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Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Centering and Gum

Margin width, centering and gum are graded according to Scott Catalogue standards.

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering. The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.


Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available Scott Catalogue values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: Stanley Gibbons (SG), Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue (AAMC), Michel, Zumstein, Facit, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

THE EARLIEST RECORDED DATE OF ANY COVER BEARING THE RARE "BALIZE" STRAIGHT-LINE.

Balize (buoy or beacon in French) was a settlement at the southeast end of the mouth of the Mississippi River. During the Orleans territorial period a post office was established there to receive mail from incoming ships. Examples of the "BALIZE" straightline marking are rare, with dates ranging from September 13, 1807, to March 9, 1809, according to the American Stampless Cover Catalogue (valued at \$4,500)..........(Photo) E. 3,000-4,000

AN EXTREMELY RARE "BALIZE" STRAIGHTLINE AND UNUSUAL FORWARDED USAGE BETWEEN NEW ORLEANS AND FORT ADAMS.

Fort Adams was established in 1798 on the left bank of the Mississippi, north of New Orleans. In 1807 Cantonment Columbian Springs was built to accommodate the large number of troops. In 1810, both the fort and the cantonment were abandoned.

Col. William Anderson (1763-1829) of Chester Pa. served on the staff of General Lafayette during the Revolutionary War and was present at Valley Forge, Germantown and Yorktown. He participated in the Battle of Brandywine. From 1809 to 1819, Col. Anderson was a member of congress. Col. Thomas H. Cushing, to whom this letter is addressed, also served during the Revolutionary War.

The mails to and from Salt Lake during the 1849-50 time period form an interesting chapter in Western postal history. A Salt Lake mail route was first proposed in a special contract dated Feb. 21, 1849. The contract was never executed as Congress refused to fund the route. The mails continued to be carried by Mormon carriers, and letters were charged 10c per half oz. for domestic letters to conform to Post Office Department rates from the West Coast. The mails were carried and delivered to the Post Office at Kanesville, Iowa, where they re-entered the official government mails. In late 1850 the United States finally authorized the official route from Independence Mo. to Salt Lake, and the first west-bound trip arrived in early November.



THE ONLY RECORDED COVER ADDRESSED BY ROBERT E. LEE WITH A CONFEDERATE LITHOGRAPHED ISSUE, AND THE EARLIEST OF ALL KNOWN CONFEDERATE-PERIOD COVERS ADDRESSED BY LEE. AN OUTSTANDING ITEM OF GREAT HISTORICAL INTEREST.

Charlotte Lee was General Lee's daughter-in-law and one of his most beloved family members. Charlotte was married to William Henry Fitzhugh Lee, whose capture and imprisonment in 1863 caused her such grief and distress that an illness later in the same year led to her tragic death. While Lee still held the rank of General in April 1862, he was not in command of an army at this time. Early in March 1862, President Davis called Lee to Richmond to serve as an advisor in military operations. In June, after General Joseph E. Johnston was wounded in the Battle of Seven Pines, Lee assumed command over the army that would eventually become the famous Army of Northern Virginia. This cover, posted on April 27, 1862, is addressed in Lee's distinctive hand, but he did not sign the envelope, as became his custom after taking command of the Army of Northern Virginia. Because postage was required on all mail (other than official post office business), General Lee affixed the 5c Hoyer & Ludwig stamp for the proper 5c rate. Remarkably, this is the only Lee cover recorded with the lithographed issue (Scott 1-5). It is also the earliest Confederate-period cover addressed by Lee.





STEEL TENNE THORS Antice to the Public and Justin aims to Pari-Masters By the Post-Master General of the Confederate States of America. A PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS, By the provisions of an act, approved March 15th, 1861, and amended by the first section of an act approved May 9th, 1861, the Post-Master General of the Confederate States "is authorized, on and after a day to be named by him for that purpose, to take the entire charge and direction of the postal service in the Confederate States," and all conveyance of mails within their limits, from and after such day, except by authority of the Post-Master General thereof, is thereby prohibited: Now, therefore, I, John H. Reagan, Post-Muster General of the Confederate States of America, do issue this my proclamation, notifying all Post-Masters, Contractors, and Special and Route Agents, in the service of the Post-Office Department, and engaged in the transmission and delivery of the mails, or service of the Post-Office Department, and engaged in the transmission and delivery of the mails, or otherwise in any manner connected with the service within the limits of the Confederate States of America, that on and after the 1st day June next, I shall assume the entire control and direction of the postal service therein: And I hereby direct all Post-Masters, Route Agents and Special Agents within these States, and now acting under the authority and direction of the Post-Master General of the United States, to continue in the discharge of their respective duties under the authority vested in me by the Congress of the Confederate States, in strict conformity with such existing laws and regulations as are not inconsistent with the laws and constitution of the Confederate States of America, and such further instructions as may hereafter be issued by my direction: And the said Post-Masters, Route Agents and Special Agents are also required to forward to this Department, without delay, their names, with the names of the offices of which they are Post-Masters, (giving the State and Connty,) to be directed to the "Chief of the Appointment Bureau, Post-Office Department, Montgomery, Alabama," in order that new commissions may be issued under the authority of this Government: And all Post-Masters are he eby required to render to the Post-Office Department at Washington, D. This cover travelled 129 miles down river from Baton Rouge and entered the mails at the New Orleans wharf office where the double-circle datestamp was used. Based on surviving covers, it is evident that the postmasters in New Orleans and Baton Rouge would accept stamps on letters coming off river boats. A second example of the Baton Rouge provisional cancelled at New Orleans (Dec. 1861 to Carroll Hoy & Co.) was part of the Steven Brown collection.

The addressee, Captain Favrot, was a member of a prominent Baton Rouge family. The group of Baton Rouge covers addressed to Captain Favrot has been in collectors' hands for many decades.



There are three recorded covers with the Columbia provisonal used in combination with a General Issue stamp. Each of the other two covers has a 5c Green Hoyer & Ludwig stamp applied to uprate the provisional entire before the July 1, 1862, rate change (one of these is offered in lot 1862). Another cover exists with the 5c stamp affixed over the provisonal, but the latter served no postal duty. This cover is the only Columbia provisional used with a 5c Richmond Local Print stamp, and it is the only one used after the July 1st rate change. The September 1 (1862) date and absence of a due marking indicate Columbia's acceptance of the old provisional entire as part of the 10c rate.

We record a total of eight covers with combinations of Confederate provisionals (either adhesive or handstamped) and General Issue stamps to prepay postage — we have excluded from this count a few covers on which the provisional served no postal duty. In our opinion, these combination frankings are significant and quite undervalued — imagine what price would be paid for a Baltimore provisional handstamped entire with a U.S. 5c 1847 stamp, or a St. Louis "Bear" and 1847 combination.







The oval and "5" are heavily impressed and indent the paper thru the backflaps, which would not be possible if they were applied to the envelope while the letter was enclosed. The oval and "5" were applied to the empty envelope (provisional usage) and the Columbia cds and "Paid" were applied after mailing.

Of the eight Goliad 10c Type II (29X7) stamps in our records, five are used on covers, including an uncancelled stamp on a cover in the Tapling collection at the British Library, which leaves four covers available to collectors. Only three of the four covers have stamps tied by the town datestamp or "Paid" straightline. In addition to the normal 10c Type II, there are two other covers with the Type II "GOILAD" spelling error.

The earliest recorded date for any Goliad provisional is October 21, 1863, but it is our theory that the Type I provisionals were issued in 1861, followed in 1863 by a new provisional stamp printing from the Type II settings, which contain the postmaster's name and title. Therefore, this cover is more accurately described as the earliest known date for any Type II provisional.



There are three types of Macon 5c provisionals. Based on dated examples, it appears that the Scott 53X4 design (and 53X7 on laid paper) — with its simple line-rule border — was the first stamp issued in Macon. Almost all of the fourteen recorded covers are dated during the first half of June 1861, including an uncancelled example originating on a cover dated June 1st, the first day of the Confederate postal system. The Macon cds was often poorly struck; although this strike does not show the month, the "2" is very likely to be June 2, based on the use of the "Paid" and small "5" rate handstamp in conjunction with the provisional, a marking pattern that disappears by late June.

Of the four advertising covers bearing this provisional, three have the stamp tied by a cancel. One of these three is a green oval corner card, and another is a lithographed allover design without any illustration.



The Marion Va. 5c and 10c provisional stamps, with their distinctive "Check" label at top, were issued by Postmaster J. H. Francis in 1861. The stamps were printed in two steps: first, the typeset form containing the border and words "P. Office, Marion, Va., Check. Paid" was impressed; then the value "5" or "10" was handstamped on the blank center. Postmaster Francis described his stamps in a January 1880 letter to August Dietz, and he offered to make more from the "die" which he still possessed. Various "reprints" made from the typeset form were made by John W. Scott, including 2c, 15c and 20c values that have never been seen genuinely used.

Genuine Marion provisional stamps are extremely rare. Our records contain six covers with the Marion 10c provisional, plus a repaired stamp affixed to the back of a cover noted in the Crown book as part of the Worthington collection. There are two unused stamps and perhaps one or two off-cover stamps extant. Of the six known covers, one is part of the Tapling collection at the British Library (a sound example dated Oct. 15, 1861), two have stamps with a significant portion of the design cut away (dated Oct. 25 and Nov. 16, 1861), and one has the bottom right corner of the stamp repaired (dated Sep. 24, 1861, ex Caspary). Therefore, there remain only two covers available to collectors in essentially sound condition: the ex-Hessel cover (dated Nov. 18, 1861, with repairs to the cover) and the cover offered here, which is a relatively late use of the provisional stamp (Mar. 2, 1862).









The Crown book lists two strips of four and two strips of three. The two strips of four exist in vertical and horizontal form, each on cover. The only strip of three on cover is offered here. There is another strip of three on piece (ex Caspary). Neither we nor a Mobile specialist can find record of the strip of five on cover listed in the Scott Catalogue. If our records are incomplete, we would appreciate a photocopy of the missing item or items.

In our opinion the Mobile provisionals are generally under-appreciated. The allegorical design is unusual among Confederate provisionals — the only other postmaster's adhesive stamp with a pictorial design was issued at Livingston, Alabama (a similar design, probably by the same printer).

BLOCKADE-RUN COVERS FROM BELGIUM TO CONFEDERATE ALABAMA

The recent discovery of two covers sheds light on a little-known phase of blockade-run mails — the handling of mail by foreign diplomats. The covers offered in lots 1996 and 1997 were sent to former U.S. Minister to Belgium, Gen. Elisha Y. Fair, after he returned to his native state of Alabama in June 1861. General Fair and his wife, Wyatt, were prominent members of Belgian society when the Civil War began. Although General Fair returned to Montgomery, his wife was unable to join him until one year later, due to the Federal blockade of Southern ports. In February 1862 she petitioned U.S. Secretary of State William Seward for permission to rejoin her husband and was immediately authorized to do so, but did not return until June of the same year. While General Fair was in Belgium, he had already begun work for the Confederate government by investigating Belgian arms manufacturers and naval ship builders. Mrs. Fair, who stayed in Brussels and travelled among Belgian high society, undoubtedly provided intelligence to her husband in her letters.

From a postal history viewpoint, the two Fair covers are remarkable as examples of Confederate provisionals used on identifiable blockade-run mail. The Mobile cover is also noteworthy for the consulate forwarding endorsement and Belgian seal on back. The New Orleans cover has a spectacular franking that reveals the correspondent's uncertainty about how the letter would be handled after making the transatlantic journey. As noted in each description, the natural state of the covers has not been changed, although simple restoration would enhance their appearance. This choice was made to give students the opportunity to study the markings just as found.

We are grateful to Daniel J. Frankignoul, Deputy-Mayor of Brussels and President of the Confederate Historical Association of Belgium, who generously provided information about General Fair, his wife and Confederate-Belgian relations during the Civil War. A copy of his letter accompanies each lot.

This cover originated in Brussels, Belgium, on July 12, 1861. It was sent by Mrs. Wyatt Fair to her husband, Gen. Elisha Y. Fair, who was former U.S. Minister to Belgium and left Brussels in late June 1861 to join the Southern cause. Mrs. Fair was unable to return to her native land until June 1862, due to the Federal blockade of Southern ports. This cover and the following cover have recently surfaced, and they provide heretofore unrecorded examples of blockade-run mail sent from Belgium through diplomatic channels. The relatively early dates coincide with use of postmaster provisional stamps in Mobile and New Orleans.(Photo) E. 4,000-5,000

Although related to the Mobile cover from Mrs. Wyatt Fair, the different handwriting suggests that this was sent to Gen. Fair by someone other than Mrs. Fair. It originated in Brussels on July 23, 1861, and was routed through New Orleans, almost certainly through the Belgian consul, J. Deynoot, or his vice-consul, J. Noblom. The unusual franking suggests that the sender used a U.S. entire and 3c stamp in expectation that the letter would travel via the U.S. post office. Most likely, the person responsible for mailing the letter at New Orleans affixed the two pairs of provisional stamps for the double 10c rate to Montgomery.

CONFEDERATE STATES GENERAL ISSUES

THE RICHARD NORTON COLLECTION OF OFFICIAL AND PRIVATE PERFORATIONS

Richard Norton is the first collector to form a comprehensive study collection of perforated stamps used in the Confederacy. Early documentation of perforated Confederate stamps was made by August Dietz, but for many years little effort was made to identify and explain perforated stamps and their usage in a more detailed manner. Calvet Hahn published a well-researched two-part article in *Stamp Collector* (3/12/1984 and 5/28/1984), which included a census of known examples. Richard Norton published a series of articles in the *Confederate Philatelist*, in which he analyzed covers and identified patterns of usage to establish the source and distribution method of the official and unofficial perforated stamps. Both Hahn and Norton reached similar conclusions, as follows:

- In mid-1863 the Archer & Daly 10c Type I and II engraved issues were perforated and distributed by the Confederate government in Richmond, using a machine that created 12.5-gauge perfs. Between 500 and 1,000 sheets (50,000 to 100,000 stamps) were perforated and issued—the earliest recorded date of use is July 13, 1863 (the latest is May 10, 1865).
- Distribution of the officially-perforated stamps was primarily to areas of troop concentrations in Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi. Because of the necessity of defending internal railway lines, most uses are affiliated with post offices located on the Confederate railway system, which served Confederate troops.
- The Norton census contains at least 104 genuine covers with officially-perforated stamps, with Type I outnumbering Type II stamps by an approximate 2:1 ratio. The largest multiples are as follows: Unused—block of 98; Used off cover—block of 4; Used on cover—pair.
- Five different unofficial, or "private", perforations have been identified as likely to have been
 produced by local postmasters—these types are confirmed by multiple recorded examples. Other
 known private perforations may have been made by private citizens for their own convenience.
 Seven of the fourteen General Issue stamps are recorded with some form of unofficial perforation.

Unlike any other stamps in the Scott Catalogue, the officially-perforated 10c Type I and II stamp are given minor listings as Scott 11e and 12f. Their status as issues worthy of major catalogue entries is justified by the following facts: 1) the C.S.A. government intended to perforate stamps from the beginning, although difficulty with the process caused this measure to be abandoned; 2) the perforated issue was deliberate—perhaps 100,000 stamps were distributed to several post offices, and the convenience of perforated stamps benefited troops who would not necessarily have scissors or a razor to cut apart stamps, and 3) the existence of multiples, covers from a variety of post offices, and the distinctive characteristics of the official perf 12.5 help establish the genuineness of individual examples.







Excerpts are: On the Federal landing at Beaufort, "Oh Ma it makes me shudder to think how Carolina blood will flow ere those infernal scoundrels are driven from our beloved soil."; On the North, "I have no doubt but what we have left enough brave men at home to teach Lincoln's abolitions hordes the madness and folly of attacking us in our homes and to let them know that it is just as much of an impossibility for Yankees and Carolinians to exist on the same soil as it is for them to free our negroes."; and continued fervent patriotism with many references to spilling blood and a final battle cry "I wear that Palmetto Tree on the front of my cap and I am going to wear it there when I get into a fight and let the Yanks know that I am not afraid to own my native state."


