

Noyes, No. Auburn, Maine, with internal July 1st manuscript as well as additional contents ". . . most particularly Crosby to John with the compliments of the season and his warmest congratulations upon the advent of the three cent stamps, and aint they nice!", minor bleached spots and slight wear around edges

VERY FINE. THIS IS THE ONLY RECORDED 3-CENT 1851 ORANGE BROWN FIRST DAY COVER FROM WASHINGTON CITY. IT IS ALSO ONE OF ONLY THREE FIRST DAY COVERS WITH CONTENTS REFERENCING THE NEW 1851 ISSUE.

Three new stamps were created for use starting on July 1, 1851, after a change in the postal rates — 1c, 3c and 12c. The basic rates became 1c for newspapers, circulars and drop letters (with an escalation for distance up until 1852), 3c for domestic letters sent up to 3,000 miles, and 6c for letters sent over 3,000 miles. The 1847 Issue was demonetized after July 1, 1851, when the new rates went into effect.

Of the 43 documented 3c 1851 First Days this example is especially desirable due to the contents and Washington City origin.

THIS IS THE EARLIEST DOCUMENTED USE OF THE 30-CENT 1861 ISSUE. A REMARKABLE ITEM, THIS DATE HAS STOOD AS THE EARLIEST DOCUMENTED USE FOR ALMOST 70 YEARS.

Dr. Martin seldom purchased EDU's. However, this 30c 1861 cover had a long history of being the EDU, and the August 20 date is very close to the date of distribution for the new 1861 Issue. It was once part of George B. Sloane's collection and appeared in an article in *Stamps Magazine* written by Sloane. Today, nearly 70 years later, it still remains the EDU.






A VERY FINE AND CELEBRATED COVER. THIS IS THE ONLY RECORDED FIRST DAY COVER OF THE ENTIRE 1890 "SMALL" BANK NOTE ISSUE.

This cover was formerly owned by Ed Siskin, who collaborated with Henry Scheuer for an article about the cover, published in the January/February 1979 issue of *First Days* (the publication of the American First Day Cover Society). Although many 1890 values were available at over 400 post offices, this is the only First Day to have surfaced. Today, 25 years after the article was written, it is still the only known First Day for the issue. Despite all the recent great name auctions and the tremendous growth of the First Day Cover Rarity market, no additional covers have come to light. Undervalued in Scott and Brookman at just \$20,000.00, this cover is destined to become one of the most important and valuable First Day Covers.



THE CELEBRATED "BURGER" SET OF TRUE FIRST DAY COVERS OF THE COLUMBIAN ISSUE, CANCELLED ON JANUARY 1, 1893, WHICH WAS A SUNDAY. THE ONLY KNOWN COMPLETE MATCHED SET OF JANUARY 1ST DUPLEX FIRST DAY COVERS AND THE HIGHLIGHT OF THE MARTIN COLLECTION.

January 1st was a Sunday and the first official day of release by the Post Office Department. However, since this was a Sunday, covers dated on Monday, January 2nd, are also considered First Days. These trade for and catalogue much less than the true Sunday First Days.

The only denominations known cancelled on Sunday, January 1st, are the 1c, 2c, 3c, 4c, 5c and 10c. Therefore, this remarkable group represents a complete set of January 1st First Day Covers. This is the only known complete matched set with duplex cancels. These same denominations, plus the 6c and \$2.00, are also known cancelled on Monday, January 2nd.

The other predated Columbian Issue covers include one other 1c, two of the 2c value and one of the 10c value. This is a storied cover that took much research to authenticate, but when the addressee, C. A. Lee, was discovered to be the Postmaster, it was certified as genuine. A fantastic cover and perfect mate for the Burger set offered in this sale.



Only fourteen First Days are documented for this issue, of which eight are on cover and six are on card. Of these, only two are to foreign destinations (the other to France). A must-have item for the Pan-American specialist and certainly one of the most important Pan-American FDC's in the Martin collection.

Effective January 1, 1913, fourth-class mail was expanded by adding the former second and third-class mails into a new Parcel Post system, and the new Parcel Post stamps were issued. Effective July 1, 1913, the Parcel Post stamps were authorized by the P.O. Department for use on First Class mail and re-released.

Although scores of First Days exist for the July 1 First Day for First Class usage, we have handled only a few January 1 First Days. Very few covers are known, especially with more than one denomination. Since these were used on fourth-class mail, most do not have a dated cancellation.

Brookman and Scott Catalogue do not list the January 1 usage. They list the more common July 1 date at \$5,000.00 and \$5,500.00, respectively. The only other comparable item we have sold was a 5c value (Q5) in McCusker Sale #110 (April 1998), which realized \$12,650...... E. 7,500-10,000


