impressed six times - so strongly that the indentations can be seen on the reverse side of the address panel — and the age toning and files folds pass thru the stamps and the lettersheet. Although overpayments of U.S.-Canada rates are unusual, overpayments in general occurred frequently during this period in which weight and distance were factors determining postage. In 1985, at least 75 years after the Noble correspondence with these two covers reached philatelic hands. The Philatelic Foundation was asked for an authoritative decision regarding this cover's authenticity. The certificate states, "It is a genuine usage overpaying the 10c rate with the left and right stamps tied by blue oval "10"s and vertical folds."

This pair of matched bisects comes from the correspondence written by former Maine U.S. Senator George Evans to his wife. The Evans correspondence was the subject of two articles written by the late Susan M. McDonald in *The Chronicle* (Nov. 1969, Feb. 1984). Mrs. McDonald hypothesized that Senator Evans was writing to his wife while she stayed at one of the medical facilities that existed in Brattleboro at the time. The Evans correspondence yielded three pairs of matched bisects on cover, one postmarked in red (ex Moody, Baker), the other two in blue (the ex Knapp pair and the pair in this sale). In addition, a fourth matched pair from the Stilphin correspondence was uncovered by the late Mrs. McDonald.

These two letters were reunited by philatelists after some 122 years from the date of mailing. While matched pairs of 10c diagonal bisects have been found among a single correspondence, the discovery of two letters mailed to entirely unrelated addressees was nothing short of a miracle. They are the only recorded matching vertical bisects of this stamp.

161° A Letter from the Postmaster of Montreal to Robert Morris of New York Concerning the 1847 Issue. Dated Nov. 19, 1847: "I have been requested by a number of merchants in the City to address you with a view to ascertain, whether or not you will consider as paid all letters from Canada which reach your office with the postage stamps of your Government whether they are for your own delivery or for transmission to Europe. If there is no objection to the adoption of this plan, much of the inconvenience anticipated to result from the change which has just taken place in our intercourse will be obviated. I shall be glad to receive an early reply to this letter and at the same time will be glad to know to whom I shall have to apply for the purchase of a supply of your postage stamps." Written just three days after the Canadian Post Office ceased collecting American postage on letters. (U.S. postage could no longer be prepaid in cash at Canadian post offices.) Any references in contemporary letters to the 1847 Issue are quite rare, and this extended example is significant. Aside from the glimpse it provides into an unusual and important area of cross-border mail, it also underscores the slight confusion on the part of a government that was still three years from issuing its own stamps. 




