Conditions of Sale (Important—please read carefully)

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 15% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax or use tax which may be due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum final bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. In the absence of a reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is obviously incorrect, is returnable, but only if the lot is returned within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact with the original packing material. The following lots may not be returned for any reason: Lots containing ten or more items; lots from buyers who have registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults" or "defects" may not be returned because of any fault or defect. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within three days from the date of sale. The Galleries retain the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. Credit cards are not accepted as payment.

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within seven days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than thirty days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot accompanied by a certificate issued by The Philatelic Foundation within 5 years of the sale date or by Professional Stamp Experts since January 2004 is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that does not have a P.F. or P.S.E. certificate (dated as above) may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$500.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs.
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. Grading Terms, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Grade and Centering

The following terms are used in Siegel sale catalogues (corresponding numerical ranges shown in parentheses). Margin width, centering and gum are described according to generally-accepted standards. Stamps are graded based on our subjective assessment of condition for each issue, which do not necessarily correlate with third-party grading terms or standards for all issues. A lot may not be returned because a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated. Information from the P.S.E. Stamp Market Quarterly and P.S.E. Population ReportSM is the most current available, but lots may not be returned due to errors or changes in statistics or data.

Extremely Fine Gem (90-100 pts.): The term "Gem" used in Siegel catalogues describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue. **Extremely Fine (80-90 pts.):** Exceptionally large margins or near perfect centering.

Very Fine (70-85 pts.): Normal size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side. "Very Fine and choice" applies to stamps that have desirable traits such as rich color, sharp impression, freshness or clarity of cancel.

Fine (60-70): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (below 60): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Good (G) or Average (Ave.): Cut into or perfs far into design and usually with slight faults. This condition is generally acceptable for rarities, scarce multiples or stamps used on unusual covers.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the Scott Catalogue—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

Thurston Twigg-Smith and The Hawaiian Reprise

N NOVEMBER 1995 THE SIEGEL FIRM HELD THE HISTORY-MAKING AUCTION of *The Honolulu Advertiser* Collection, a five-day, 1,878-lot sale event that shattered records and dispersed what is still widely recognized as the greatest collection of a single country's stamps ever formed.


The *Advertiser* collection was an asset of Persis Corporation, the Honolulu-based holding company for a variety of properties owned by members of the Twigg-Smith family, descendants of the Reverend Asa Thurston and Lucy Thurston, who were among the first missionaries to arrive in Hawaii in 1820. Although owned by a corporation, the *Advertiser* collection was the product of its principal architect, Thurston Twigg-Smith ("Twigg"), the redoubtable collector of stamps and art whose achievements and contributions in both fields have been felt for nearly a half-century.

Twigg's reaction to selling his Hawaiian stamp collection could be summed up with a modified version of the old expression, "You can take the stamps away from the man, but you cannot take the man away from stamps." Even as Persis Corporation's philatelic assets were sold for the benefit of many shareholders, Twigg was reclaiming items for his personal collection of Hawaiian postal markings, covers and used Missionaries, Numerals and later issues. When the Charles J. Pietsch III collection came to market through Shreves less than a year later, Twigg enthusiastically bid for a large number of items, including rarities from the legendary Atherton collection which, let us say, had left the family's possession without their full consent (the matter was quietly settled after Twigg alerted the family to the problem). As recently as the 2006 Rumsey sale of Floyd Fitzpatrick's town markings collection, Twigg was hot in pursuit of items he felt were essential to his own formidable study of town markings.

Twigg turns 86 in August of this year. Despite robust health and his still-burning desire to collect stamps, Twigg has decided to balance his proclivity to amass great numbers of stamps (and works of art) with prudent steps to simply his assets. Therefore, this auction represents "The Hawaiian Reprise," the dispersal of the Twigg-Smith collection of Hawaiian stamps and postal history.

The sale has been structured in two parts. The first part (lots 4001-4399) follows the traditional philatelic outline of stamps by issue, but of course there are many outstanding cancellations and covers in addition to the basic stamps and rarities. The second part (lots 4400-4771) presents postal history categories, including a large selection from the extraordinary collection of Hawaiian town postmarks (lots 4454-4771). The town postmarks have been grouped by island and arranged alphabetically by town name. The index on page 150 lists every represented post office by name, island and lot number, which will be helpful to bidders looking for specific town postmarks.

Throughout this sale catalogue, we have made liberal use of the information provided by Fred Gregory through his website, *Post Office in Paradise*, located at www.hawaiianstamps.com. The Gregory website is without question the greatest source of current information about Hawaiian stamps and postal history. Without it, this catalogue would have been significantly less informative, because much of the published literature (Meyer-Harris, etc.) contains outdated information. We thank



Fred for his permission to draw extensively from his database, and we encourage anyone interested in Hawaiian philately to visit www.hawaiianstamps.com

As a final word about the sale, we wish to acknowledge the work and dedication of Twigg's philatelic curator, Mary M. Mitsuda. Before and after the *Advertiser* sale, Mary diligently scanned and inventoried items in the collection. She also ensured that the material was organized and preserved according to archivists' standards. As an accomplished artist living on Oahu, Mary has proven to be a great contributor to Hawaiian philately without really being a stamp collector herself.

THE THURSTON TWIGG-SMITH COLLECTION OF HAWAIIAN STAMPS AND POSTAL HISTORY

1851-52 MISSIONARY ISSUE

4001° 1851, 2c Blue (1). Type II, a superb-appearing example with rich color and impression, large margins on all sides showing portions of framelines from adjoining stamps at left (space between two clichés) and right (gutter between impressions), cancelled by large circular grid of squares (Type 6). With respect to condition, we quote Herbert A. Bloch's description of this stamp in the 1957 Caspary sale: "A piece at top, which was torn off when the stamp was found, has been replaced in its original position without any repair in the philatelic sense of the word. Despite this fault a magnificent copy of this classic world rarity..."

EXTREMELY FINE APPEARANCE. ONE OF THE FINEST-APPEARING EXAMPLES OF THE 1851 2-CENT MISSIONARY. ONLY FIFTEEN EXAMPLES OF THIS WORLD-RENOWNED RARITY ARE RECORDED, OF WHICH TEN ARE AVAILABLE OUTSIDE MUSEUMS

The fifteen examples of the 2c Missionary in our census (see catalogue for *Honolulu Advertiser* sale, Siegel Sale 769, Appendix I) include five stamps now held by museums and only two sound copies, one of which is unused. Both sound stamps were offered in the *Honolulu Advertiser* sale, and the used copy was acquired by the National Postal Museum. The stamp offered here has the widest margins of any recorded 2c Missionary and is essentially intact, without any paper restoration or painting in of the design. The light cancel and large margins all around make it one of the most beautiful 2c Missionary stamps extant and certainly one of the finest used copies available to collectors, all of which have faults or repairs to a degree.

This 2c Missionary was in an old leather notebook brought to Ezra Cole in New York City, circa 1935. His account of the discovery states: "This stamp was found by a lawyer friend of my father's in Brooklyn. It was in a small old red leather notebook. There were several other inexpensive stamps with it and this 2c Missionary was actually in two pieces...I took the notebook and the stamp up to my friend, Percy Doane, in the Tribune Building and inquired as to the genuineness of the stamp for I had never seen one. He told me that it was genuine and valuable and it could be sold even in its present condition. At some time later on, I sold it to Burger Brothers for \$4,500. They, in turn, sold it to A. H. Caspary. I never did learn how much Caspary paid for it." In the Caspary sale, the stamp realized \$5,250. It was subsequently acquired by Alfred J. Ostheimer III, whose collection helped form the basis of the *Honolulu Advertiser* collection.

A FINE-APPEARING EXAMPLE OF THE LEGENDARY HAWAIIAN 1851 2-CENT MISSIONARY, ONE OF PHILATELY'S RAREST STAMPS. THIS 2-CENT MISSIONARY IS THE ONLY ONE OF THE FIFTEEN KNOWN EXAMPLES BEARING THE RARE CROSSED-BARS CANCEL.

Fifteen 2c Missionary stamps are recorded, including the unique unused stamp and the unique cover. Of the thirteen used copies, five are in museums, leaving eight used off-cover stamps available to collectors (including one on piece). None of the eight available used copies is entirely sound. This example, with its relatively minor repairs, is one of the finer-appearing examples of this rare stamp. It is the only 2c Missionary with the Crossed Bars cancel, which is also known on three 5c and two 13c (Scott 3) Missionaries.

This 2c Missionary is first recorded as having been owned by dealer William P. Brown, who sold it to Count Philippe de la Renotiere von Ferrary in 1872 for \$25. At the fourth Ferrary sale in 1922 the stamp was purchased by Arthur Hind for the equivalent of \$8,750. Hind also acquired the unique British Guiana 1c Magenta stamp at the Ferrary sales. After passing to Admiral Harris and Maurice Burrus, this stamp was acquired by Thurston Twigg-Smith, who sold it privately to Christian Aall, then bought it back when the Aall collection was sold by the Siegel firm in 1998 (Sale 805).

The Crossed Bars cancel is found with and without the surrounding circle on one 2c, three 5c and two 13c (Scott 3) Missionaries. One additional cancelled stamp has been added to our census published in the *Honolulu Advertiser* sale, bringing the total number of 5c Missionaries to 62 (including 40 used off cover or on piece).

4004° **1851, 5c Blue (2).** Type II, clear to ample margins with framelines complete all around, rich color, bold 7-bar grid cancel (Type 7), short sealed tear at bottom, the stamp is otherwise free of faults and has not been repaired in any sense of the word

EXCEPTIONALLY FINE CONDITION FOR A HAWAIIAN MISSIONARY STAMP AND A CHOICE EXAMPLE OF THE 5-CENT TYPE II SHOWING THE SMALL-SIZE "N" IN "CENTS"

Of the 62 5c Missionaries recorded in our updated census (see *Honolulu Advertiser* catalogue, Siegel Sale 769, Appendix I), only thirteen off-cover stamps are available to collectors without repairs or serious defects, including ten used examples. This stamp shows the distinctive small "n" in "Cents", a font characteristic of all genuine Type II 5c Missionary stamps, which indicates this value was the first setting of the Missionary printings (the other values show the "n" in the correct size).

Our updated census of 13c "Hawaiian Postage" Missionaries (Scott 3) contains a total of 72 examples on or off cover. There are now 53 cancelled off-cover stamps, including the two genuine stamps from the Grinnell family's "Card of 10." Ten examples of Scott 3 are cancelled by the red Honolulu datestamp ("Hawaiian-Islands" or "U.S. Postage Paid").

There are 52 examples of the 13c "H.I. & U.S. Postage" Missionary in our updated census (see *Honolulu Advertiser* catalogue, Siegel Sale 769, Appendix I). Only 35 used stamps are recorded off cover or on piece, and about two-thirds of these are repaired or in museum collections. Of those unrepaired copies that remain in private hands, only two sound examples are recorded: the stamp offered here and the cut-in, slightly toned example, ex Potts, Moody and Krug (Census No. 4-II-CAN-176). Thus, for the collector of sound used classics, this is a rarity among rarities.

Our census records nine covers bearing Scott No. 4. Of these, two are in museums. Of the seven covers available to collectors, only the cover to Persia and one other (to Boston, currently in a European collection) are free from defects or repairs. The example offered here, with its small expert repair, ranks as one of the finest-appearing covers.

A FINE AND RARE USE OF THE 1853 5-CENT KAMEHAMEHA III FIRST PRINTING ON COVER TO THE EASTERN UNITED STATES WITH 12 CENTS DUE (TRANS-CONTINENTAL RATE PLUS SHIP CAPTAIN'S FEE).

This letter and cover were sent from Lahaina to Honolulu and from there on the *Flying Dart*, which cleared on Oct. 13 and arrived in San Francisco on Nov. 12, 1855. The postage components on this cover reflect an interesting change in U.S. rates before and after April 1, 1855. The U.S. over-3,000 miles prepaid rate was raised from 6c to 10c beginning on April 1, 1855 (and prepayment was made compulsory for letters posted in the U.S.). Therefore, prior to April 1, the prepaid postage charges on a letter from Hawaii to the eastern U.S. were 5c Hawaiian plus 8c U.S. (6c prepaid plus 2c ship captain's fee). If sent collect, the U.S. postage was 12c (10c unpaid rate plus 2c ship captain's fee). From April 1 on, the U.S. postage on Hawaiian letters was 12c, whether or not it was prepaid, despite the compulsory prepayment requirement for letters of U.S. origin. This cover and the cover in lot 4015 show the subtle distinction. While both are marked "Ship" and "12" cents due, the one sent prior to April 1855 was rated at the 10c unpaid rate (vs. 6c prepaid), while this cover was 12c due without penalty for non-prepayment.

The Gregory census contains just six examples of the 13c Kamehameha III stamp used by itself — without any secondary franking — on covers dated prior to the United States April 1855 rate change. This rate change effectively increased the Hawaiian rate to the U.S. East Coast from 13c to 17c, thereby destroying the purpose for which this stamp was originally created. During the period from May 1853 until April 1855, the practice of affixing United States stamps to Hawaiian mail became more regular. Only two of the six sole-usage 13c covers have the stamp tied by any marking.

Although the Scott Catalogue values 13c mixed-franking covers more highly than this single franking, it is well-known among specialists that this usage is far rarer than any other. In fact, the Meyer-Harris book illustrates this cover on page 29 and states (p. 31): "Since the custom of adding United States stamps was begun very soon after the "Boston Engraved" issue came into use, covers with a 13c engraved and without any United States stamps are even rarer than 'Missionary' covers."

A FINE AND EXTREMELY RARE FRANKING, COMBINING BOTH KAMEHAMEHA III ISSUES AFTER THE APRIL 1855 RATE CHANGE RENDERED OBSOLETE THE 13-CENT'S ORIGINAL PURPOSE

Following the United States rate change, effective April 1, 1855, the 13c Kamehameha III stamp could no longer prepay the full rate from Hawaii to the U.S. East Coast, which increased from 13c to 17c. In consequence the patrons of Hawaii's postal system began using 5c stamps plus 12c U.S. stamps, or 13c stamps plus 4c cash, or, in this case, 5c and 13c stamps together. Whether the last franking method involved overpayment, or the 13c stamps were sold for 12c each, has never been clearly established, though written official communications indicate that at times the 13c stamps were sold for reduced rates. Surviving covers with such combinations — at least six of which are recorded — all originate at Hilo, but other outlying offices might also have forwarded letters to Honolulu with similar frankings.

During the period dating from April 1855 it was already a regular practice to affix U.S. postage stamps to outbound letters on which the U.S. rate had been prepaid. This is a remarkable example of a fully-prepaid letter, to which no U.S. stamps were affixed. The red San Francisco datestamp with "Paid 12" confirms that the letter never carried U.S. stamps.

Five of the nineteen 5c provisional covers recorded by Gregory were carried on this trip of the *Vaquero*, which stopped at Honolulu on its way from Australia and carried two bags of mail when it cleared Honolulu on June 27, 1857. She returned to safe harbor with a broken mast and left again on June 29 with additional mail, arriving in San Francisco on July 16 (Gregory).

A biography of the addressee, Deacon Obahiah Mead, is provided in the genealogical work, *One Life at a Time: A New World Family Narrative*, 1630-1960, by R. Thomas Collins (a Google search will locate the information).

This cover was carried on the *Comet*, which cleared Honolulu on Jan. 24, 1860, arriving in San Francisco on Feb. 10. In 1859 the U.S. post office began forwarding mail from San Francisco by the Butterfield stage service to St. Louis via Los Angeles unless the letter was specifically marked "Via Panama". The "Overland" handstamp appears to have been applied as an explanatory marking.

Gregory reports 50 covers with the 5c Third Printing (Scott 9), but only 15 are covers with this stamp used alone (not in combination with U.S. stamps). Only one other is addressed to San Francisco, and the cover offered here is the only one with the "Due 6" straightline. It was carried on the *Comet*, clearing Honolulu on Jan. 21, 1864, arriving in San Francisco on Feb. 9. Regarding the U.S. rate on mail to the port of San Francisco during the period from Aug. 30, 1863, to Aug. 23, 1864, Gregory states: "Collect mail to San Francisco addressees should have been rated at the normal double domestic rate, or $6 \, \varepsilon$. Surviving collect letters from Hawaii for San Francisco addressees show some were rated at $6 \, \varepsilon$ due and others at $4 \, \varepsilon$ due with no apparent pattern."

In our records (and this sale) there is a cover front from the Catholic Mission correspondence with an 1863 1c Numeral (see lot 4076), but we do not know of another complete cover with any of the 1c Numeral issues, which were intended for inter-island newspapers and saw very limited use. This cover is properly franked for the 5c Hawaiian rate and originated in Hilo, based on the use of the black square grid in 1866.

When found, the left edge of the cover had been cut off and the bottom was roughly opened. The left 10mm of the envelope and part of another 2c stamp have been added to improve the appearance. The bottom edge has been reduced slightly for the same reason. There is some minor toning, but overall the cover is quite attractive and the 1c Numeral is Extremely Fine. Viewed from the back of the address panel, embossment from the corner of the strongly impressed grid can be seen behind the 1c stamp, confirming that the stamp originated on this cover.

Confusion over which rates applied to mail from Hawaii started in 1864 in what Gregory classifies as the "Error Rate Sub-Periods" of the Late Treaty Period (go to www.hawaiianstamps.com/latetreatyerror.html for an in-depth explanation of events and covers). According to Gregory, this cover is one of three known from the mail that left Honolulu on November 23, 1864. Gregory states: "Only one mail shipment, by the A. A. Eldridge, was sent before Honolulu learned the $10\mathfrak{e}$ rate was rescinded for Hawaiian mail. Three covers are reported from that sailing of the A. A. Eldridge. One is shown above, bearing $10\mathfrak{e}$ United States postage. Another was sent collect (see Advertiser lot 3056 [the cover offered here]). By the time the A. A. Eldridge reached San Francisco, that office had reverted to the 1863 rate, so the collect cover was unaffected by the error. The third cover was sent through the United States to Europe (illustrated at Tows, lot 58; Siegel auction #397, lot 505; and Letters of Gold, p. 144)."

The unusual manuscript postmark on the 2c stamp, which presumably was applied to pay the inter-island rate, is probably an abbreviation for "Makawao Plantation Post Office." Makawao was an early plantation town on Maui, site of the East Maui Plantation. Although markings are not recorded this early, the office was in operation, and in March 1864 the Honolulu office sent out \$10.00 worth of the 2c Boston Lithographs, but only \$1.00 of 5c stamps (Numerals) and \$1.00 of U.S. stamps.

The Official set depicting Lorrin A. Thurston, grandfather of Thurston Twigg-Smith and proponent of annexation, was issued on January 28, 1897. When use of this issue was discontinued on August 12, 1898, nearly half the original printing of 10,000 was still on hand, with many of those sold going directly to dealers and collectors (later, stamps were cancelled to order to prevent their unauthorized use). Despite the numerous philatelic mailings of later Hawaiian issues, the Officials appear to have been neglected. This, combined with the small printings and light use of the high values in a very narrow time frame, accounts for the rarity of the 25c Official on cover.


King Kamehameha V, the former Prince Lot Kamehameha, assumed the throne in 1863 after the unexpected death of his brother, Kamehameha IV. He was the last ruler of the Kamehameha dynasty. Ferdinand W. Hutchison, a British national, was appointed court physician in 1863, and, in 1865, he became Minister of the Interior. Hutchison later served as supervisor of the Board of Health and was active in efforts to treat leprosy.

Covers from Kamehameha V are known with a "K" and "KV" frank. It is not known whether any of the known the free franks and addresses, which vary slightly, were written by Kamehameha V himself or by a court secretary.
