The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By placing a bid on any lot, the bidder acknowledges acceptance of and will be bound to these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.

# Terms and Abbreviations Used in Descriptions

### Centering

The width of margins and the centering of the design within perforations are graded in strict accordance with the Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue standards. The following grades are used in this catalogue:

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering, used to describe stamps which are of superior grade for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with design a bit closer to one side. Please note that this grade is superior to the one on which Scott Catalogue retail prices are based.

Fine (F): Imperforate stamps may have smaller than usual margins and perforated stamps will be noticeably off-center. Issues before 1890 may have the design touched in places. If used, fairly lightly cancelled.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations may cut into.

Good (G): Average off-centered example with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for multiples and rarities.

#### Gum

Stamps issued before 1900 should not be expected to have original gum unless specifically stated in the description. 20th Century issues may be expected to have original gum unless described otherwise. Terms used to describe the condition of gum are as follows:

Mint: As issued by the post office and never hinged.

**Original Gum (O.G.):** Stamp retains full original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be present or entirely removed. Early 19th century stamps should be expected to show crackling and toning in gum, which occurs naturally over time.

Part Original Gum: Up to half of the gum is missing, but the remaining portion is original.

**Disturbed Original Gum:** The gum is original to the stamp, but has been noticeably affected by hinge removal and/or humidity, mount glazing, etc.

**Hinge Mark:** Noticeable area where hinge has been removed and gum has been redistributed. Stamps described with hinge marks may not be returned because of gum disturbance.

Hinge Remnant (H.R.): All or part of hinge remaining affixed to gum.

#### Covers

Minor nicks, tears and slight reduction from opening are to be expected in 19th century covers. Folded letters normally have tears in the reverse and file folds, which will not be mentioned unless they affect the stamps or markings. Light cleaning of covers is an accepted form of conservation and is not grounds for return of a lot. The terms "Extremely Fine", etc., are meant to convey the overall appearance of cover, not the condition of an individual stamp.

#### Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, U.S. stamps are catalogued according to the Scott 1994 U.S. Specialized Catalogue or Volume 1 (previous editions have been used to catalogue certain Special Printings). Scott 1995 Volumes 1-5 have been used for British and foreign stamps. The 1994 Stanley Gibbons British Commonwealth Catalogue and other foreign catalogues are cited where appropriate.

Catalogue values are indicated by decimal figures in the right column (for example, "175.00"). Stamps in extremely fine quality and items for which catalogue values are not available have been given estimate ranges (for example "E. 750-1,000"). Lots offered subject to a reserve will never be reserved for more than the estimate (usually a fraction of the estimate).

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# INTRODUCTION

The year 1994 comes to a close with our sale of United States and Confederate States postal history. In the Siegel tradition, more than 1,400 lots have been gathered from 58 different owners and estates. Numbers alone cannot express the range and depth of this offering, which we believe is one of our best postal history auctions in the 64-year history of our firm.

Two properties come to the market for the first time. From the historical archive of a Southern institution we offer the covers and outer address sheets deemed to have no research value. More than 300 lots in this sale emanate from this source. Numerous unrecorded markings from the Colonial period through the mid-19th century will delight collectors and surprise scholars who keep track of such items.

The second group brought to light comes from the "Cleveland Album," named for the city in which this collection was formed during the 1890's. Out of sight for a century is an array of remarkable classic covers, including the 1c 1851 block on cover featured on the front of this catalogue, the Brents & Nelson's entire to Canada (lot 2051), the New York carrier stamp from Schenectady to a New York City address (lot 1698), and never-before-seen Goodhue covers to Zanzibar.

In addition to these discoveries, our 764th sale includes several major collections entrusted to our firm by collectors and estate executors. The Skove collection of Cleveland, which captured a Gold medal as recently as STaMpsHOW '94 in Pittsburgh, contains items acquired by the late Paul Skove and his son, Donald, more than twenty years ago. The Herbert P. McNeal collection is one of the largest Florida holdings to reach the market since the 1985 Meroni sale held by our friend and esteemed colleague, David G. Phillips. A specialized Kentucky collection formed by a collector who wishes to remain anonymous contains some exceptional stampless and Civil War period covers. The exhibit collection of Columbian Exposition issues is offered by order of the Estate of Ottis C. Bobbitt. More than 200 Western express covers from The Concord Collection form an outstanding section of this sale. In addition, there are specialized collections of New York foreign mails, air posts, Guam and Confederate States.

We would like to remind bidders that our buyer's premium remains at 10%, while certain other firms have increased their premium to 15%. If recent elections are any indication, incumbents who raise rates are not especially popular. You, too, can vote by doing business—buying or selling—with firms who maintain profitability without increasing your cost of collecting.

# COLONIAL AND CONFEDERATION PERIOD

Battalion", intriguing exchange between these two officers: "I have been cautiously busy in procuring discoveries, but am unsucessful. I[t] appears they are determined not only to effect secrecy, but to detain if possible what they have taken. One or two have said, that they are sorry, they have returned even the trifles which were sent back. . . .Mr. Mcdonald told me that a very Superior officer of the Regiment had taken several things & desired him to do the same. To Capt. Bloomfd he declared himself more particularly. I refer you, my dear colonel to Capt. Bloomfd who is possessed of more circumstantial Evidence than I am, having mingled in conversation with these Gentlemen more freely than I have. I wish you, Sir, all possible comfort & quietude in your Situation. Let nothing discourage you; the wise & virtuous will approve your conduct" etc. Capt. Bloomfield was Joseph Bloomfield, later Governor of New Jersey and a general in the War of 1812. Fine, with engraving of Col. Barber in uniform; New Jersey military documents from the Revolution are very scarce.

The Beehive marking was discovered by the late dealer Harry Keffer in an original correspondence purchased in the 1930s from Chester Whitlock. Originally four in number (one was later damaged in a fire), each is addressed to a Mr. Day in New Haven, with a 12½ rate and dated in 1838. A fifth cover was found by Keffer at a later date; this was addressed to a Mr. Tiffany and used on June 25th, 1838. The Hines cover, recently discovered in the Southern institution holdings offered in this sale, is the first Beehive cover to surface in 50 years, and the only one to come from a completely non-philatelic source. A popular explanation for the origin of the Beehive is that it was used in connection with or inspired by the New Haven Savings Bank founded in 1838 (and known as the Beehive Bank), and whose

cashier William Lyon was on the New Haven Centennial Committee for that year. While the known contents of three of the covers do nothing to strengthen the bank connection, their colorful nature (a challenge to a duel, an odd poem signed by "The New Haven Oracle" and questions raised by the friend of a "spurned" woman) do suggest that the covers may have been part of a creative writing assignment, and that the Beehive marking was a teacher-inspired final touch—a forerunner of the Business School stamps and cancellations used on classroom mail containing fictional invoices and business letters.

Whether the Beehive was a Cinderella town-marking used solely within the confines of an imaginative teacher's classroom, or a short-lived postal or independent mail marking jointly inspired by New Haven's centennial and the founding of its first savings bank, may never be satisfactorily explained. What we do know is that the New Haven Beehive is one of the most beautiful and rare of markings found in the American stampless period, and this is the sixth known example. Only six covers with Bishop's Blue stamp are recorded in the CPM book (see p. 110), of which this and the following lot are Valentine covers with local Cleveland street addresses. Although the Blue stamp has been described as a 1c value, the absence of an expressed denomination suggests that it was designed to serve two purposes, each requiring a different rate: 1c for letters carried to the post office, or 2c for so-called "Delivery Letters" mailed within the city. The other four covers bearing the Blue stamp were carried to the mails and sent to other post offices, thus rated 1c by Bishop's City Post. The two Valentines offered in this sale are likely to have been carried by Bishop to the recipients at the street addresses indicated and thus have been rated 2c each. They are, in effect, the only recorded examples of the Blue stamp used as a 2c value.

This rare local post stamp was issued in 1853 by the short-lived Kellogg's Penny Post & City Despatch. Very few examples are known, including two or three on piece and one other cover bearing a stamp as part of a strip of three, from which the adjoining pair was torn away. This cover, which was posted at the New England Hotel and carried to the mails by Kellogg, is considered to be the finest example known.

Reverend Schermmerhorn was an active correspondent in New York City during the 1849 period, and, based on other known covers, he used local posts to carry his letters to the post office. In this instance, it is a reasonable hypothesis that the sender (a Reverend Yates, as docketed) used the carrier stamp, intending to prepay the fee for delivery from the New York post office to the Day Street address. Whether Reverend Yates removed the stamp from a cover sent to him, or Reverend Schermmerhorn sent the stamp with instructions, cannot be determined.

The Humboldt Express was the last of six successive Western express services operated by Samuel W. Langton, who has been described by historians as the most energetic and persevering of the numerous expressmen of the period. Langton launched the Humboldt Express in February 1860 and oversaw its operation until his accidental death in 1864. Service was provided between the Humboldt mines in Nevada to Carson City, the state capital. For transportation across this difficult route, 25c was charged in addition to the \$2.00 per letter fee. To facilitate prepayment of this surcharge, Langton issued the 1860 25c Brown adhesive stamp. The stamp, with its exceptionally detailed depiction of a stagecoach drawn by a four-horse team, is widely regarded as the finest example of a pictorial stamp issued by the numerous private posts in the United States between 1842 and the 1870's. The style, lettering, color and lithographic technique used to print Langton's stamp are identical to those of the Wells, Fargo & Co. pony express stamps of the same period.

A, VERY FINE EXAMPLE OF THE "SOUTHERN LETTER UNPAID" MARKING, WHICH IS RARELY FOUND ON COVERS ORIGINATING IN CONFEDERATE NEW ORLEANS

Reviewing our records of Southern Letter Unpaid covers, there is a pattern suggesting that the earliest mail processed at the Louisville post office was not marked with the double-circle datestamp (earliest known date is June 26th) and that the use of the blue grid to cancel U.S. stamps was soon abandoned in favor of using the "Southn. Letter Unpaid" marking as a cancel. When Louisville Postmaster J. J. Speed received a directive from the U.S. Post Office Department on June 24th, instructing him to forward mail of Confederate origin to destinations in Federal territory, there were 4,000 to 5,000 pieces of mail being held at Louisville (Schenfield book, p. 7). Speed was instructed to remove U.S. stamps affixed to Confederate letters; however, the impracticality of physically removing stamps resulted in the creation of the "Southn. Letter Unpaid" handstamp. If clerks began the task of processing mail on June 25th by 1) cancelling U.S. postage with the blue grid, 2) applying the blue "Southn. Letter Unpaid" and 3) applying the "Due" marking, the use of the blue grid could have been abandoned when the double-circle datestamp was introduced to the process on the following day, June 26th. An additional step in marking covers—the application of the datestamp would slow down the process. Our hypothesis is that the clerks discarded the blue grid on June 26th and began using the "Southn. Letter Unpaid" marking to cancel any U.S. stamps present. If correct, the cover offered here is quite possibly a June 25th "first day use" of the "Southn. Letter Unpaid" marking.

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
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
