Conditions of Sale (Important—please read carefully)

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 10% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such hids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. In the absence of a reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder.

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. **Any lot which is accompanied** by an expert certificate (for U.S. items, the accepted authority is The Philatelic Foundation), dated within the past five years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion obtained after the sale. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that is not accompanied by a certificate dated within the past five years may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$100.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs (see back of Bid Form).
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Grade and Centering

Margin width, centering and gum are graded according to Scott Catalogue standards.

Extremely Fine (EF): Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering. The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue.

Very Fine (VF): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side.

Fine (F): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (VG): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. **These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.**

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

Introduction to The Sevenoaks Collection

N MAY 1998 THE SIEGEL FIRM SOLD THE SEVENOAKS COLLECTION of classic imperforate issues. In introducing the first sale, we noted that the collector behind the collection — a philatelist who desires anonymity — would continue to acquire items from the 1857 and 1861-66 perforated issues. No collection of this kind is ever *complete*, but most collectors reach a point when the limited availability of significant items diminishes the impetus to continue. Having reached that point, the collector has decided to sell.

The first United States perforated stamps were issued early in 1857. The basic stamps were printed by Toppan, Carpenter & Company and perforated on a machine imported from Bemrose and Sons in England, which was modified by changing the device from a roulette perforator to a round-hole perforator. In 1857 there were five current stamps: 1c, 3c, 5c, 10c and 12c denominations. These remained the only stamps in circulation until the summer months of 1860, when higher denominations were issued for the prepayment of high transoceanic postage rates established under various postal treaties with foreign countries. In 1860 the 24c, 30c and 90c stamps were issued only in perforated form. [For more on-line information, go to www.siegelauctions.com/enc/1857.htm].

As Toppan, Carpenter's contract was due to expire in June 1861, the Civil War broke out and postal relations between the North and South were severed. Concerned that supplies of postage stamps in secessionist hands might be sold as contraband, the Federal government demonetized all circulating stamps and issued new stamps printed by the National Bank Note Company. The new series is known to collectors as the 1861-66 Issue, covering ten different values issued in ungrilled form prior to 1867. Viewed historically, the stamps and covers used from 1857 to 1866 coincide with a period of remarkable change and turmoil. The growth of international commerce produced an enormous increase in letter communication between countries. Westward expansion and settlement in California, fueled by the spread of railroads and discovery of gold and silver ore, increased demand for more efficient transcontinental mail routes. Finally, the Civil War from 1861 to 1865 divided not only the country, but its postal system. The effects of these events are represented by the stamps and covers in the Sevenoaks collection.

Few collectors stay dormant for very long, and we imagine that the seeds of a new Sevenoaks collection will be planted in the near future. This offering of the Sevenoaks Classic Perforated Issues concludes Chapter 2, but we are confident that future chapters will be written soon.

85 presentation albums were prepared in 1903. As our description in the Finkelburg catalogue (Sale 816) notes, some values were prepared from the original dies. The partial set offered in the Finkelburg sale (lacking the 3c) realized \$2,500 hammer.



The 1c Type I perforated is a notoriously difficult stamp to find well-centered. The Type I shows the completed design at both top and bottom, and, as the spacing on the plate was narrow and perforating of stamps during this time period was generally poor, most examples do not show the defining characteristics of the type. The example offered here, showing the full ornamentation at top right and virtually full design at bottom, is a condi-



tion rarity.

Type Ia stamps were produced from eighteen of the twenty bottom-row positions on Plate 4 (the other two are Type Ic). After perforations were introduced in mid-1857, sheets on hand printed from Plates 1 Late and 2 were fed through the new perforating machine, but the narrow spaces between stamps made perforating difficult to accomplish without cutting into the designs. Plate 4 was produced in early 1857 when the introduction of perforations was anticipated; thus, it was entered from a new six-relief transfer roll, and the spaces between stamps were enlarged to allow for perforations. Some Plate 4 sheets were issued in imperforate form (April to June 1857), while the greater portion was issued perforated beginning in July 1857, along with perforated sheets from Plates 1L and 2.

Unlike its Orange Brown counterpart, the 5c Type II in Brown was not on hand in post offices when the 1861 demonetization order took effect. Therefore, original-gum examples of Scott 30A are far scarcer than Scott 30. The narrow spacing between subjects on the plate, as well as Toppan Carpenter's imprecise perforating, leaves collectors with very few well-centered original-gum examples. This remarkable stamp, with the captured imprint at right, is among the finest we have located among auction sales of the past fifty years.



The wide-spacing perforations occurred infrequently during perforating of Plate 4, either along the top row (Type II) or bottom row (Type Ia), depending on the direction of the printed sheet as it was run through the perforating machine. One of the most famous wide-spacing stamps is the Type Ia offered in our Zoellner sale, which realized \$50,000 hammer.

A wandering pig set off an armed confrontation between Canada and the United States, which lasted for twelve years. The incident occurred June 15, 1859, a warm summer's day on San Juan Island, just east of Victoria, British Columbia. Farmer Lyman Cutlar stepped out onto his balcony to find that a pig, owned by the Hudson's Bay Company, was once again rooting around in his garden. Enraged, he promptly shot the pig. The Hudson's Bay Company threatened to take farmer Cutlar to Victoria for trial in British Columbia, but the American government protested. The treaty of 1846 established that the international boundary line lay mid-channel in the Strait of Juan de Fuca, which the Americans claimed made San Juan Island their territory. The problem was that there were at least two channels. The argument smoldered for months until the Americans called in the military. Captain George Pickett arrived on July 26, 1859, and immediately proclaimed the island U.S. territory. The following week 61 Royal Marines came ashore from a warship to assert British claim to the territory. For the next twelve years armed detachments faced each other across the western end of the long international boundary. In 1871, under the treaty of Washington, the matter was referred to Emperor Wilhelm I of Germany for arbitration. He awarded the verdict to the United States. There is a bit of irony in the fact that a British soldier fighting Americans was required to send mail via the United States post office. This is the first and only cover we have seen that has content linking it to one of the great episodes in Canadian-American relations — the "Pig Wars."..... E. 5,000-7,500



There is a long L-shaped scissors-cut below the stamps that has been neatly sealed with archival tape (the 1c lifted and reaffixed in its proper position). The backflap is opened to display the money-package label.

This cover was handled by Adams Express Company within days of the August 26th termination date for all express intercourse between the North and South and also at the point when Northern post offices commenced demonetization of old stamps. The exchange period in Louisville began August 22nd for three days; beginning on August 25th, stamps other than the new 1861 Issue would no longer be accepted by the Louisville post office. The earliest recorded use of the 30c from any post office is August 20; therefore, for a period certainly no greater than seven days, beginning August 20th, it was possible for a 30c 1861 stamp to be used on a thru-the-lines express cover via Louisville. In this case, the sender in New Orleans prepaid the express fee and postage to France, either in cash or by affixing stamps to an outer transmittal envelope, and the Adams office in Louisville applied the 30c stamp from the newly-issued 1861 series. We know of one other thru-the-lines cover with the 1861 Issue, a 3c Pink with Adams August 26 and Louisville August 27 datestamps.


