# Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By placing a bid on any lot, the bidder acknowledges acceptance of and will be bound to these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lot numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to one or more of the following conditions: (i) the lot is subject to a minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which it will not be sold, (ii) the Galleries have advanced monies to the seller and have a financial interest in the lot, (iii) the Galleries have guaranteed the seller a minimum sale price, and (iv) the Galleries may have ownership interest in the lot, either in part or whole. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without reserve.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illusrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to

demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 11/2% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price, plus interest accrued on the purchase price at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate from the date of payment, and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.

# Terms and Abbreviations Used in Descriptions

#### Centering

The width of margins and the centering of the design within perforations are graded in strict accordance with the Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue standards. The following grades are used:

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering, used to describe stamps which are of superior grade for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with design a bit closer to one side. Please note that this grade is superior to the one on which Scott Catalogue retail prices are based.

Fine (F): Imperforate stamps may have smaller than usual margins and perforated stamps will be noticeably off-center. Issues before 1890 may have the design touched in places. If used, fairly lightly cancelled.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations may cut into.

Good (G): Average off-centered example with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for multiples and rarities.

#### Gum

Stamps issued before 1900 should not be expected to have original gum unless specifically stated in the description. 20th Century issues may be expected to have original gum unless described otherwise. Terms used to describe the condition of gum are as follows:

Mint: As issued by the post office and never hinged.

**Original Gum (O.G.):** Stamp retains full original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be present or entirely removed. Early 19th century stamps should be expected to show crackling and toning in gum, which occurs naturally over time.

Part Original Gum: Up to half of the gum is missing, but the remaining portion is original.

**Disturbed Original Gum:** The gum is original to the stamp, but has been noticeably affected by hinge removal and/or humidity, mount glazing, etc.

**Hinge Mark:** Noticeable area where hinge has been removed and gum has been redistributed. Stamps described with hinge marks may not be returned because of gum disturbance.

Hinge Remnant (H.R.): All or part of hinge remaining affixed to gum.

#### Covers

Minor nicks, tears and slight reduction from opening are to be expected in 19th century covers. Folded letters normally have tears in the reverse and file folds, which will not be mentioned unless they affect the stamps or markings. Light cleaning of covers is an accepted form of conservation and is not grounds for return of a lot. The terms "Extremely Fine", etc., are meant to convey the overall appearance of cover, not the condition of an individual stamp.

#### Catalogue Values and Estimates


Unless otherwise noted, U.S. stamps are catalogued according to the *Scott 1995 U.S. Specialized Catalogue* or Volume 1 (previous editions have been used to catalogue certain Special Printings). *Scott 1995* Volumes 1-5 have been used for British and foreign stamps. The *1995 Stanley Gibbons British Commonwealth Catalogue* and other foreign catalogues are cited where appropriate.

Catalogue values are indicated by decimal figures in the right column (for example, "175.00"). Stamps in extremely fine quality and items for which catalogue values are not available have been given estimate ranges (for example "E. 750-1,000"). Lots offered subject to a reserve will never be reserved for more than the estimate (usually a fraction of the estimate).

## COLONIAL PERIOD AND 18TH CENTURY

- 4°⊠ NEW/YORK. Two-line handstamp in black, full clear strike on back of folded letter datelined "Philadelphia 9br 30th 1710" (September 30, 1710) and addressed to John Brown in Liverpool, England, sender's endorsement "pr. pqt." (Per Packet), ms. "post pd to NYK" (Post Paid to New York) postmark at bottom of address panel, matching "IN" rate crossed out, re-rated "In all 1N3", backstamped after arrival with brownish-black "IA/8" London Bishop's mark, receipt docketing on flap confirms 1710 date, the letter contains interesting references to sailing days of Bristol-New York packet service, trade with Lisbon, and mentions the enclosed bill of exchange dated "Maryland September the 19th 1709" which is still present

#### THE EARLIEST RECORDED HANDSTAMPED TOWNMARK FROM AMERICA IN PRIVATE HANDS

This letter from the John Brown correspondence is dated two years prior to the June 10, 1712, letter bearing the identical "NEW/YORK" handstamped marking that surfaced from the same correspondence last year. We have been reliably informed that the entire Brown correspondence has been analyzed and no earlier example has been found.

This letter was carried on board the *Royal Anne*, one of William Warren's Bristol-New York packet vessels, captained by John Shorter. The *Royal Anne* left New York in December 1710 and arrived at Bristol in January 1711 on its first eastbound voyage for the newly inaugurated Bristol-New York packet service. It is possible that the "NEW/YORK" handstamp was applied by John Hamilton, the New York agent for William Warren.

- 5° Philadelphia, 1710-1714. Three folded letters with 1710, 1711 and 1714 datelines, addressed to Dumfries and Liverpool and carried outside the mails to addressee, last with "QDC" endorsement, couple with faint waterstains, otherwise Fine group of early Colonial transatlantic usages ................................ E. 300-400
- 6°⊠ **Lisbon, 1711.** Folded letter datelined "Lisbon O.St. May the 27th: 1711" and addressed to John Brown in Liverpool, sender's endorsement "pr. pqt.", ms. rate crossed out, re-rated "Inall 1N10", brownish "IV/21" London Bishop's mark on back, letter notes writer having just arrived in Lisbon by the Dragon Brigantine, mentions being chased by a privateer, two Bills of Exchange enclosed—one drawn at Philadelphia, the other at Maryland—slight waterstaining, otherwise Fine ..............(Photo) E. 400-500

- 10°⊠ Rappahannock, Virginia, 1713. Folded letter clearly datelined "Rappahannock River Virginia May 16th 1713" from Thomas McClelland to John Brown in Liverpool, carried outside of the mails with sender's endorsement "Pr. Mr. Ja. Gillison", small tear into dateline, still Very Fine, an extremely early example of mail emanating from the Rappahannock settlement in Virginia, the 1710/11 Bristol packet letter from Rappahannock realized \$5,250 in our December 1994 sale. (Photo) E. 1,000-1,500
- Philadelphia, 1713. Folded letter datelined "Philada. June 4th, 1713" and addressed to John Brown in Liverpool, ms. "paid to NYork 10d" pmk. applied at Philadelphia, ms. "4" rate crossed out, re-rated "Inall 1N9", "IY/20" (July 20) London Bishop's mark on back, docketing confirms 1713 year date; Warren's Bristol-New York packet service had ceased to operate in 1712 (ter Braake, p.F25); therefore, this letter was probably carried by the first available vessel from New York to England; some waterstaining and erosion at sides, still Fine, very rare "paid to NYork" postal marking. (Photo) E. 1,000-1,500
- 13°⊠ New York, 1776. Folded letter datelined "New York 1 January 1776" and addressed to Edinburgh, Scotland, two strikes of "PORTSMOUTH/SHIP LRE" two-line hs (one partly readable), ms. 4" rate deleted and re-rated "Inall 10", "9/FE" London Bishop's mark on back, historically interesting 2pp letter with references to Independence: "Times are shocking. . .these that have management of affairs in this continent have no desire to have any further connection with Brittain, they aim at absolute Independence . . .", further commentary on arms, American attitudes, etc., written during the War for Independence and prior to the September 1776 British occupation of New York, Fine and a most desirable usage ...................................(Photo) E. 500-600



- 15°⊠ **Mount Pleasant, Georgia, 1779.** Folded letteer datelined "Mount Pleasant Georgia Jan. 18th 79" and addressed to Inverary, Scotland, ms. "1N" crossed out, re-rated with handstamped "In all" and ms. "1N6" rate, "26/FE" London Bishop's mark on back, interesting 1p content mentions 71st Regiment (Fraser's Highlanders), also refers to the "fall" of Charles Cameron of the Light Company, Very Fine ......(**Photo**) E. 500-750



M. Greig, nominated by you, as a letter carrier. Other carriers are to be appointed from time to time, as may be required, and you are requested to nominate for that purpose. And you are also authorized to obtain the necessary fixtures, pouches, boxes, labels, stamps, etc., at not exceeding \$1,200 for the whole, and to appoint a clerk to superintend said establishment at not exceeding \$1,000 per annum. You will be pleased to report the date of the commencement of this arrangement.
