
The narrowly-spaced 30c 1861 plate left very little room for the 12-gauge perforations between stamps. Consequently, examples with wide margins at sides are extremely rare — this fact is acknowledged in the Scott Catalogue footnote to No. 71. The stamp offered is one of the few known original-gum examples in a higher grade. Furthermore, the shade is typical of the earliest 1861 printing, distinguished by its brightness and yellow glow. We have seen very few original-gum examples of the early shade, and this is without question the finest we have handled.





EXTREMELY FINE GEM. AN EXTRAORDINARY MINT NEVER-HINGED 30-CENT 1879 AMERICAN BANK NOTE ISSUE. THIS ISSUE IS RARELY OBTAINABLE IN CHOICE MINT NEVER-HINGED CONDITION.

The 30c 1879 American Bank Note Company issue is surprisingly difficult to obtain in choice Mint N.H. condition. It is surprising because the 15c (Scott 189) is readily available. However, a survey of our photo records and auction library revealed the scarcity of well-centered 30c blocks from which singles could be harvested. The blocks in the Green sales were off center. Caspary had a well-centered hinged block of four, and Lilly had a block of nine with problems. The Moody block of six was well-centered, but appears to have had hinge remnants on all stamps. The Todd collection had two blocks, including one with a Mint N.H. pair at bottom (this has probably been broken, furnishing at least two Mint N.H. stamps). The Close collection had a well-centered block of four (with reinforcing) and a large plate block. The Siegel firm's three major Bank Note Issue sales (Braus, Hirschfield, Wunderlich) contained blocks, but all were either off center or had hinge remnants. A well-centered block of four appeared in our 1982 Rarities sale, but it was hinged.

George Washington. Free frank "G. Washington" as Commanding General of the Continental Army on June 21, 1777 folded letter from Lt. Col. Robert H. Harrison (Secretary and Aide to General Washington) and addressed in his hand to Col. George Baylor (Washington's Aide-de-Camp from Aug. 1777 to Jan. 1778) "near Fredericksburg", additional ms. "Free", war-related content states (in part): "Gen. Howe has made a strange maneuver of late — after collecting his whole army about him and parade for 6 or 8 miles, he returned to Brunswick and I shall not be surprised if you won't ascertain that he has left New Jersey" and post-script "He encamped and fortified for 5 or 6 days and burned several houses in his return", opened and repaired incl. small mended hole to right of Washington's frank but not affecting it

A FINE AND RARE GEORGE WASHINGTON FREE FRANK AS COMMANDING GENERAL OF THE CONTINENTAL ARMY ON AN INTERESTING LETTER FROM THE NEW JERSEY CAMPAIGN.

As predicted in this letter, within days of June 19, 1777, the British Army evacuated New Brunswick, New Jersey, to Amboy, and returned to Staten Island. On June 20, George Washington notified Congress and General Schuyler of the New Jersey militia's success in forcing the British out of the state and of the British Army's failure to coerce New Jersey residents to pledge allegiance to the Crown. VERY FINE. AN OUTSTANDING REVOLUTIONARY WAR-PERIOD LETTER SENT THRU THE MAILS TO THE AIDE-DE-CAMP OF GENERAL HORATIO GATES AT FORT TICONDEROGA, IN CARE OF GENERAL WASHINGTON'S AIDE-DE-CAMP, TENCH TILGHMAN.

This fascinating 2½ page letter was written by William Tilghman at 20 years of age, who later served as Chief Justice of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court and was one of the "midnight judges" appointed by President Adams to the Third Circuit Court in 1801. He was the grandson of Tench Francis and the brother of Tench Tilghman, a Revolutionary War soldier who served as an aidede-camp to General Washington at Valley Forge. Tench Tilghman also served as secretary and treasurer to the Continental Congress in 1775. The letter begins with favorable mention of the promotion of James Wilkinson and laments the vacant social scene of Philadelphia (his comments are made weeks after the Declaration of Independence). Tilghman continues with a direct reference to General Burgoyne's movements and potential to join forces with General Howe: "But it is feared that our Army has suffered almost too much from sickness and the rigors of the last campaign. If you can surmount these difficulties, by your activity and courage, your honor will be immortal. Much is expected from Genl. Gates, and he seems to be looked up to, to retrieve the desperate Affairs of Canada." The writer then gives a heartfelt commentary on war and peace: "But you and I, my Friend, shall be laid low, before the tender frame of the Infant States, can recover from those violent convulsions that are to usher them into Being." Tilghman states that he is giving this letter to Tench Coxe (a relative) "who will forward it by the first opportunity." Based on this remark, the forwarding notation on the address panel was probably written by Tench Coxe.

According to http://www.2ndpa-43rdfoot.com/history.html: "The colonel of the 13th, 23-year-old Walter Stewart, became the Second's [Second Pennsylvania Regiment's] new commander. The young officer, nicknamed 'The Irish Beauty' by the ladies of Philadelphia, was a close friend of Anthony Wayne's and well acquainted with Washington as well. He was an able leader with a reputation of taking care of the welfare of his men. Diarist Joseph Plumb Martin described him as 'an excellent officer, much beloved and respected by the troops of the Line he belonged to."



The Brown and Blue stamps were the first issued, and the Blue continued to be issued from 1860 through 1862. The Blue is the most common, and the Brown is extremely scarce. The Green is by far the rarest, with only two recorded covers, six or seven used stamps off cover, and three unused stamps (two with original gum) known to us.


