Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. In the absence of a reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed

appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.

- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot which is accompanied by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs (see back of Bid Form)
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of New York.

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Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Centering and Gum

Margin width, centering and gum are graded according to Scott Catalogue standards.

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering. The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

For example, stamps issued in tropical climates are expected to have some gum disturbance due to humidity, and such condition is not considered a negative factor in pricing.			

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

INTRODUCTION

T WAS IN THE SIEGEL OFFICES MORE THAN THIRTY YEARS AGO that I first met Christian Aall. His distinguished appearance and elegant bearing immediately brought to mind the words "aristocratic" and "patrician". That image has held true through the years, and the words still apply.

The courtly manner, the brilliant intellect, and the warm graciousness have made memorable the visits with him over the years. He is a great philatelist and a treasured friend.

Christian Aall was born in Norway and grew up there, with only a minor interest in philately. He had a far greater passion for mountain-climbing, and in his adult life he conquered many of the notable peaks of the world. He and his wife, Sally, live part of each year in France in the shadow of Mont Blanc. Earlier, in Norway, when a stamp-collecting son went away to boarding-school, the son's album was put away in a desk drawer and forgotten. One day, Chris re-discovered the album and decided to surprise his son by taking the album to a dealer and having some spaces filled. As so often happens, the stamps cast their spell on the father, and Chris's interest evolved into specialized study of the stamps and postal history of Hawaii. Chris and Sally have a second home in Honolulu, providing Chris with opportunities to search the dealers' stocks in Hawaii for additions to his albums.

The collection grew, quietly but steadfastly, into the comprehensive seven volumes that form this sale. The Aall collection includes covers illustrating the postal history of the pre-stamp era, all of the stamps issued by the Kingdom of Hawaii, covers bearing rare frankings, the 1893 overprints of the Provisional Government, essays, proofs, officials, revenues, and railroad stamps. The postal stationery is highly specialized, with calibrations of paper thickness.

Highlights of the collection are seven of the legendary Missionary stamps, including two 13c covers. The collection includes a complete plating of the 5c and the 13c Kamehameha first printing on thick paper. The Numeral issues include rare varieties, multiples, and tête-bêche pairs.

The specialization continues in depth in the Bank Note issues and the Provisional Government overprints. In his searching, Chris found many rare double and inverted overprint varieties, as well as multiples and covers.

We at Siegel Auction Galleries share Chris Aall's pride in presenting his collection to the new generation of collectors of Hawaiian stamps and covers. We could have no greater wish for these new owners than that they be worthy successors to Christian Aall.



Fifteen 2c Missionary stamps are recorded, including the unique unused stamp and the unique cover. Of the thirteen used stamps, four are in museums, leaving eight used copies and one on piece available to collectors. Of the nine stamps available to collectors, only one is sound. This example, with its relatively minor repairs, is one of the finer-appearing examples of this rare stamp.

This 2c Missionary is first recorded as having been owned by dealer William P. Brown, who sold it to Count Philippe de la Renotiere von Ferrary in 1872 for \$25. At the fourth Ferrary sale in 1922 the stamp was purchased by Arthur Hind for the equivalent of \$8,750. Hind also acquired the unique British Guiana 1c Magenta stamp at the Ferrary sales.

Our census records only ten 13c "Hawaiian Postage" Missionary covers, including the partially charred Dawson cover and a small fragment on cover. Of the eight singles known on cover, only four are actually tied on their respective covers. The other three were offered in our *Honolulu Advertiser* sale. One of the three was purchased by the National Postal Museum and is no longer available to collectors. The other two were purchased by collectors and are unlikely to be offered on the market for some time.

Our census records nine covers bearing Scott No. 4. Of these, two are in museums. Of the seven covers available to collectors, only the cover to Persia and one other (to Boston, currently in a European collection) are free from defects or repairs. The example offered here, with its expert repair, ranks as one of the finest-appearing covers.

- "Sandwich Islands, Manoa, Oct. 24th 1829". Dateline on folded letter addressed to Mr. Henry Stockton in Boston Mass., written by Mary Ward, a teacher in the Third Missionary Company who arrived in Hawaii in 1827, fascinating contents on wide range of subjects: "The Vincennes arrived here three weeks ago, will leave tomorrow. The conduct of its commander and officers has I believe given satisfaction and we hope great good may result from their proceedings and adice to the government. . This evening the King makes an entertainment for the Officers, Chiefs and Mission family. . There are three families with us now from other stations— Mr. Bishop, Mr. Whitney and Mr. Ruggles. . The prospects of religion are encouraging at all of the stations and particularly so on Hawaii. There seems to be a new impulse awakened at the stations of Haavaloa and Haido. There has been upwards of 90 added to the church within six months.", address panel with red "Nantucket Mass. Apl. 2" oval and straightline "SHIP" handstamp, ms. "14½" rate marking and "By Capt. Arther, Ship Sarah", few small edge repairs, scotch tape stains on back, Very Fine and interesting early Missionary letter, accompanied by typed transcript........................(Photo) E. 2,000-3,000



- "Molokai (S Isles), Nov. 23rd, 1845". Dateline on folded letter addressed to "Harvey Baldwin Esq. Hudson, Summit Co. Ohio", written by Reverend Claudius Buchanan Andrews, part of contents discuss efforts of Missionaries: "It is and always has been as common for Hawaiians to sleep men, women, children, girls, boys, all along together on their mats as for English to get up on a bedstead. What should they do when they have never had or seen till us missionaries came, either bedstead, chair or table? A great effort of missionaries here now is, to break up this manner of sleeping and all we can do until they get into better than their grass houses is to tell them to curtain off some part of the room for one sex, and another for another, and make it taboo for either sex to sleep out of their place.", red "Boston Mass. May 25" cds and matching "SHIP" and "12" handstamps, very slight wear, a Very Fine and interesting letter, Rev. Buchanan arrived at Honolulu on July 15, 1844, he would later found the Maui Female Seminary in 1861 to educate native women, accompanied by typed transcript...(Photo) E. 750-1,000

14 ⋈ "Honolulu, Sand. Islands, April 6th 1847". Dateline on folded letter addressed to "Geo. M. Atwater, 121 Pearl Street, New York, U.S.A.", written by Alexander G. Abell, American Consul in Honolulu, fascinating contents partly regarding difficulties in settlement of Consular accounts in Washington, also other interesting contents: "Since writing you last our firm has become in part Californian. Immediately upon receiving intelligence as the occupation of that country by the U.S. Pacific Squadron, we loaded a brig of about 200 tons for Upper California - some \$35,000 dollars worth. . You will probably have heard one side of the story of some difficulties I had with the foreign officers who constitute the Govt. here, thru letter published in the 'Boston Atlas'. . . They quarrelled with me as they had previously quarrelled with the French Consul, the former British Consul, the present British Consul General, both my predecessors. . . It can scarcely be that we have all been wrong and His Hawaiian Majesty's oath of allegiance renegades constantly right.", inside flap indicates how letter was carried: "Apl. 20 — A vessel has just arrived from Liverpool bound to San Blas, Mexico, and Gen. Miller, the Eng. Consul Genl. has kindly offered to enclose my letters so they will go through that country. This is an unexpected piece of good fortune.", very slight edge wear incl. minor splitting along folds

FINE. A RARE USE OF THE 2-CENT BISECT DURING THE BRIEF PERIOD WHEN 6-CENT STAMPS WERE NOT AVAILABLE FOR THE NEW TREATY RATE.

In July 1870 the single-letter rate to the United States was reduced from 15c to 6c. The 6c stamps were not available until late Spring 1871, and so the rate was made up using three 2c stamps. As the supply of 2c stamps dwindled, the post office permitted bisects to be used with 5c stamps for the 6c rate.
