The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By placing a bid on any lot, the bidder acknowledges acceptance of and will be bound to these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lot numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to one or more of the following conditions: (i) the lot is subject to a minimum final bid (''reserve''), below which it will not be sold, (ii) the Galleries have advanced monies to the seller and have a financial interest in the lot, (iii) the Galleries have guaranteed the seller a minimum sale price, and (iv) the Galleries may have ownership interest in the lot, either in part or whole. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without reserve.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails

- to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated with the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price, plus interest accrued on the purchase price at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate from the date of payment, and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots, and agrees to pay for all out-of-pocket costs incurred in shipping.

INTRODUCTION

This year's Rarities of the World sale, our 29th since 1964, is special in many ways.

It is the first Rarities sale since our partnership was formed. The Siegel tradition of conducting stamp auctions will be carried on to future generations of philatelists, and we hope to encourage new collectors by providing a reliable marketplace for buying and selling. For 62 years, we have maintained a reputation for integrity and expertise. For as long, we have stayed on the cutting edge of the philatelic market through our catalogue presentation, our ability to generate the best results for consignors, and our dedication to building a strong financial foundation, on which buyers and sellers can confidently rely.

Businesses maintain their success by constantly improving, and this sale reflects some of the changes we have carefully planned to make Siegel Auction Galleries even better. The new catalogue format allows us to present the rising tide of exhibition collections in a layout that closely approximates the exhibitor's page. Our descriptions, the industry standard for so long, contain even more background information to help buyers learn about the stamps and covers presented in our sales. Finally, our color reproduction has been fine-tuned to accurately display every item in precise clarity.

With respect to the material offered, this sale has been fifteen months in the making and contains an unusually large number of lots. We are very pleased to begin the day with The Kapiloff Collection of 1851-57 Issue Covers, a splendid offering presented in its own catalogue. The Rarities sale has an entire section devoted to the City Despatch Post, which celebrates its 150th anniversary this year. We have also marked the occasion by enclosing a special engraved souvenir card with this catalogue.

Among the many outstanding stamps and covers throughout the sale is a reunited pair of 10c 1857 blocks, forming the largest known unused multiple containing the rare Type IV stamps. An exceptional run of major errors includes most inverts and desirable modern color and perforation errors. To meet the demand for choice singles and blocks, we have included highlights from two large and exceptionally fine collections consigned to us. Also worthy of special attention is the recently discovered 1c 1923 Rotary Perf 11 (Scott 596), which is one of the rarest of all regular issue stamps.

Excluded from this sale are Confederate States items, which will be offered in our next sale of U.S. and Confederate stamps and covers. We will also hold an auction of autographs and historical material, including items of interest to postal history collectors. The F.D.R. letter in this sale is a "teaser" for the material to be offered.

Without further introduction, we are pleased to present our 29th Annual Rarities Sale. We look forward to your participation and wish you success in your bidding.

Terms and Abbreviations Used in Descriptions

Centering

The width of margins and the centering of the design within perforations are graded in strict accordance with the Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue standards. The following grades are used in this catalogue:

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering, used to describe stamps which are of superior grade for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with design a bit closer to one side. Please note that this grade is superior to the one on which Scott Catalogue retail prices are based.

Fine (F): Imperforate stamps may have smaller than usual margins and perforated stamps will be noticeably off-center. Issues before 1890 may have the design touched in places. If used, fairly lightly cancelled.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations may cut into.

Good (G): Average off-centered example with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for multiples and rarities.

Gum

Stamps issued before 1900 should not be expected to have original gum unless specifically stated in the description. 20th Century issues may be expected to have original gum unless described otherwise. Terms used to describe the condition of gum are as follows:

Mint: As issued by the post office and never hinged.

Original Gum (O.G.): Stamp retains full original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be present or entirely removed. Early 19th century stamps should be expected to show crackling and toning in gum, which occurs naturally over time.

Part Original Gum: Up to half of the gum is missing, but the remaining portion is original.

Disturbed Original Gum: The gum is original to the stamp, but has been noticeably affected by hinge removal and/or humidity, mount glazing, etc.

Hinge Mark: Noticeable area where hinge has been removed and gum has been redistributed. Stamps described with hinge marks may not be returned because of gum disturbance.

Hinge Remnant (H.R.): All or part of hinge remaining affixed to gum.

Covers

Minor nicks, tears and slight reduction from opening are to be expected in 19th century covers. Folded letters normally have tears in the reverse and file folds, which will not be mentioned unless they affect the stamps or markings. Light cleaning of covers is an accepted form of conservation and is not grounds for return of a lot. The terms "Extremely Fine", etc., are meant to convey the overall appearance of cover, not the condition of an individual stamp.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, U.S. stamps are catalogued according to the Scott 1992 U.S. Specialized Catalogue or Volume 1 (previous editions have been used to catalogue certain Special Printings). Scott 1992 Standard Catalogue Volumes 1-4 have been used for British and foreign stamps. The 1992 Stanley Gibbons British Commonwealth Catalogue and other foreign catalogues are cited where appropriate.

Catalogue values are indicated by decimal figures in the right column (for example, "175.00"). Stamps in extremely fine quality and items for which catalogue values are not available have been given estimate ranges (for example "E. 750-1,000"). Lots offered subject to a reserve will never be reserved for more than the estimate (usually a fraction of the estimate).

200° A Collection of Indian Territory Postal History. Offered intact, this comprehensive and attractively mounted collection comprises over 100 covers arranged by nation and reservation, from the stampless period to 1907, all with well-researched write-up. Early items include ms. Fort Gibson (1834), Fort Gibson Ark. cds with "Paid 3" handstamps, ms. Fort Towson (1842), Doaksville Ark. (1849), ms. Kedron on 3c entire (U2), Fort Washita Ark. cds on 3c 1851. In addition, there is an excellent showing of later short-lived post offices, including "Beaver, N.S. of I.T." straightline, Canadaville, Pawhuska, Ponca, Pond Creek, Sacred Heart Mission, Wynne Wood (beautiful sawtooth oval), and numerous others. The condition is Very Fine with many choice, clear strikes of postmarks, but a few faults in covers or stamps must be expected. A marvelous foundation for expansion into an important, exhibit-quality collection of this fascinating and historical subject. Acquired by the owner years ago and offered at auction for the first time E. 5,000-7,500

201° **Franklin D. Roosevelt,** typed letter with autograph signature as President, on White House stationery, dated December 19, 1933. Roosevelt accepts Alfred F. Lichtenstein's invitation to become a patron of the International Philatelic Exhibition in 1936, adding a few encouraging words about stamp collecting:

I am, of course, happy to know that things are going well for stamps and stamp-collecting in every part of the world. From all that I hear, the interest seems to be increasing.

This letter is part of a small collection of Roosevelt documents related to his stamp collecting activities. The major portion of this group, including letters, signed bid sheets submitted to Max Ohlman, and ephemera, will be offered in our November auction of autographs and historical documents.

CITY DESPATCH POST 1841-1850 Including A Portion of The Kapiloff Collection

In this year, the 150th anniversary of the founding of the City Despatch Post, we are pleased to present an important group of these issues, including a major portion of the Dr. Leonard Kapiloff collection of stamps and covers carried by this local post and carrier service. The significance of the City Despatch Post in the postal history of this country cannot be overstated.

Foremost in the minds of philatelists is the City Despatch Post's role in issuing the first postage stamp in the Western hemisphere, the 3c Black on grayish paper. Issued in February 1842, this stamp depicting George Washington is the world's second postal adhesive after Great Britain's Penny Black and Two-Pence Blue. Its availability to New York City residents meant that letters could be deposited in overnight mail boxes at locations around the city. This convenience, combined with the efficiency and competitiveness of the City Despatch Post, led to a surge in its business and resulted in the U.S. government's eagerness to incorporate it as part of New York City's carrier system.

After acquiring the City Despatch Post from Alexander M. Greig, the U.S. government postal authorities continued to accept the local post stamps. Therefore, we have the first instance of *postage stamps used under U.S. authority*. Shortly after the government takeover, new stamps inscribed "United States City Despatch Post" were issued. These are *the first stamps issued by the United States Post Office*.

Much has been written about the City Despatch Post, the most authoritative reference being Elliott Perry's 100 Years Ago, written at the time of the City Despatch Post's centenary. In addition, excellent contributions have been made by Donald S. Patton (The Private Local Posts of The United States) and Dr. Julian Blanchard, who published his own research on the question of who printed the City Despatch Post stamps. More recently, articles on the City Despatch Post have been published in The Penny Post, the journal of the Carriers and Locals Society.

The following material comprises one of the most outstanding auction offerings of these issues since the Caspary sale in 1957. It is especially rich in significant items from the carrier period and 1847-51 period under Mead and Coles ownership. The *first day* of the United States City Despatch Post is represented by two covers—one stampless and the other being the first day of the first postage stamp used by the U.S. post office. Also offered are no less than five additional examples of Greig's stamp used as a carrier (Scott 6LB1), one of the great rarities of U.S. philately.

Among the later items are several covers with the "CC" stamps issued under Coles ownership, which we know to be very rare, and which we believe to be very much undervalued in Scott.

At a time when the independent mails of the United States have become the focus of students and collectors, and when the first stamp of the United States celebrates its 150th anniversary, we feel confident that this section of our 1992 Rarities of the World sale will prove to be very popular.

First Day of United States City Despatch Post August 16, 1842

Within weeks of its inception, the City Despatch Post was handling considerably more letters than the government carriers. Consequently, the Postmaster General requested New York Postmaster John L. Graham to negotiate for the purchase of Greig's post. On July 21, 1842, Graham wrote the Postmaster General that he had successfully arranged to acquire all of the post's "fixtures and paraphernalia" and re-establish the operation as the "United States City Despatch Post" under U.S. government authority. According to official reports, the U.S. City Despatch Post was inaugurated on Tuesday, August 16, 1842.

Included in the announcement of the change in ownership was a statement that stamps sold by the City Despatch Post would be accepted as prepayment. New postmarking devices were implemented: the "Free" cancel was replaced with a similar "U.S." cancel, and the circular datestamp was replaced with one that read "U.S. City Despatch Post." The use of these cancels on the 3c City Despatch Post stamp is proof that it was handled by the government carrier operation. New "United States City Despatch Post" stamps were issued in September 1842—these being the first stamps issued by the United States government.

The Unique First Day Cover of The First United States Stamp





POST OFFICE CITY DESPATCH 1846-1847 ISSUES

The decline in patronage of the U.S. City Despatch Post was a result of the U.S. drop letter rate increase, effective July 1, 1845, as well as competition from other local posts throughout the city. The drop letter rate was raised from 1c to 2c, thereby adding 1c to the charges made for most types of mail carried by the post. After a period of declining business, the U.S. City Despatch Post carrier service was terminated in November 1846. The post was immediately taken over by one of the letter carriers, Abraham Mead, who named it the Post Office City Despatch. The circular datestamp was changed to read "P.O.", and the "Free" cancel was reinstituted. On or about December 5, 1846, the firm of Rawdon, Wright & Hatch delivered the 2c Black on Green Glazed stamps, printed from Greig's plates, which were altered from "Three Cents" to "Two Cents" denominations. In late 1847 Mead sold out to Charles Coles, who continued the local post through 1850 and possibly a bit longer. The altered plate was given to Coles, who had his initials engraved within the portrait oval of each stamp. These were printed on various papers, all of which are quite scarce.

Alexandria, a major port city, was ceded to the District of Columbia in 1791. On July 6, 1846, the United States Congress voted to cede Alexandria back to Virginia. In September 1846 the issue was put up for a vote by the white male citizens of Alexandria County (insane persons and paupers excluded), and they voted 763 to 222 in favor of recession. However, it was not until March 1847 that the Virginia General Assembly enacted the recession. A noteworthy aspect of this Alexandria cover is the letter, which refers to the September vote on the question of Alexandria's status. It reads, "What do the folks in Frederick County say about retrocession? There is a good deal of talk about it here. The commissioners have appointed the first and second days of next month to take the vote . . . a stranger to whom she had been introduced told her he hoped she would persuade the Alexandrians to go back to Virginia. I think the country people will mostly vote against it and the town people mostly for it." The Alexandria post office was most definitely part of the District of Columbia when the provisional stamps were used before March 1847. In the case of this August 1846 cover, we have used the proper designation, despite the Scott Catalogue listing.

According to Philip T. Wall (*Chronicle*, Feb. 1983), there are six recorded examples of the Alexandria 5c on buff paper. Of each type there are two covers and one off-cover stamp. This cover was discovered in 1926 by Edward S. Leadbeater of Alexandria while he was visiting relatives in Parkins' Mills. The letters were addressed to his father of the same name. The cover was sold to Perry Fuller, a Baltimore dealer, for approximately \$7,000. It was then sold to Henry G. Lapham and became part of the great Lapham collection of postmasters' provisionals. The cover was later acquired by Consul Klep Van Velthoven of Belgium and realized \$5,250 when the Klep collection was sold at auction in 1956. The Leadbeater cover next appeared at auction when these Galleries sold the "Texas" collection of U.S. postmasters' provisionals in 1964, in which sale it realized \$9,000. It was sold again through these Galleries in 1986 at the auction sale of the "Isleham" collection, where it realized \$77,000 against a catalogue value of \$30,000.

According to Calvet M. Hahn, whose research on the 1847 Issue colors was published in *The Collectors Club Philatelist* (Volume 65, numbers 3-5), the true Red Orange and Orange colors of the 5c 1847 stamp come from the Fifth Printing in December 1850. Hahn distinguishes between the intense Orange shade of the unused Slater copy, which is considered to be the strongest hue in this color family, and the slightly less intense Red Orange. In his 1986 article, Hahn describes the stamp offered here as an unused example of the Orange shade and traces its ownership from Gibson to Pichel (through Ward), then to Lilly, whose collection was sold through these Galleries in 1967. It next appeared in our 1975 Rarities sale, where it realized \$5,500.

The P.S.E. Certificate accompanying this stamp, bearing Mr. Hahn's name, states that the stamp is "genuine, unused, no gum "Red Orange" shade with black speck on forehead and faint horizontal crease." This opinion concurs with Ashbrook's opinion, written in pencil on the back of this stamp: "5c 1847, Red Orange, An Uncancelled Copy [signed]". However, in spite of the pedigree and expert opinions supporting the status of this stamp, The Philatelic Foundation has issued a certificate describing the color as chemically altered. We obviously consider this opinion to be misinformed and offer the stamp as a 5c Red Orange (1c).



Keokuk, "The Watchful Fox," was born in the area now known as Illinois about 1780 and was poisoned to death in Kansas in 1848. A native American of extraordinary physical and intellectual powers, Keokuk rose to become chief of the united Sacs and Foxes. A brave and accomplished warrior, Keokuk also possessed great diplomatic skills and oratorical ability, which he used at times to convince his peers to avoid hostile engagements with whites. However, a bitter feud with Black Hawk, a volatile rival, existed for years and resulted in Keokuk's death when a member of Black Hawk's band poisoned him in 1848. The significance of this illustrated corner card is not known, but the association between native Americans and tobacco was common in this period, and this image could well have been a form of advertising.





Separated for more than a half-century, the two 10c 1857 blocks that form this unit of ten key positions from Plate One have been reunited. Illustrated in their original state, the blocks of four and six comprise positions 63-67 and 73-77 from the left pane of Plate One.

The top row contains Types III, IV (Double Recut), IV (Recut at Top), III and III. The bottom row contains Types II, IV (Recut at Top), II, IV (Recut at Bottom) and II. As a block of ten, this represents the largest known unused Plate One multiple containing Type IV.

It was divided as early as 1936, when Ashbrook published his book on the 1855-57 10c stamp and referred to this block of six (65-67/75-77L1) from the S. W. Richey collection. The block of four (63-64/73-74L1) was owned by Caspary and appeared in the 1956 sale of his collection. Based on these blocks and other unused multiples of this stamp, it is possible that they all emanated from a very large part of a sheet discovered prior to 1936, which was broken to meet the needs of different collectors. Certainly this block was broken with a professional philatelist's eye for satisfying more than one collector; two could each own blocks containing two Type IV stamps.

The 32c prepayment on this cover includes 20c for the double 10c transpacific rate from Japan to the United States, plus 12c for the double 6c transatlantic rate to England. This cover left Yokohama on the *America*, arriving in San Francisco on April 15, 1871, one day before the San Francisco exchange office applied the magenta datestamp and numeral "4". The meaning of this "4" marking is still a mystery. It was definitely applied in San Francisco, as were the magenta "2" handstamps found on certain other single rate covers sent from Japan to Europe via San Francisco. The application of a "2" on single rate covers, and this "4" on a double rate cover, strongly indicates that this is a rate marking (2c, 4c, etc.). However, there is no record of a 2c rate of any kind at this time, so the markings remain enigmatic.







The enigmatic 1882 5c Garfield Special Printing has been the subject of recent research by William E. Mooz, whose findings were published in *The Chronicle* (Feb. 1992). Mooz has presented a well-reasoned theory that a limited supply of the 5c Garfield Special Printing was available from the Third Assistant Postmaster General's office beginning in February 1882 until April 10 when the regularly issued stamp was finally released after delay at the American Bank Note Company. Therefore, we have the extraordinary circumstance in which stamp dealers and collectors were able and eager to obtain a new issue *before* it actually appeared at post offices as a regularly produced stamp.

Based on official records, 2,463 copies of the 5c Garfield Special Printing were ordered and sold, which compares closely with the relatively common 6c 1869 Re-Issue. Mooz attributes the 5c Special Printing's actual rarity to evidence showing that between February and April only 400 stamps (four sheets) were delivered to the Third Asst. P.M.G.'s office, with the bulk of the shipment arriving on April 10, from which back orders were filled. These first four sheets were printed at different times between February and April, probably in slightly different shades. Of these, only the Gray Brown shade—possibly just one sheet—has been consistently recognized as the Special Printing. Mooz theorizes that the orders filled on April 10 and thereafter comprised regular 5c Garfield stamps, gummed and indistinguishable from stamps sold at post offices. As for the other three sheets, Mooz suggests the potential of two or more different Special Printing shades, including the Reddish Brown cited by John Luff.

To date, Mr. Mooz has presented the only well-documented and logical explanation for the 5c Garfield Special Printing and its great rarity. We applaud his research and concur with his theory. In this new light, we are pleased to present one of the finest known examples of the 5c Garfield Special Printing in the Gray Brown shade.







The "Gatun Locks" Error

The 2c Panama-Pacific stamp design was based on a model chosen by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's director. He first rejected a photograph sent from the Panama Canal. Instead, a scaled model on display at the War Department was photographed and used as the basis for the engraving. What the Bureau did not realize until after the stamps had been printed was that the image was incorrectly identified as the Gatun Locks. In fact, the scene was of the Pedro Miguel Locks. Realizing its mistake prior to releasing the finished stamps, the Bureau destroyed all copies of the Gatun Locks error and re-engraved the die to read "Panama Canal." The stamps were printed from new plates, and the only tangible evidence of the Bureau's error to reach the public was the die proofs reading "Gatun Locks." Only two proofs are generally thought to exist. Brazer states that only one small die proof impression is in public hands. The Scott Catalogue identifies this small die proof as being printed on wove paper; however, if the example offered here is the basis of the Scott listing, then it is unquestionably on India paper. There is also the possibility that two small die proofs exist on different papers.
