### Welcome to the "November 2005" Postal History Sale

FOR THE PAST FOUR OR FIVE MONTHS, WE HAVE BEEN ASKED MANY TIMES when the November 2005 Postal History sale would be out. Some people asked a few times a month. Some stopped asking. A few stopped receiving an answer.

Well, here it is. Or we should say, here they are.

The one sale we envisioned for last November has actually grown into three distinct sales in separate catalogues: United States Postal History (Sale 906), Confederate States Postal History (Sale 907) and Carriers, Locals, Independent Mails and Western Expresses (Sale 908). The sales will be held from Monday, March 13, through Friday, March 17, the week of the ASDA Mega-Show in New York City.

The long delay and mammoth proportions of these sales are a paradox of cause and effect. The enormous Arthur White collection required a lot of time to prepare, and, while that was going on, more Postal History consignments kept coming in, which required even more time, allowing other consignments to sneak in past the deadline, until the concept of a deadline became a sort of joke around the office. (That run-on sentence symbolizes what happened to this sale).

Another factor delaying the production of these three catalogues was the material itself. A competent stamp describer can process up to 150 lots per day. Routine covers can be described at the rate of perhaps 60 per day. However, the lots in these sales required so much analysis, research and words, we spent at least 600 hours just writing the 2,500 descriptions. Because of my own propensity to obsess over historical details, yours truly probably had the lowest rate of production, a fact that was not lost on my more prolific colleague, John Zuckerman.

Seeing the final product, I am impressed by the remarkable diversity of the material in these sales. Almost every facet of U.S. and Confederate States Postal History is represented in this auction. Covers involving many different foreign countries will also be found among the trans-oceanic mail from the White collection.

Another extraordinary feature of these sales is the presence of archival material offered to the market for the first time. For example, the Confederate States sale contains covers addressed to Senator R. M. T. Hunter as a captive aboard a Federal gunboat and covers to Commodore Samuel Barron as a prisoner on Governor's Island and at Fort Warren. There are many, many more such "first time" offerings.

Then there are the covers on which we spent hours unlocking their significance. For example, there is the Bank Note cover to the Emperor of China, Guangxu, who at the time was just a boy, the adopted son and pawn of the Dowager Empress Cixi, a notorious figure in Chinese history. The front cover of this catalogue features another cover that required probing beneath the surface: the War Department entire to an Italian aristocrat, addressed in the hand of Commanding General William T. Sherman. Neither we nor the owner had any idea that Sherman addressed this cover until we researched the handwriting and dates.



- 1011 ⋈ Reprisal, Retaliatory, Restored and Treaty Rates, 1847-49. 36 covers on annotated exhibit pages in album, an extraordinary collection of mail from this significant chapter in transatlantic postal relations, Reprisal Period represented by 8/19/1847 sailing of the Cunarder Caledonia to Boston where letter was rated 7c due despite 1sh prepaid packet postage, continues with 9/4/1847 and 6/10/1848 sailings of Brittania to Boston, both 7c due; Retaliatory Period represented by 25 covers, beginning with 6/24/1848 sailing of Caledonia, the first westbound trip to be charged with the 24c Retaliatory rate (G.B. 1sh franking and huge red "24" applied at N.Y.), continues with 7/5/1848 first eastbound trip (Britannia), variety of "24", "29" and "34" U.S. rate handstamps, most stampless from England, also from Ireland, France and Gibraltar, some with G.B. frankings incl. very attractive combination of 1p, 2p and 1sh on cover from U.S. to Italy via England, last day cover from Trieste to U.S. via London; Restored Rates represented by three covers, beginning with 12/30/1848 first westbound voyage of America; finally, the Ú.S-G.B. Treaty Rate Period begins with first eastbound and westbound sailings of Niagara (2/21/1849) and America (2/24/1849) and concludes with three different 1849 sailings; values for covers are typically \$200-300 for Reprisal Rates, \$100-200 for Retaliatory Rates (\$500+ for first trips or unusual frankings), and \$200-300 for Restored Rates; therefore, the total value of this group if acquired one by one could easily exceed \$5,000, to which the tremendous value of Arthur White's research and copious notes must be added; this is a fantastic opportunity for anyone who has been intrigued by covers demonstrating the conflict between the U.S. and Great Britain over transatlantic packets....Not illustrated E. 3,000-4,000

According to *North Atlantic Mail Sailing 1840-75* (p. 45, footnote 69), the Galway Line's *Adriatic* was used by Cunard for this eastbound voyage.

The *Honolulu Advertiser* collection contained a pair on cover, used with a U.S. 5c stamp (applied in San Francisco on July 20, 1864). On that cover, the pair of Hawaiian stamps included 5c prepayment of United States postage, as the cover was marked with the "Honolulu Postage Paid" datestamp. The cover offered here was franked the same way, probably intending to pay postage to destination with the Hawaiian stamps. However, the postmaster in Honolulu did not use the "Honolulu Postage Paid" handstamp, either due to error or because he thought the letter was overweight. When it reached San Francisco, the postmaster there treated the U.S. postage as unpaid and so marked it with the "Ship 6" handstamp for 3c postage plus 3c penalty for non-prepayment.
