Information for Bidders

Bidding

The following means are available for placing bids:

- 1) Attending the Live Auction in Person: All bidders must register for a paddle, and new bidders must provide references at least three business days in advance of the sale.
- **2) Live Internet Bidding:** Instructions for participating as a Live Internet Bidder are provided on the page opposite.
- **3) Phone Bidding:** Bidders can be connected to the sale by phone and bid through a member of staff. Requests for phone bidding are subject to approval (please contact our office at least 24 hours before the sale). A signed Bid Form is required.
- **4) Absentee Bids.** All bids received in advance of the sale, either by mail, fax, phone, e-mail or internet, are Absentee Bids, which instruct the auctioneer to bid up to a specific amount on one or more lots in the sale. Absentee Bids sent by phone, fax or e-mail should arrive at least one hour prior to the start of the sale session. Bids entered through Live Internet Bidding will be visible to the auctioneer during the sale. Written bids should be entered legibly on the Bid Form in the sale catalogue. E-mail and internet bids should be carefully typed and double-checked. All new bidders must provide references. We recommend calling or e-mailing to confirm that Absentee Bids sent by mail, fax or e-mail have been received and entered.

Pre-Sale Viewing

Subject to availability, certain lots (except group lots) can be sent to known clients for examination. Requests must be made no later than 7 days prior to the sale. Lots must be returned on the day received. Postage/insurance costs will be invoiced.

In addition to regular viewing, clients may view lots by appointment. Our staff will be pleased to answer questions or provide additional information about lots.

Expert Certification

Individual items offered without a current certificate (PF dated within the past five years of sale; PSE dated January 2004 or later) may be purchased subject to independent certification of genuineness and our description. Please refer to the Conditions of Sale and Grading Terms for policies governing certification.

Shipping and Delivery

Procedures and charges for shipping lots are printed on the back of the Bid Form. Bidders are responsible for all prescribed shipping charges and any applicable sales tax or customs duties.

Price Realized



Conditions of Sale (please read carefully before bidding)

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 15% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax, use tax or customs duties due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for the failure to execute such bids or for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. If there is no reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Subject to the exclusions listed in 5(A), the Galleries will accept the return of lots which have been misidentified or which have obvious faults that were present when the lot was in the Galleries' custody, but not so noted in the lot description. All disputed lots must be received by the Galleries intact with the original packing material within 5 days of delivery to the buyer but no later than 30 days from the sale date. (5A) EXCLUSIONS: The following lots may not be returned for any reason: lots containing 10 or more items; lots from buyers who registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults," "defects" or a specific fault may not be returned because of any secondary fault. Photographed lots may not be returned because of centering, margins, short/nibbed perforations or other factors shown in the illustrations. Lots may not be returned for any of the following reasons: the color of the item does not match the color reproduction in the sale catalogue or website listing; the description contains inaccurate information about the quantity known or reported; or a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within 3 days from the date of sale. The Galleries retains the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash

for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. **Credit cards are not accepted as payment.**

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within 7 days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than 30 days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot accompanied by a certificate issued by The Philatelic Foundation within 5 years of the sale date or by Professional Stamp Experts since January 2004 is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not **limited to a contrary certificate of opinion.** Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that does not have a P.F. or P.S.E. certificate (dated as above) may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$600.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs. Buyers outside the U.S. are responsible for all customs duties.
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of New York.

Grades, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Grades and Centering

Our descriptions contain detailed information and observations about each item's condition. We have also assigned grades to stamps and covers, which reflect our subjective assessment. For stamps, the margin width, centering and gum are described and graded according to generally-accepted standards (an approximate correlation to numeric grades is provided at right). Although we believe our grades are accurate, they are not always exactly aligned with third-party grading terms or standards for all issues. A lot may not be returned because a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description. Information from the P.S.E. Stamp Market Quarterly and P.S.E. Population Report^{5M} is the most current available, but lots may not be returned due to errors or changes in statistics or data.

Extremely Fine Gem (90-100): The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue. This term is equivalent to "Superb" used by grading services.

Extremely Fine (80-90): Exceptionally large/wide margins or near perfect centering.

Very Fine (70-85): Normal-size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side. "Very Fine and choice" applies to stamps that have desirable traits such as rich color, sharp impression, freshness or clarity of cancel.

Fine (60-70): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (below 60): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the *Scott Catalogue*—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.



Ray Vogel and His Collections

RAY VOGEL COLLECTED MORE THAN STAMPS AND COVERS. HE COLLECTED stories and friendships. His love of a good cover was exceeded only by his love of family and friends—and perhaps matched by his love of a good meal. After retiring from the building business in the Chicago area very early in life, Ray devoted himself to his hobbies and interests, among which philately ranked highest. He spent 50 years acquiring items, making friends and supporting his Collectors Club of Chicago.



Ray formed a number of collections —he called them his "12's and 15's" (12¢ and 15¢ 1861-68 Issues), "1¢ 51-57's" (1¢ 1851-56 Imperforate and 1¢ Perforated Plate 1 Late stamps), "Famous People" (covers addressed to famous Americans), "French Eagles" (French Colonies Eagle type general issues on covers), "Samoa Mixed Frankings" (Samoa Express and Palm Tree mixed frankings with U.S. stamps) and "Large Dues" (U.S. Large Postage Due covers). Until the last week of his long and vibrant life, Ray was bidding and buying items for his collections.

The invention of the copier allowed Ray to keep a set of binders with copies of his collection at home, while his treasures were safe in a bank vault. A visit to Ray's home

inevitably led to a sit-down with his photocopies and a storytelling session about his acquisitions. Ray knew his rates and routes, his 1¢ 1851-57 types and plates, and the nuances of postal history rarities. But even more than that, he enjoyed talking about the people who had owned great collections, the dealers and auctioneers who sold him material, and the collector friends he knew over decades in philately.

One of the collectors Ray never knew personally, but revered nonetheless, was Judge Robert S. Emerson, whose U.S. collection was sold in a series of auctions held by Daniel F. Kelleher during the first half of the 20th Century. Ray always said, "Every item I've ever seen that Emerson owned was a beauty." One ex-Emerson item Ray always wanted and never had a chance to buy was a superb 1¢ 1851 Position 99R2 tied by blue "Balto. Paid" on cover. He never did learn where that cover is today.

Ray loved to tell stories about his collector friends from Chicago. One of his favorite stories involved Paul Rohloff, whose collections of U.S. $5\mathfrak{C}$ stamps, territorials, Waterbury fancy cancels and Jamaica were legendary. One evening Ray was present while Rohloff was arranging his $5\mathfrak{C}$ covers for an exhibit. Rohloff spread all of the covers out on the floor of his home, and stood over them with a Manhattan in his hand. At one point his cocktail splashed out of the glass and onto a cover. Rohloff picked up the cover, shook it off and deadpanned, "Don't worry, it adds character."

"It's an innocent little stamp" (or cover) is one way Ray liked to describe an item that he especially admired. For Ray, condition was paramount. Great color, sharp impression, a neat cancel and always four margins were his standards. He allowed covers with faults or small repairs admission to his 12¢ and 15¢ collection, because he felt that the postal history aspects were more important, but he was always discriminating in his acquisitions and rejected many more items than he accepted.

Ray could also be tough on people he thought were not "straight shooters," but he was also the most generous and loyal friend anyone could have. One person in philately whom Ray adored and held in the highest esteem was Robert A. Siegel. The two were close buddies and palled around stamp shows for years. When I joined Bob Siegel in business, Ray adopted me. His loyalty, support and sage advice were always there for me.

This sale is the first of two to bring Ray's collections to market. It is difficult to accept that the items in those binders will leave Ray's domain, but that is the cycle of collecting, and Ray would enjoy knowing that his "innocent little" items will bring so much joy to other collectors.



The cover was carried on the COMSS steamer *Ajax*, departing Honolulu on June 23, 1870, and arriving in San Francisco on July 4 (http://hawaiianstamps.com/latetreaty.html).

The meaning of the "2" markings on transit mail via San Francisco has only recently been explained. Research by Richard Frajola and reiterated by Michael Laurence in his recently-published book on 10c 1869 covers (pages 305-307) proves that the 2c credit was required by the 1868 U.S. Postal Convention with Great Britain on each letter originating outside the United States and addressed to the United Kingdom. The 2c credit markings are found on covers originating in Japan and sent via the San Francisco exchange office (from there the mail passed through New York in closed bags). However, the application of this credit on mail originating in Hawaii is extremely unusual. A similar cover-front from Hawaii to England, carried on the same sailing and also bearing the "2" credit marking, was offered in our Sale 784 (lot 2215).







THE DR. HENRY C. ANGELL CORRESPONDENCE

Dr. Henry C. Angell was an optometrist who spent a considerable amount of time in Europe. Covers are known sent to him in France, Italy, England, Germany and Austria, plus a very few forwarded to other destinations. He was an art collector and undoubtedly appreciated the wide variety of Civil War patriotic envelopes mailed to him while he travelled abroad. In a *New York Times* article (March 6, 1897), Dr. Angell's name is mentioned in connection with the loan of seven works of art to an exhibition in Boston at Copley Hall, including two works by Corot.

THE DR. HENRY C. ANGELL CORRESPONDENCE

Dr. Henry C. Angell was an optometrist who spent a considerable amount of time in Europe. Covers are known sent to him in France, Italy, England, Germany and Austria, plus a very few forwarded to other destinations. He was an art collector and undoubtedly appreciated the wide variety of Civil War patriotic envelopes mailed to him while he travelled abroad. In a *New York Times* article (March 6, 1897), Dr. Angell's name is mentioned in connection with the loan of seven works of art to an exhibition in Boston at Copley Hall, including two works by Corot.

At the time of our nation's founding, it was thought that the Southern colonies, with their heavy economic reliance on slavery, would not join the new nation if slavery were abolished and all men (including slaves) were free and equal. Many Northern colonies pushed for abolishing slavery and some prominent Southern politicians recognized the dichotomy, but in the end unity of the fledgling nation took precedence over the freedom of slaves. This was the great piece of unfinished business of the Revolutionary War era. This issue would show itself at different times over the next 80 years, until its culmination in the event that would again divide the nation — the Civil War.

The cover offered here incorporates this historical theme. Washington is shown at left as the standard-bearer of freedom of 1776 and the undisputed icon of the Revolutionary War in both the North and South. On the right is a Zouave soldier, carrying on the same tradition in 1861. Zouaves were volunteers who adopted the name and dress of French North African regiments of the same name. The tradition of the volunteer militia so instrumental to the success of the Revolutionary War is another theme reflected in this cover. Interestingly, the words "The Present" under the Zouave were crossed out.

He established a stamp dealership in Brussels and gained worldwide recognition as the first professional philatelist. Moens published a guide for collectors in 1862, six years before this cover was mailed to him from New York. The use of the Lincoln memorial stamp on this Grant campaign envelope cannot be coincidence in this case. It was almost certainly a "philatelic souvenir" created for Moens and retained by him.





This cover was mailed in April 1869, just six weeks after Ulysses S. Grant took the oath of office and Orville E. Babcock was appointed to be his personal secretary.

Free franking privileges were not abolished until 1873 (also during Grant's administration). Official correspondence to foreign consuls was frequently sent without postage in diplomatic pouches handled through the State Department. Some letters were mailed through normal postal channels, as in this case. The treaty rate to France was 15c until the end of 1869. As far as we are aware, this is the only example of the 15c Lincoln sent from the White House. It seems to be more than coincidence that President Grant's secretary used a stamp picturing the martyred President Lincoln's image.


Orville E. Babcock, a Union officer who served as aide-de-camp to General Grant during the war, became President Grant's personal secretary in 1869. In 1875 Babcock was cleared of charges in the Whiskey Ring scandal, thanks in large part to Grant's personal testimony, but Babcock's connection to various nefarious activities caused Grant to distance himself from his former secretary after the Whiskey Ring trial... This remarkable cover was the subject a *Chronicle* article by George Hargest in August 1972 (No. 75, pp 151-153). In the article, he notes that during this time the Papal States were not yet a part of the Kingdom of Italy. Uprisings, led in part by Garibaldi, had reduced their territory to Rome and a narrow strip of coastline which also contained the port of Civitavecchia. Napoleon III of France sent a contingent to help protect Papal interests. A majority of mail sent during this time was fully prepaid to destination and sent via French Mail. The Bremen-Hamburg route was only in existence from February 1, 1867, until January 1, 1868. It was compulsory that letters sent by this route be prepaid by stamps, with the final postage to destination collected from the recipient. In 1870, at the start of the Franco-Prussian War, the French troops were called home and after a short battle the remaining Papal States territory was incorporated into Italy.

Hargest also quotes from the *U.S. Mail and Post Office Assistant* for March 1867, which discusses the general state of affairs of the Italian postal system: "But, with all these improvements, the postal system of Italy is still very far behind the English and American systems... Our clerks could hardly, with impunity, fail to find a pile of letters of letters that had been in the office for many weeks, or to destroy others for the sake of making a stamp album. They do so in Italy yet. It is rather desirable to be forewarned that a rare American stamp on a letter will probably ensure its being stopped by the post office. Report says the wives of certain postmasters in Italy have the richest albums in Europe."

Rome at this point was still part of the Papal States, defended in part by French troops and not yet incorporated into the Kingdom of Italy. The most common route for mail from the U.S. to Rome was via French Mail. The cover offered here is the subject of an article by George Hargest in *Chronicle* No. 45. At the time of mailing, Baltimore was an exchange office for some foreign mails. This letter was routed through New York where it went by Closed Mail via England to Ostend, then by the travelling post office from Verviers to Cologne, where the bag was opened and an accounting was made. It was then likely exchanged with the Italian railway post office that carried the letter to Rome.

The 42c postage pays the double 21c rate to Italy by French Mail, and the stamps were cancelled at the New York foreign-mail exchange office with the Union Soldier's Head fancy cancellation. This is reportedly the only known example of the 12c 1861 on cover with this fancy cancel. Its creation and use in 1866 coincided with the return of soldiers from the Civil War. It is known on at least one domestic cover, but apparently the cancelling device migrated to the foreign-mail exchange office, where it was used to cancel stamps on mail to foreign countries. This explains why it is found on high values of the 1861-66 Issue, including the 10c, 12c, 15c, 24c, 30c and 90c denomination stamps off cover. Covers with this cancel are very rare, probably because European stamp collectors removed the high-value stamps from covers.



THE PIERCE CORRESPONDENCE

In 1855 the addressee, Josiah Pierce, was appointed by President Franklin Pierce to be secretary of the legation of the United States at St. Petersburg, Russia. He resigned his position in 1858 to become part of a syndicate of businessmen (under the name Winans, Harrison & Winans) who were building and equipping railroads in Russia, particularly between Moscow and St. Petersburg. Sometime after 1866 Pierce re-established his residence in London, where he was the legal representative of this firm. In recognition of his services to Russia, Pierce was made a knight of the order of St. Anne by Alexander II in October 1865 (source: Google Books, Bowdoin College obituaries).







THE GOODHUE CORRESPONDENCE

The addressee, Albert P. Goodhue, was a ship chandler and businessman from Salem, Massachusetts. He is probably related to Benjamin Goodhue, who served in the state senate from 1784-89 and then as Massachusetts representative in the first U.S. congress. Benjamin was a commercial merchant instrumental in establishing many of this country's revenue laws, and his son, Jonathan, was a prominent commercial merchant.



The background of the U.S. Flagship *Delaware* (formerly the U.S.S. *Piscataqua*) and the addressee, John F. Bingham, is summarized in an article by Richard B. Graham in the *Chronicle* 75 (August 1972), from which we quote (with minor edits and deletions): "The U.S.S. *Piscataqua* was launched on June 11, 1866, and first placed in commission on October 21, 1867. She was a screw steamer, 2400 tons, ship rigged, with 20 nine-inch smoothbore guns — similar in appearance and armament to Civil War naval ships such as Admiral Farragut's *Hartford*. On December 16, 1867, the *Piscataqua* left New York for the Far East, arriving at Singapore on April 18, 1868. On May 15, 1869, her name was changed to U.S.S. *Delaware*, as one of several U. S. Navy ship name changes taking place on that date at the Navy Department in Washington... the *Delaware* left Singapore for home on August 23, 1870, reached New York on November 19, 1870, and was placed out of commission on December 5, 1870. This was the only voyage ever made by the *Delaware*, which was broken up in 1877. John F. Bingham was a 2nd Ass't Engineer, assigned to the *Piscataqua* on September 30, 1867, and detached from her, after she returned home, on November 26, 1870."

This cover was sent in July 1870 and addressed in care of the American consul at Cape Town, in order to catch Bingham as the *Delaware* returned by way of the Cape. Based on the receipt docketing, it appears that the timing worked perfectly.

The majority of mail sent from the U.S. to India during this time period was addressed to either major port cities, such as Bombay, or to centers of commerce, such as Calcutta. Surviving covers also come from large correspondences, such as that to Rev. Bissell in Ahmednuggur. The most common way for mail to be carried was by British Mail or via England. The rate via Southampton was 33c and paid postage all the way to the destination. Alternatively, 5c could be prepaid to place a letter on an outbound ship, and the balance would be collected from the recipient. A third frequently-used method was to pay the 21c rate to England by American Packet, and the rest would be collected from the recipient (see lot 2251). One of the rarest mail routes to India was via Prussian Closed Mail, as demonstrated by this cover.

The sender's directive on this cover specified that it should go via Southampton. A postal clerk noted that the weight exceeded ½ oz., and changed the instructions so that it would be sent by Prussian Closed Mail. It is unclear when the 72c postage was applied, since it corresponds to the double 36c Prussian Closed Mail rate, but not the single or double rate via Southampton. E. 3,000-4,000



The Bissell correspondence is described in great detail in the 1953 American Philatelic Congress book. Reverend Lemuel Bissell arrived in India in 1851 and was based in Sirur. He moved to Ahmednuggur in 1861 and in 1865 became the missionary secretary. The Bissell correspondence covers the period from early 1868 to late 1875. Virtually all Bissell covers were sent from the Board of Foreign Missions of the Congregational Christian Church in Boston. The correspondence probably comes from Reverend Bissell's time as mission secretary, and the multiple rates were necessitated by the inclusion of lengthy letters and remittances in the pre-addressed envelopes. The franking on the cover offered here pays the quadruple 28c rate to India by British Mail via Southampton.

This is the only recorded use of the 90c 1861 Issue on a cover to India from *any* correspondence. A census of 90c 1861-68 covers by Herzog and Starnes in the *Chronicle* 140 (November 1988) confirms this statement.



THE STAMPS WERE THEN AFFIXED IN NEW YORK AND IT WAS RE-POSTED, BUT THIS TIME BY BRITISH MAIL VIA SOUTHAMPTON.

We were generously assisted in the analysis of the story of this cover by the pre-eminent transatlantic mail specialist, Richard F. Winter. It seems likely that the original postage of 28c was paid in cash. Beneath the stamps is manuscript that appears to confirm this, and payment using stamps was not compulsory for foreign-bound letters at this time. The letter was then routed through New York and carried aboard the HAPAG Borussia to Southampton and then by closed mail to Aachen. At this point the letter was returned to New York because full prepayment of the 36c Prussian Closed Mail rate was compulsory. After receiving the returned letter, the New York office applied 36c in stamps, probably after receiving additional postage from Rockland. However, the New York office changed the route to the more frequently used British Mail via Southampton. The letter then left New York for the second time on the Cunarder Cuba, which departed December 29. It passed through Southampton, London, Alexandria, Suez, Bombay and Calcutta before making its way to Burma.

In his analysis, Richard Winter also notes that he has never seen a Prussian Closed Mail cover sent via Trieste to the East Indies. Neither have we, and this partly-completed trip may be the closest one will ever get...... E. 5,000-7,500



THE PHILIPPINES

THE GEORGE H. PEIRCE CORRESPONDENCE

George H. Peirce came to the Philippines from New England as a 19-year old clerk in the firm of Peele, Hubbell & Company. By 1862 he was responsible for buying one-third of all the abaca exported from the Philippines. In 1868 he became a partner in the firm. The Peirce correspondence began to leak out into the marketplace in the 1980's, and in 1994 the auction sale of 29 Peirce covers, under the name "The Manila Find," was held by H. R. Harmer of New York.

According to the Webb book, the sorting of mail on board ship was first tried in 1857 and was found to speed the delivery of the mails on arrival in Hong Kong. The Governor of Hong Kong petitioned to make this a permanent position, but the scheme was not implemented. Seven years later, after the GPO decided that Hong Kong should assume greater responsibilities, the sorting plan was green-lighted. An official from the Hong Kong post office would meet the P & O steamer in Singapore and sort the mails during the trip to Hong Kong. The mails could then be delivered immediately on arrival or forwarded faster to their final destination outside of Hong Kong. The new service started with the arrival of mails at the end of July 1868. Mails were sorted between Singapore and Hong Kong, and another line was also established to sort mails between Hong Kong and Shanghai.

The Webb book (Appendix XXXII) lists the recorded voyages and the number of known surviving covers carried on each trip. The first use of a Marine Sorter marking was on a sailing from Hong Kong to Shanghai, which left Hong Kong on July 15. One piece of mail is known from this trip, marked with the Marine Sorter B handstamp. The next use of the Marine Sorter marking (the first from Singapore) was on mail which arrived in Hong Kong on July 29 from Singapore. Two covers from this trip are known, both with the Marine Sorter A handstamp. The Webb book lists only one cover, which was carried via Southampton and routed through Alexandria (arrived June 18), Suez (departed June 28) and Galle. The cover offered here is not recorded by Webb.

Richard Winter provided the analysis of the routing of the cover offered here. It was carried aboard the North German Lloyd's *Bremen*, which departed New York on June 4 and arrived in Southampton on June 15. It was processed in London on June 16 and was then put on the P & O's *Tanjore*, which departed Marseilles on June 21, arriving in Alexandria on June 27. It then made the P & O sailing of the *China*, which departed Suez on June 28 — the same ship that the Webb-listed example was carried on. The routing via Marseilles saved a significant amount of transit time between England and Alexandria, enabling it to make this sailing. The *China* arrived at Galle in Ceylon on July 12 and departed on the P & O *Malacca* on July 15, which carried it to Hong Kong after the stop in Singapore to pick up the Hong Kong postal official. It arrived in Hong Kong on July 29.



The most comprehensive census of the Samoa Express covers is in Robert Odenweller's book *The Stamps and Postal History of Nineteenth Century Samoa*. He records a total of eleven covers, including five with the 1sh. Destinations include three to Germany and one to Italy. The rate was one shilling per half-ounce. One other bears this same combination of stamps, which is illustrated on the front cover of the Odenweller book.


