Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By placing a bid on any lot, the bidder acknowledges acceptance of and will be bound to these Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lot numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to one or more of the following conditions: (i) the lot is subject to a minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which it will not be sold, (ii) the Galleries have advanced monies to the seller and have a financial interest in the lot, (iii) the Galleries have guaranteed the seller a minimum sale price, and (iv) the Galleries may have ownership interest in the lot, either in part or whole. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without reserve.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illusrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to

demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 11/2% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale. and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price, plus interest accrued on the purchase price at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate from the date of payment, and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.

Terms and Abbreviations Used in Descriptions

Centering

The width of margins and the centering of the design within perforations are graded in strict accordance with the Scott Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue standards. The following grades are used:

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering, used to describe stamps which are of superior grade for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Imperforate stamps may have smaller than usual margins and perforated stamps will be noticeably off-center. Issues before 1890 may have the design touched in places. If used, fairly lightly cancelled.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations may cut into.

Good (G): Average off-centered example with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for multiples and rarities.

Gum

Stamps issued before 1900 should not be expected to have original gum unless specifically stated in the description. 20th Century issues may be expected to have original gum unless described otherwise. Terms used to describe the condition of gum are as follows:

Mint: As issued by the post office and never hinged.

Original Gum (O.G.): Stamp retains full original gum showing slight disturbance caused by previous hinge, which may be present or entirely removed. Early 19th century stamps should be expected to show crackling and toning in gum, which occurs naturally over time.

Part Original Gum: Up to half of the gum is missing, but the remaining portion is original.

Disturbed Original Gum: The gum is original to the stamp, but has been noticeably affected by hinge removal and/or humidity, mount glazing, etc.

Hinge Mark: Noticeable area where hinge has been removed and gum has been redistributed. Stamps described with hinge marks may not be returned because of gum disturbance.

Hinge Remnant (H.R.): All or part of hinge remaining affixed to gum.

Covers

Minor nicks, tears and slight reduction from opening are to be expected in 19th century covers. Folded letters normally have tears in the reverse and file folds, which will not be mentioned unless they affect the stamps or markings. Light cleaning of covers is an accepted form of conservation and is not grounds for return of a lot. The terms "Extremely Fine", etc., are meant to convey the overall appearance of cover, not the condition of an individual stamp.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, U.S. stamps are catalogued according to the *Scott 1996 U.S. Specialized Catalogue* or Volume 1 (previous editions have been used to catalogue certain Special Printings). *Scott 1996* Volumes 1-5 have been used for British and foreign stamps. The *1996 Stanley Gibbons British Commonwealth Catalogue* and other foreign catalogues are cited where appropriate.

Catalogue values are indicated by decimal figures in the right column (for example, "175.00"). Stamps in extremely fine quality and items for which catalogue values are not available have been given estimate ranges (for example "E. 750-1,000"). Lots offered subject to a reserve will never be reserved for more than the estimate (usually a fraction of the estimate).

INTRODUCTION

The principal theme of this auction, our 774th sale, is international mail usage, and we are privileged to offer two outstanding collections in this field. On behalf of the estate of Susan M. McDonald, we offer her collection of United States and British North America cross-border and transoceanic mail covers. We also have the great honor to offer Scott Gallagher's "To & From" collection, comprising covers sent to and from the United States. That these two collections should be sold together is, in a profound way, a tribute to the friendship between Susan McDonald and Scott Gallagher, who together helped to build the U.S. Classics Society into the world's leading organization devoted to U.S. 19th century philately and postal history.



Susan M. McDonald

Susan M. McDonald passed away on March 17, 1992, at the age of 73 after a seven-year battle with cancer. She was born in Cleveland, Ohio, where her father was Mayor. She was Valedictorian both in high school and at Vassar College, from where she was graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1940. Mrs. McDonald received her Master's degree in English from Radcliffe College, and her considerable skills were used to make the Classics Society's *Chronicle* publication the model of scholarship and editorial excellence in philately. She also served the Classics Society as a director and as its president, and she served on the boards of several other major philatelic organizations. For these and other achievements, Mrs. McDonald was awarded numerous honors, including the American Philatelic Society's Luff Award, the Collectors Club of New York's Lichtenstein Award, the Classics Society's Ashbrook and Brookman Cups.

D. Scott Gallagher has been a collector for more than 60 years and a student and collector of postal history for more than 30 years. An engineer by profession, Mr. Gallagher is chairman of a firm that retrofits power plants, provides cogeneration and pollution control systems, and builds energy recovery equipment. In philately he has served the Classics Society as president (1968-72) and is a director of The Philatelic Foundation. His exhibits of Puerto Rico, Tennessee and Kentucky postal history, and Caribbean Mails have garnered numerous awards in national and international competition. His wife, Shirley, is also an avid collector, specializing in Tahiti.

To assist prospective buyers in locating covers in the sale, we have combined the McDonald and Gallagher collections (supplemented by other consignor's material). We realize that doing so has blurred the line between the respective accomplishments of these two individuals, but Mr. Gallagher agreed with our recommendation, and we think Mrs. McDonald also would have been pleased to see her collection in the company of her longtime friend's collection.

Like much better than the little dark chamber at Hennigs. Mrs. Hennig is a very nice woman I can understand most she says but can speak but little Russian I tend the store seven days in the week and fish the remainder of the time, which is after 4 o'clock at night. Last Sunday I traded all day, so much for having three stores in the place. We have to trade when we can. 




855° A Collection of Transatlantic Mail. 247 covers, showing every aspect of transatlantic steamship mail between 1838 and 1875 in five SAFE albums. The early period includes freight money covers, a "Paid 7 & 25" Canadian handstamp, and mail carried by the President, the Liverpool, the Margaret (salvaged from the wreck of the Columbia) and the Herout et Handel Union. The discriminatory rate on outgoing mail by the Washington is shown, as well as a scarce Canadian embargo letter and U.S. retaliatory rates with overweights and restored rates. British treaty mail includes the first restored service to Canada, supplementary markings, registration, circulars, a newspaper tax stamp, a letter showing the Baltic's coaling stop at Provincetown on its maiden voyage, disinfected mail, forwarding from Australia penalties for unpaid mail, a letter from London to Maine by way of Germany and carrier surcharges incl. the New Orleans snow-shovel marking. British open mail includes a beautiful cover from the Dutch East Indies showing double sea postage and the informal accounting procedure used to correct. French mail includes Article 12 handstamps, circulars, the first day of the three-month period and the cover Hargest needed to prove that letters were illegally exchanged between French and U.S. ships in Southampton Harbor. French treaty mail includes letters from Argentina, Austria and Cuba and circular mail to Switzerland and Sardinia. The Abrogation Period (1870-74) and alternative rates are shown, as well as examples from the Second French Treaty (1874). German treaty mail includes the cover that Hargest used to illustrate the true 7c rate. In addition there are examples of Swiss and Italian closed mail. California mail includes an illegal split rate, a cover from France to Hawaii via San Francisco, examples of the 59c rate, the "Art 5" hs, a letter opened and re-rated 59c to New Orleans and the extremely rare 56c rate to France. A striking cover by British West Indies steamer shows an irregular block of six of France No. 19 with clear vestige of the tête-bêche position, etc. Provenance of some of these covers include Pope, Schuh and Warm etc. Each cover is identified by sailing, with rate analysis, etc., condition throughout is exceptionally fine. An important study, put together by a serious and enthusiastic student of this area and offered intact at his request to preserve his work for expansion.....
