Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. In the absence of a reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed

- appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs (see back of Bid Form).
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of New York.

Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Centering and Gum

Margin width, centering and gum are graded according to Scott Catalogue standards.

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering. The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.


Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

1074A The Letters of Edward James Glasgow and William Henry Glasgow, 1846-1848.

A REMARKABLE CORRESPONDENCE OF 27 LETTERS WRITTEN FROM THE GLASGOW BROTHERS TO FAMILY MEMBERS IN ST. LOUIS DURING THEIR JOURNEY ALONG THE SANTA FE AND CHIHUAHUA TRAILS.

The first letter is datelined Camp Magoffin, May 24, 1846, and the last is datelined Chihuahua, March 31, 1848; this correspondence, containing vivid accounts of their experiences and encounters in the American Southwest, including an eyewitness report of General Kearny's occupation of Santa Fe, was the basis (along with a separate journal) for the book Brothers on the Santa Fe and Chihuahua Trails — Edward James Glasgow and William Henry Glasgow 1846-1848 by Mark L. Gardner (University Press of Colorado, 1993), and it is probably the most significant group of letters related to early New Mexico extant outside of archival holdings.

The following are brief excerpts from the letters (datelines in italics):

Camp Magoffin, Sunday Morning, 24 May 46. It appears that old Genl. Taylor is doing very well, and I only wish that he had killed 7000 instead of 700 so that the war would be sooner ended.

Independence, May 27, 1846. The emigrants to Oregon and California are passing through daily in numbers and it appears that very soon there will hardly be enough people left to take care of the town.

[Independence] May 27, 1846. There is an escort or rather company of dragoons to leave soon for Santafe, which will prevent any trouble to us if the Mexicans were disposed to receive us otherwise than friendly but of this none of us have the slightest doubt.

SantaFe road 16 miles from Independence, Thursday 4 June. We are encamped within half a mile of the big blue river. . You can for no idea of the roads we have here. . .

Pawnee Fork 9 July 46. The Indians have all decamped thinking I doubt not that we have come out to overhaul them for killing Mr. Bents cook who was killed about 1 mile from this place. . .There are 2 Mexicans with us. . .both frightened to death & thinking the army is going to eat Mexico & the Mexicans. When Major M. L. Clark comes up with us I shall expect to receive letters from you all. Until the ports upon the Mexican gulf are opened by Ft Leavenworth is the most speedy route that letters can reach us as there will be expresses going continually between that place and Col. Kearnys army until their return

Santa Fe August 22nd 1846. An account of General Kearny's occupation of Santa Fe: As soon as our wagons passed over [Raton] Mountains this side of Bent's Fort, I left them in William's charge and rode as fast as my mule could bring me towards this place. At the first settlement I heard that an engagement was to take place next day between Gen. Kearny & Gen. Armijo's forces and I travelled on as fast as possible to get up in time to see the fun. I overtook the Am. Army and travelled with them one day, when, as no enemy appeared I left them and came on in advance to Santa Fe where I found everybody frightened out of their wits. Gen. Armijo with his troops run away, the citizens leaving town with their families and all in confusion. Gen. Kearny arrived next evening and marched into town without firing a gun. He made an address to the people stating that he took possession in the name of the U.S. and hoisted the American Flag over the Governor's palace. On the following day the civil officers of the town took the oath of allegiance and everything is quiet and tranquil as if nothing had happened. The Mexicans have got over their fright and as they now understand that they are not to be molested nor robbed they already begin to rejoice that Uncle Sam has taken possession, as they say they are tired of belonging to so weak and vacillating a govt. as that of Mexico which cannot even defend them from the incursions of the Indians.

Santa Fe Sept. 16th 1846. On the following morning we entered the town of Albuquerque, the residence of the Ex Governor Gen. Armijo; we were here received with kindness or at least civility.

Camp at Valverde 2d Novr. 1846. I wrote you in my last letter that Connelly, McManus, Geo. Doan & others were taken prisoners at the Paso & sent under guard to Chihuahua. As according to our calculation Gen. Wool must have entered Chia. Several days since we are daily expecting the arrival of an express from below telling us to come on. . .

Paso del Norte, Jany. 3d 1847. On Christmas Day there was great doings near here — the Troops from Chiha. 500 in number with about 300 of the citizens of this place attacked our Missouri Volunteers as they were camping 30 miles above this place. The Missouri boys all laid down until the Mexicans gave them one fire and then rose and charged upon them killing 40 of them the balance of them "ab case" took to their heels and the last time we heard from them they were about half way to Chiha. & running still.

Paso del Norte Jany. 4th 1847. Col. Doniphan with about 900 Volunteers are in town waiting for the arrival of artillery from Santa Fe which is daily expected. As soon as it reaches this place the command will march on towards Chihuahua. All the traders will follow immediately after him.

Chihuahua March 12th 1847. The Battle at Sacramento was such a glorious victory that the news of it must fly faster than my letters. . .[followed by an account of the battle]

Chihuahua 23d March 1847. A week ago we recd the Mexican account of the battle between Genls. Taylor & Stanta Ana...The Mexican army is without money & provisions & could old Zac scatter them once, they could never be got together again.

[Chihuahua] May and June 1847. [Letters regarding the evacuation of Chihuahua and subsequent reestablishment of government.]

Chihuahua March 31, 1848. [Eyewitness account of the Battle of Santa Cruz, the last major engagement of the war] Genl. Trias and all the officers were made prisoners and a great many soldiers, all of whom were immediately set at liberty on parole.





The outpost of Frontera was established as a New Mexico territorial post office (spelled "Frontero") on April 17, 1851, but was discontinued March 12, 1852. Some say it was destroyed by Apaches; others say it was abandoned due to flooding by the Rio Grande River. Frontera was located northwest of El Paso, Texas, about eight miles on the east side of the Rio Grande, which places it within the Texas boundary. It was an astronomical observatory used by the Boundary Commission during its operations in this district. Lt. Gardner, who sent this letter and cover, was a clerk for Major Emory's survey of the Rio Grande in August 1851.

This example is believed to be the only "N.M." designation among the five known Frontera covers, and the only one containing the original letter. Please see lot 1076 for additional Gardner correspondence.

A FINE AND VERY RARE COVER MAILED DURING THE CONFEDERATE OCCUPATION OF NEW MEXICO FROM THE NEWLY-FORMED TERRITORY OF ARIZONA.

With original letter datelined "Camp on the Rio Grande (Willow Bend), New Mexico — 33 miles above Fort Bliss, Texas and about 25 miles below Mesilla (pronounced Mesea) Arizona, December 23, 1861." Interesting content including report of activity (mostly marching) and expectation of moving on to Kansas and Missouri. Two postscripts with postal history significance: "Direct your letters now to El Paso or Ft. Bliss instead of San Antonio" and "You must excuse me Rob't for not paying the postage. I have the means & would have but our Adj't will not receive it."

In July 1861 Lt. Col. John Baylor raised the Confederate flag at Fort Bliss, later occupying Fort Fillmore and the town of Mesilla. On August 1st he issued a proclamation establishing the Confederate Territory of Arizona, naming Mesilla as its capital. In January 1862, soon after this cover was postmarked, the Confederate Congress passed a bill establishing the Territory of Arizona. President Davis signed the bill in January and issued his presidential proclamation shortly thereafter.

During this period in which the Confederate Territory of Arizona was formed, Brigadier Henry Sibley raised three regiments, designated the Army of New Mexico, comprising the 4th, 5th and 7th Texas regiments. The 4th was known unofficially as the 1st Regiment of Sibley's Brigade, to which the sender of this letter, John Collins, belonged.

According to specialists in Arizona and New Mexico postal history, there are fewer than ten examples known of the Mesilla N.M. occupation marking.
