Conditions of Sale

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
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- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. In the absence of a reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
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- will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of $1^12\%$ per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.

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Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Centering and Gum

Margin width, centering and gum are graded according to Scott Catalogue standards.

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering. The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

INTRODUCTION

The 1869 Pictorial Issue was the first in the United States to show images rather than portraits, and it was also the first with stamps printed in more than one color. The distinctiveness that makes the Pictorial Issue so popular with collectors was rejected by the public in 1869, and one year later the new Grant Administration's postmaster-general replaced the 1869's with the Bank Note Issue, which restored the traditional portraiture, size and monochromatic designs.

In their time the 1869's were recognized by European collectors as special stamps. The images and bicolored high values were appreciated more overseas than in America, and it is for this reason that so many 15c, 24c, 30c and 90c stamps were soaked off covers and saved by collectors. Philatelic popularity in Europe, where many of the covers were addressed, resulted in a scarcity of high-values surviving on covers.

Considering the 1869's popularity with European philatelists in the 19th century, it is fitting that a 20th-century European collector formed one of the most outstanding collections of its kind. Although the collector wishes anonymity, he has earned recognition by winning a Large Gold medal for his 1869's in the international exhibition held in India a few years ago. Specialized one-issue collections must reach a very high level of achievement before they are awarded a Large Gold medal, and this collection, through its scope of study and a fantastic array of covers, reached the top.

The story of the 1869's is told here with essays, proofs, off-cover stamps and multiples, followed by a plethora of covers showing domestic and foreign-mail usage. Especially noteworthy are the covers, which include some extremely unusual and rare domestic usages — registered mail, inbound covers from Mexico, expresses and high-values on domestic covers — and a brilliantly-assembled group of foreign-mail rates and destinations. Here we have covers to South America, Spain, Australia, China, Java, Singapore, the Philippines, and there are covers with 1869's used from China, Japan and Hawaii (a kingdom at this time).

The use of the 1869's coincided with the expiration of the U.S.-French postal treaty, and this fascinating period of postal history is represented by many remarkable covers. For example, there are various Phantom Rate frankings, and the highlight is a cover with the 10c 1869 and two French stamps, a mixed franking that was necessary because the treaty lapsed, but rarely used by the public.

Every 1869 Pictorial Issue collection is judged by its representation of the bicolored high values on covers, and in this aspect the collection offered here excels. Included are three 15c Type I, twenty 15c Type II, five 24c, and five 30c covers. The 30c covers include one to the Philippines (unique) and a cover to Germany (lot 2331), which was regarded by Robert A. Siegel as one of his favorite classic United States covers.

The covers conclude with a formidable showing of 1875 Re-issues, including the earliest recorded use of any 1869 Re-issue (lot 2334) and one of the most beautiful 10c 1869 Re-issue covers extant.



The first 3c Small Queen stamps were issued in January 1870 from the Ottawa printing. This April 1870 cover bears a pair from the early 1870 printing. There are no Canadian postal markings; therefore, it appears that this cover was first franked with Canadian stamps for the 6c rate to England, then franked with United States stamps for the corresponding rate to England from a United States origin point. The cover was probably carried outside the mails to Boston or New York and mailed from there. It is the only U.S.-Canada mixed-franking cover recorded in the Forster census of 1869 mixed frankings.







EXTREMELY FINE. THE ONLY INTACT 10-CENT 1869 COVER KNOWN TO US SHOWING A TRUE MIXED FRANKING WITH FRENCH STAMPS. A HIGHLY-REGARDED COVER THAT GRAPHICALLY DEMONSTRATES THE PECULIAR POST-TREATY PERIOD OF UNITED STATES AND FRENCH MAILS.

The expiration of the 1857 U.S.-French postal treaty on January 1, 1870, left both countries without a new agreement to govern the exchange of mails and division of postage. The U.S. Post Office Department announced that letters sent direct to and from France would be charged 10c, the rate generally applied to any country with which the U.S. had no postal treaty. Letters could also be sent by British Open Mail via England at the 4c rate. The Phantom Rate, announced only for Algeria but also applicable to France, provided another means of prepaying mail to France via England. However, these three options still did not allow a correspondent to prepay the full postage with his own country's stamps, and covers from this post-treaty period typically show due markings of the receiving country. The cover offered here is the rare exception, and it is the only intact cover with French stamps and the 10c 1869 Issue prepaying the combined U.S. and internal French postage.

In this instance, the U.S. postage was correctly prepaid with a 10c 1869 stamp. The cover was postmarked at the New York post office and delivered to an agent aboard the French Ligne H steamer No. 1, the *Periere*, anchored in New York harbor. Presumably it was the sender who affixed 60 centimes in French stamps to prepay the internal postage, and the mail agent cancelled the stamps with the widely-used Anchor maritime marking. He also marked the cover with the French Ligne H No. 1 packet datestamp. Although New York marked the cover "P.P." — Paid to Port, not to the final destination — the French stamps ensured that the letter would be treated as prepaid in France and delivered to the addressee without postage due. The absence of any French due markings confirms this treatment.

True mixed frankings — so-called $Group\ I$ mixed frankings — are defined in the 1869 PRA census (and by other specialists) as having stamps of two or more countries applied conjunctively to pay the rate or rates necessary to carry the letter from the sender to the addressee. Group I mixed frankings are more desirable than covers showing combination frankings for forwarding. Only a few 1869 Group I mixed frankings are known. The other 10c 1869 cover with French stamps originated in the Caribbean and is inbound to New York with a 10c tied by the New York Steamship marking; one of the French stamps has been torn off, thus it cannot be compared to this superb cover. There is also a $2c\ 1869/6c\ 1870$ cover to France with a similar 20c/40c French franking.

The 17c postage on this cover overpays by 1c the 16c British packet rate for a letter weighing ½ to ½ ounce (or 10-15 grams). The presence of the word "grille" next to the 5c stamp—an obvious philatelic reference in the same ink and hand of the address—leads us to speculate that the sender was an early *timbrophile*. Recognition of shades and grill varieties was already established at this time, and the use of three different issues may have been deliberate.





A SPECTACULAR AND UNIQUE UNITED STATES-HAWAIIAN MIXED FRANKING.

The July 1, 1870, U.S.-Hawaiian treaty rate required a 6c stamp, which was not issued in Honolulu until February 14, 1871, weeks after this cover was mailed. For nearly eight months this circumstance resulted in the frequent use of the 2c Kamehameha IV in strips of three, but when this practice threatened to deplete the supply of 2c stamps, letter writers resorted to the use of 2c halves with the 5c value. In this case the four-times 6c treaty rate to the U.S. should have been prepaid with 24c in stamps; the conjunctive 24c U.S. treaty rate to Canada, which was required on Hawaiian mail, was correctly prepaid with U.S. stamps. The intention of the sender in affixing a bisect is unclear, but the 3c short payment was probably paid in cash.




VERY FINE. AN OUTSTANDING PHANTOM RATE USAGE TO FRANCE WITH A COLORFUL 1869 PICTORIAL FRANKING.

The "48/3" credit and all markings on this cover correspond to the so-called Phantom Rate that provided for prepayment to France via England during the period when the postal treaty between the United States and France lapsed without a new agreement. The rate was never announced and was listed in the international rate tables under Algeria, which was considered a part of France. It was based on the 4c U.S.-British Open Mail and the 8c (4 pence) British-French rates. However, the U.S.-British rate was based on ½ ounce (or 15 grams) weight increments, while the British-French rate was based on 1/4 ounce (or 7.5 grams) increments. Because Great Britain was entitled to receive prepayment of the full postage incurred in transmitting the letter to France, it received an 8c credit for every 1/4 ounce (7.5 grams). On the other hand, the United States collected its 4c postage for the first ½ ounce (15 grams) and an additional rate for each ½ ounce thereafter. Thus, the basic single rate for a letter weighing not more than a 1/4 ounce was 12c (4c U.S. and 8c British). For letters weighing between ½ and ½ ounce, the rate increased to 20c (4c U.S. and 16c British). Between ½ and ¾ ounce, the rate was 32c (8c U.S. and 24c British). Between ¾ and 1 ounce, the rate was 40c (8c and 32c British). Between 1 and 11/4 ounces, the rate was 52c (12c U.S. and 40c British). And, as reflected in the credit on this cover, if the letter weighed between 11/4 and 11/2 ounces, the rate was 60c (12c U.S. and 48c British). The red crayon "48" indicates Great Britain's share of the postage, and the "3" is the U.S. indication that three rates were required (one for each ½ ounce increment).

Obviously, the letter was underpaid 15c, because the correct Phantom Rate postage for a $1\frac{1}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{2}$ ounce letter was 60c, and the franking only adds up to 45c. True to its name, the Phantom Rate was generally unknown to the public. It is believed that not a single correctly-prepaid 12c Phantom Rate cover has been located (they are usually 15c frankings). The sender of this cover probably knew that its weight required three rates, and the 45c franking was intended to prepay three of the old 15c treaty rates. At the New York exchange office, the letter was sent via England and a proper credit of 48c (6 x 8c per $\frac{1}{4}$) ounce) was given to the British post office. There is no evidence of a missing stamp, so one can only speculate why the New York exchange office would feel so charitable. Perhaps this cover was part of a larger group from the same addressee, including overpayments and underpayments, and the exchange clerk simply looked at the whole group and determined that enough total postage had been prepaid.



EXTREMELY FINE. A COLORFUL AND EXTREMELY RARE COMBINATION FRANKING TO SWITZERLAND.

From April 1868 thru April 30, 1870, the rate to Switzerland via British Closed Mail was 15c. Effective May 1, 1870, the rate was lowered to 10c. There was also a 20c rate via NGU Closed Mail that ended two years earlier in April 1868. The sender affixed 20c postage on this cover, either for the old NGU rate or for a double-rate letter at the new 10c British Closed Mail rate before the rate reduction took effect eleven days later. The deficiency as a double-rate letter was detected at the New York exchange office, and the blue "50" marking next to the 2c stamp indicates the 50 centimes underpayment (U.S. 10 cents). A 20 centimes penalty was added to the deficiency and rated 70 centimes due in Switzerland. Although 41 15c covers to Switzerland are recorded in the 1869 PRA census (this cover is not listed), only this cover has additional stamps for 20c prepayment........

A COLORFUL AND EXTRAORDINARY 1869 PICTORIAL USAGE TO INDIA.

This cover is illustrated in the 1869 PRA census book (p. 162) with a 3c 1869 affixed at upper right that has an entirely different cancel and obviously never belonged; the stamp has since been removed. However, there was at one time a stamp or stamps in the same position. We think that the missing stamps were probably a pair of 2c 1869's, cancelled by the same segmented grid that extends onto the top right of the 10c and cover. The original franking — 15c, 10c, 2c pair and 1c, excluding the 6c — adds up to 30c, the correct rate to India for British Mail via Marseilles (with corresponding 26c credit). The 6c at lower right is uncancelled and, if part of the sender's original franking, was superfluous. We are convinced that it belongs to the cover, because affixing an original-gum, wellcentered 6c 1869 to a cover is not characteristic of the usual "enhancements." A plausible explanation is that the 2c stamps fell off in handling, after cancellation, but before the exchange office clerk rated the letter. Observing that the stamps had fallen off, a postal employee (possibly the foreign exchange clerk) applied the replacement stamp (6c being convenient) and from that point it was marked with the "26" credit for British Mail via Marseilles. We recognize that this involves speculation that the post office was unusually accommodating, but the removal of the added 3c and a reevaluation of the cover in its present form are significant steps toward understanding this remarkable relic. The 1c and 24c stamps were intended to prepay the 25c rate (between ½ and ½ ounce) for American Packet service to Rio de Janeiro and from there by French Packet to Buenos Aires. However, the French Packet service ended by January 1870, and the cover was sent via the new British Packet. The 18c per ½ ounce rate applied to British mail, and the cover was correctly marked with the 8c credit.

Only two 24c 1869 covers to Argentina are recorded in the 1869 PRA census book. Although two 1c and 14c combination covers are listed in the same census, subsequent to publication the other cover (ex Ishikawa) was determined to be a forgery, leaving only this cover with the 1c Franklin and 24c Signing of the Declaration of Independence pictorial stamps.



Walske). The correct credit for a single 15c American Packet via England rate was 6c, and this double-rate letter was prepaid 30c with a corresponding 12c credit.






