

### **Information for Bidders**

#### Biddina

The following means are available for placing bids:

- 1) Attending the Live Auction in Person: All bidders must register for a paddle, and new bidders must provide references at least three business days in advance of the sale.
- **2) Live Internet Bidding:** Instructions for participating as a Live Internet Bidder are provided on the page opposite.
- **3) Phone Bidding:** Bidders can be connected to the sale by phone and bid through a member of staff. Requests for phone bidding are subject to approval (please contact our office at least 24 hours before the sale). A signed Bid Form is required.
- 4) Absentee Bids. All bids received in advance of the sale, either by mail, fax, phone, e-mail or internet, are Absentee Bids, which instruct the auctioneer to bid up to a specific amount on one or more lots in the sale. Absentee Bids sent by phone, fax or e-mail should arrive at least one hour prior to the start of the sale session. Bids entered through Live Internet Bidding will be visible to the auctioneer during the sale. Written bids should be entered legibly on the Bid Form in the sale catalogue. E-mail and internet bids should be carefully typed and double-checked. All new bidders must provide references. We recommend calling or e-mailing to confirm that Absentee Bids sent by mail, fax or e-mail have been received and entered.

#### **Pre-Sale Viewing**

Subject to availability, certain lots (except group lots) can be sent to known clients for examination. Requests must be made no later than 7 days prior to the sale. Lots must be returned on the day received. Postage/insurance costs will be invoiced.

In addition to regular viewing, clients may view lots by appointment. Our staff will be pleased to answer questions or provide additional information about lots.

#### **Expert Certification**

Individual items offered without a PF or PSE certificate dated within the past five years may be purchased subject to independent certification of genuineness and our description. Please refer to the Conditions of Sale and Grading Terms for policies governing certification.

#### **Shipping and Delivery**

Procedures and charges for shipping lots are printed on the back of the Bid Form. Bidders are responsible for all prescribed shipping charges and any applicable sales tax or customs duties.



### Conditions of Sale (please read carefully before bidding)

The property described in this catalogue will be offered at public auction by Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries, Inc. ("Galleries") on behalf of various consignors and itself or affiliated companies. By bidding on any lot, whether directly or by or through an agent, in person, or by telephone, facsimile or any other means, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to all of the following Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 15% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax, use tax or customs duties due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute between bidders, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for the failure to execute such bids or for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. If there is no reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Subject to the exclusions listed in 5(A), the Galleries will accept the return of lots which have been misidentified or which have obvious faults that were present when the lot was in the Galleries' custody, but not so noted in the lot description. All disputed lots must be received by the Galleries intact with the original packing material within 5 days of delivery to the buyer but no later than 30 days from the sale date. (5A) EXCLUSIONS: The following lots may not be returned for any reason: lots containing 10 or more items; lots from buyers who registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; any lot described with "faults," "defects" or a specific fault may not be returned because of any secondary fault. Photographed lots may not be returned because of centering, margins, short/nibbed perforations or other factors shown in the illustrations. Lots may not be returned for any of the following reasons: the color of the item does not match the color reproduction in the sale catalogue or website listing; the description contains inaccurate information about the quantity known or reported; or a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within 3 days from the date of sale. The Galleries retains the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash

- for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. **Credit cards are not accepted as payment.**
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within 7 days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than 30 days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of ½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot accompanied by a certificate issued by The Philatelic Foundation or by Professional Stamp Experts within 5 years of the sale date is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a **contrary certificate of opinion.** Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that does not have a P.F. or P.S.E. certificate (dated as above) may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (1) the purchase price must be paid in full, (2) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (3) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (4) in the event that an adverse opinion is received, the Galleries retain the right to resubmit the item on the buyer's behalf for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, (5) unless written notification to the contrary is received, items submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, and (6) in the event any item is determined to be "not as described", the buyer will be refunded the purchase price and the certification fee up to \$600.00 unless otherwise agreed.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs. Buyers outside the U.S. are responsible for all customs duties.
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. These Terms and Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of New York.

### **Grades, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions**

#### **Grades and Centering**

Our descriptions contain detailed information and observations about each item's condition. We have also assigned grades to stamps and covers, which reflect our subjective assessment. For stamps, the margin width, centering and gum are described and graded according to generally-accepted standards (an approximate correlation to numeric grades is provided at right). Although we believe our grades are accurate, they are not always exactly aligned with third-party grading terms or standards for all issues. A lot may not be returned because a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description. Information from the P.S.E. Stamp Market Quarterly and P.S.E. Population Report<sup>5M</sup> is the most current available, but lots may not be returned due to errors or changes in statistics or data.

**Extremely Fine Gem (90-100):** The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue. This term is equivalent to "Superb" used by grading services.

**Extremely Fine (80-90)**: Exceptionally large/wide margins or near perfect centering.

**Very Fine (70-85):** Normal-size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side. "Very Fine and choice" applies to stamps that have desirable traits such as rich color, sharp impression, freshness or clarity of cancel.

**Fine (60-70):** Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

**Very Good (below 60):** Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

#### Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

#### **Catalogue Values and Estimates**

Unless otherwise noted, the currently available *Scott Catalogue* values are quoted in dollars with a decimal point. Other catalogues are often used for foreign countries or specialized areas and are referred to by their common name: *Stanley Gibbons* (SG), *Dietz, American Air Mail Catalogue* (AAMC), *Michel, Zumstein, Facit*, etc. Estimates are indicated with an "E." and reflect our conservative valuation in dollars. Reserves will never exceed the low end of the estimate range; they will sometimes exceed Scott Catalogue value for stamps in Extremely Fine condition.

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the *Scott Catalogue*—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.

## Private Die Proprietary Stamps

T IS TIME TO UNVEIL THE EIGHTH SCARSDALE COLLECTION TO THE STAMP collecting community. The theme of Revenue stamps continues with the Scarsdale collection of Private Die Proprietary stamps—better known as "Match and Medicines"—which were issued to companies selling matches, medicines, canned fruit, perfumes and playing cards during the years 1862 to 1883.

These issues are sometimes called Civil War Private Die Proprietary stamps, because they were issued to facilitate payment of taxes authorized by the United States government on July 1, 1862, to raise money to finance the North's war against the Southern rebellion. They are "private die" stamps because the dies were made specifically for private companies that sold "proprietary" products, such as matches and patent medicines. The stamps were first issued in 1862 and continued to be issued for two decades until the Civil War taxes were repealed on March 3, 1883.

With few exceptions the production of Private Die Proprietary stamps was contracted with Butler & Carpenter of Philadelphia from 1862 to 1875 (the name of the firm became Joseph R. Carpenter after Butler's death in 1868). In 1875 the National Bank Note Company of New York became the contracted printer. NBNC later merged with the Continental Bank Note Company to form the American Bank Note Company. Beginning in October 1880 all Private Die Proprietary stamps were printed at the Bureau of Engraving & Printing in Washington D.C. The use of different papers follows a chronology of production: Old Paper 1862-1871, Experimental Silk Paper 1871, Silk Paper 1871-1878, Pink Paper 1877-1878, and Watermarked Paper 1877-1883.

All dies were subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue. The dies and plates were retained by the printer and used as needed. The Boston Revenue Book describes the procedure for businesses ordering stamps:

In ordering stamps from a private die considerable 'red tape' had to be gone through with. The process was as follows: If you wished to order say a thousand dollars worth, you took that amount, in cash or a certified check, to the nearest U.S. Assistant Treasurer or designated Depository for U.S. funds, and deposited it; receiving for it a certificate of deposit in duplicate. Then you ordered the stamps, stating the number and value of each title and denomination wanted, and sent the order, together with the duplicate certificate of deposit, to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue at Washington D.C. Upon receipt of this the Commissioner made a requisition upon the engravers and printers for the stamps called for and they were sent direct from their establishment to you. If you requested the Commissioner to send them by mail they were franked through, otherwise you had to pay for their transportation by express.

Stamps were supplied at face value, but the companies using Private Die stamps were given a financial incentive, in the form of a "discount" or "commission." The rate varied, but for larger orders it was 10%. For example, if \$1,000 of stamps were ordered, the amount of \$1,000 was deducted from the funds on deposit, and \$1,100 worth of stamps were delivered to the purchaser. This extra \$100 was considered to be the "discount" or "commission." However, in an 1883 Supreme Court decision after the repeal of the tax, the companies won back \$515,000 in "illegal" withholdings by the Internal Revenue office, representing the difference between reducing the cash payment by 10% and adding a 10% "premium" in stamps to the order (the difference is 1%).

Match & Medicine stamps are truly representative of 19th century American advertising. The patent medicine products — hair tonics, blood purifiers, deworming syrups, pills and potions with outrageous "cure all" claims — are pitched on the stamps. Many of the proprietors put their own faces on the stamps. Some of these entrepreneurs vanished into the landscape. Others went on to become major forces in business.

Collecting Match & Medicines requires patience and a taste for the unusual, but the reward is a collection of stamps that are unique in the world of philately.

The Aldrich census records only 13 examples of this Match stamp rarity. All but one have faults and many are defective and repaired. This is only the second example we have offered since keeping computerized records. The ex-Tolman copy, which was thinned and lightly toned, realized \$5,000 hammer in our Sale 926.................................. 5,000.00

# AMERICAN MATCH COMPANY ROCK ISLAND, ILLINOIS

The American Match Company of Rock Island, Illinois, was formed by William C. Welch and Francis A. Warren. An advertisement for their "Superior Friction Matches" appeared in the July 5, 1867, edition of the Rock Island *Evening Argus*. Days later another notice appeared, announcing that the partnership had been dissolved and that Welch would carry on the business (Perry, p. 219). Only 44,000 stamps (all 3¢) were supplied in one order, delivered on October 31, 1866. The undelivered balance was destroyed (Boston Revenue Book, p. 143). Perry regarded the "Rock Island" issue as "the most famous of all the match stamps."

# BARBER MATCH COMPANY MIDDLEBURY, OHIO

Ohio Columbus Barber (1841-1920) founded the Barber Match Company in 1867 as the successor to earlier partnerships with his brother, George (pictured on the stamp below), and Barber & Peckham. In 1881 the Barber Match Company merged with several other match producers to create the Diamond Match Company. O. C. Barber served as the company's first vice president and became president in 1888.

This issue is frequently counterfeited, as the supply of regularly perforated 1c water-marked stamps is plentiful. There are nine examples recorded in the Aldrich census, but at least one of those has received a negative certificate from the Philatelic Foundation.



# D. BURHANS & COMPANY BURLINGTON, IOWA

A(ugustus) H. Burhans & Co. advertised percussion matches as early as 1855 (*Daily Hawk Eye and Telegraph*, Aug. 1, 1855). D. Burhans & Company received 504,900 stamps on old paper and 97,050 on silk paper. Perry commented that the former issue was very scarce, and of the latter on silk paper he had seen no more than a half-dozen copies. The portrait on the stamp is of the proprietor, Denzlow Burhans (1820-1903).





# GREENLEAF & COMPANY MILWAUKEE, WISCONSIN

The roots of Greenleaf & Company can be traced to the company founded in 1844 by Robert Pierce of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1860 the company was sold to the partnership of Ball, Hill and Greenleaf. By 1865 the company became known as Greenleaf & Company. The  $5\mathfrak{e}$  stamps were issued for use on packages of 500 matches. They were issued from November 1864 through August 1872. 1,096,032 were issued on Old Paper and 68,000 on Silk Paper. Greenleaf & Company stamps were ordered by successor management, including First National Match Company, Barber & Company, and Barber & Peckham.

# JOHN J. MACKLIN & COMPANY COVINGTON, KENTUCKY

John J. Macklin operated numerous match factories, including nineteen that were detroyed by fire. Between 1865 and 1867 Macklin ordered his "Shanghai Matches" stamps from the American Phototype Co. When other match manufacturers saw the inferior workmanship of the stamp, they called it to the attention of Butler, Carpenter & Co., who reported it to the authorities as a stamp easy to counterfeit (the correspondence is quoted in the Boston Revenue Book, pp. 188-190). Butler & Carpenter refused to print from the same plate, and Macklin refused to have a new plate made due to the cost and his losses from fires. He used 1¢ Proprietary stamps for a period of time.

### NEW YORK MATCH COMPANY NEW YORK, N.Y.

The New York Match Company was the successor to B. & H. D. Howard after Benoni Howard was convicted of counterfeiting revenue stamps and sentenced to five years of hard labor. The company also bought out Bauer & Beudel. In addition to its own "N.Y. Match Co." stamps, the firm also used the stamps of its acquired companies. The New York Match Company's offices were located at 1 Park Place, where Boyd's local post also had its offices.



### VAN RENSSELAER POWELL TROY, NEW YORK

Van Rensselaer Powell started his match business as early as 1859, and in June 1863 he was granted patent 38911 for his "machine for splitting match blocks" (illustrated here). In July 1865 he received another patent (49002) for a method of manufacturing friction matches. He sold the business to Bogardus & Griswold in 1869, and that firm changed its name to J. M. Bogardus in 1870. That company was sold to the Atlantic Match Company in 1875. The wrappers were probably made by the American Phototype Co.

#### EPHRAIM K. SMITH PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA

Ephraim K. Smith was a well-known match manufacturer and pharmaceutical wholesaler, whose family business eventually became Glaxo-SmithKline. Ephraim's obituary in the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy 1909 Alumni Report gives details of his life:

#### EPHRAIM K. SMITH, CLASS OF 1861

First Maker of Safety Matches in this Country Dies at Home.

EPHRAIM K. SMITH died at his home, 4050 Walnut street. Monday night, of pneumonia after an illness of ten days. Mr. Smith was born in Salfordville, Montgomery County, 69 years ago. He was a pioneer in the match manufacturing business and had a factory on Randolph, below Jefferson street, where he was the first man in the United Status to make safety matches. When a combination of manufacturers absorbed Mr. Smith's factory, he became secretary and treasurer of the American Match Manufacturers' Association, and later was one of the incorporators of the Diamond Match Company.

He was the instigator of a movement for the removal of the government stamp tax on matches and succeeded in 1882 in having the tax abolished.

Mr. Smith's ancestors were among the early settlers of Germantown. He was a nephew of the late Jacob K. Smith, president of the Enterprise Manufacturing Company, and of George K. Smith, who before the Civil War was a leader in the wholesale drug business.

Ten copies of the E.K. Smith Roulette are recorded in the Aldrich census, of which eight are faulty, with the statement "the condition is usually very, very poor." Aldrich also states he would not be surprised if half were actually fakes. The huge margins on this stamp preclude fakery, the possibility of which plagues several of the other examples of this issue.

# WILMINGTON PARLOR MATCH COMPANY, WILMINGTON, DELAWARE

The world's first stamp to depict a map is the Private Die Match stamp issued in October 1869 by the Wilmington Parlor Match Company in Wilmington, Delaware. The map depicts the western hemisphere and a number of islands in the Atlantic, Pacific and Caribbean. The Boston Revenue Book reports that the proprietor was B. James, who was succeeded by Connor & Walley. Perry located a Bradley James in the Wilmington directories, but he could not find any reference to Connor & Walley.

James C. Ayer (1818-1878) founded his own apothecary and patent medicine firm in Lowell, Massachusetts, in 1841. By the 1850's it was the largest manufacturer of patent medicines. Ayer & Co. skillfully marketed popular medicinal remedies, such as Cherry Pectoral, Cathartic Pills, Sarsaparilla, Ague Cure and Hair Vigor.






#### JOHN I. BROWN & SON BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS

John I. Brown & Son was a Boston-based patent medicine manufacturer and marketer. Brown's Bronchial Troches was advertised as a tonic for the throat and breathing passages with endorsements from singers, teachers, ministers and others. They also sold Brown's Vermifuge Comfits or Worm Lozenges and other preparations. The firm was later associated with the sale of the notorious "Mrs. Winslow's Soothing Syrup," a morphine and alcohol-based concoction that caused the deaths of hundreds of children through overdoses (see lots 645-646).



# DR. A. W. CHASE, SON & COMPANY TOLEDO, OHIO

Dr. Alvin Wood Chase (1817-1885), a resident of Ann Arbor, Michigan, operated his patent medicine business in Toledo, Ohio. Among his products, advertised as "Dr. Chase's Family Medicines," were Kidney-Liver Pills, Backache Powder, Ointment, Catarrh Cure, and Syrup of Linseed and Turpentine. Dr. Chase also authored numerous books on homeopathic medicines and practical advice, promoted as "Dr. Chase's recipes or, Information for everybody: an invaluable collection of about eight hundred practical recipes... with a rational treatment of pleurisy, inflammation of the lungs, and other inflammatory diseases, and also for general female debility and irregularities."

#### DRAKE'S PLANTATION BITTERS NEW YORK, N.Y.

Col. Patrick H. Drake and Demas Barnes formed a partnership sometime around 1862 to manufacture and market Drake's Plantation Bitters. Their partnership ended in 1867, and Plantation Bitters was sold thereafter by P. H. Drake & Co. The digestive aid — made with 38% alcohol — was sold in a distinctive log cabin-shaped bottle. This bottle design was patented in 1862, and Plantation Bitters was one of more than 40 cabin-shaped bitters bottles produced by various makers.

### FLEMING BROTHERS, PITTSBURGH, PENNSYLVANIA "DR. McLANE'S CELEBRATED LIVER PILLS"

A history of Dr. McLane's Liver Pills and the Fleming Brothers is provided in a June 1872 trademark infringement suit brought by Cochrane Fleming against Dr. James H. McLean:

"As early as 1834, Dr. Charles McLane, of Morgantown, Va., made and sold liver pills, putting them up in wooden boxes, labelled 'Dr. McLane's Liver Pills.' In June, 1844, Jonathan Kidd, having purchased the exclusive right from him, began, at Pittsburg, Penn., to make and sell them. In 1845, Kidd formed a partnership with John Fleming, under the name of Jonathan Kidd & Co. Kidd died in 1853, and Fleming, the surviving partner, and one Cochrane Fleming, having purchased from Kidd's executors all his interest in the business, entered into partnership, under the name of Fleming Brothers. That firm continued until 1865, when Cochrane retired. John carried on the business in the firm name until his death, in November, 1870, whereupon Cochrane succeeded under his will to all his rights in the business."



# JAMES A. JACKSON & COMPANY ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

The St. Louis business directories list James A. Jackson & Co. and variations of that name from 1867 to 1873, followed by Jackson, Pfouts & Douglass in 1874 and The Home Bitters Co. in 1875. The firm is listed as a liquor dealer. Their "Celebrated Home Stomach Bitters" was undoubtedly an alcohol-based concoction, sold in bottles like the one illustrated here. A lengthy advertisement with testimonials appears in *The Daily Ranchero and Republican* (Brownsville, Texas, September 19, 1871, available on line at http://texashistory.unt.edu. The address in the 1871 ad is 105 and 107 North Second Street in St. Louis.

#### DR. DAVID JAYNE & SON PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA

Dr. David Jayne, born in Stroudsburg in 1799, was a University of Pennsylvania graduate and started his practice as a rural family doctor in Salem, New Jersey, in 1822. He was first listed as a doctor in Philadelphia in 1839. Jayne sold various products, including a "Tonic Vermifuge" for the expulsion of worms, and he published Jayne's Medical Almanac & Guide to Good Health. In 1846 his two sons joined him, and in 1855 the business name was changed to David Jayne & Son. Dr. Jayne became president of the Commonwealth Insurance Company, while his sons managed the medicine business. He died in 1866, leaving an estate worth a reported \$3,000,000. The family business carried on into the 20th century.



#### DR. JAMES C. KERR CINCINNATI, OHIO

The Holcombe book cites James C. Kerr's entries in the Williams' Cincinnati business directories, starting with 1864 as a "clerk," in 1865 as a "showman," and in 1866 as a "museum." In 1868 he has the title "Dr. Kerr, system renovator," and subsequently he emerges as "Proprietor of Kerr's System Renovator." Dr. Kerr's private die stamp bears a portrait of himself. The denomination was reduced from 6¢ to 4¢ in 1870 when the price of his product was reduced to a dollar per bottle.



# THOMAS W. MARSDEN NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA, AND NEW YORK, N.Y.

Thomas W. Marsden advertised his medicines in the Texas McKinney Messenger newspaper (May 31, 1867, available at http://texashistory.unt.edu). The address in the 1867 advertisement is 487 Broadway, the same address in an 1866 Harper's Weekly ad. Holcombe reports an 1868 directory listing with a new address at 7 Platt Street. A citation of Marsden's promotional pamphlets (An Annotated Catalogue of the Edward C. Atwater Collection of American Popular Medicine and Health Reform: M-Z) shows that Marsden was selling his medicines in New Orleans just after the war, which explains the Texas newspaper advertisement. New Orleans marriage records show Thomas W. Marsden marrying Jane C. Willis on March 9, 1855. An 1879 Commissioner of Patents report lists Marsden in partnership with G. R. Finlay in New Orleans, selling all of the same products.

#### MERCADO & SEULLY SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Felix Mercado and Firmin Seully were partners in a wine distributing firm in San Francisco. In 1860 they approached the winemaker Sainsevain Brothers with a proposal to sell wine bitters made from Sainsevain wine. In March 1861 they marketed the new product under the name "Sainsevain," to which they received exclusive rights. To make their wine bitters, they hired G. A. Simon, who had 17 years experience producing wine and wine bitters. Shortly after, Simon and Mercado & Seully got into a dispute over who had claim to Sainsevain's California Wine Bitters, and Simon left the company in 1863 to launch his own California Wine Bitters under his name. Mercado & Seully continued to market their wine bitters until Pierre Sainsevain started selling his own California Wine Bitters in San Jose. Mercado & Seully then placed their own name upon this California Wine Bitters. In February 1868 Mercado & Seully dissolved their partnership and Mercado & Co was formed in October at the same address.



### MERCHANT'S GARGLING OIL LOCKPORT, NEW YORK

The Merchant's Gargling Oil Company of Lockport was founded by Dr. George W. Merchant in 1833. His product was initially sold to teamsters alongside the Erie Canal, marketed with the slogan "Good for Man and Beast." Merchant sold the business to M. H. Tucker around 1855. John Hodge joined the company as a teenager and was elected secretary when M. H. Tucker & Company was incorporated in 1858. Hodge gained control of the company in 1865 after Tucker died.







### BENNETT H. PIETERS & COMPANY CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

Bennett Pieters & Company of Chicago sold "Red Jacket Bitters," which was named after a Seneca Indian who lived in the New York area from 1756 to 1830. Red Jacket was named for the bright red jacket he wore, a gift from the British. Pieters & Co. was listed in the 1860 city directory with Bennett Pieters, John F. Stafford and John D. Smedley as partners at 149 Water Street. They moved to 21 River Street, and again to 31-33 Michigan Avenue in 1866. The city directory lists the firm as distillers and wholesale liquor dealers. In the 1866 Stranger's and Tourists' Guide to the City of Chicago, Bennett Pieters & Co is described as follows: "This firm had long and successfully pursued the manufacturer of the Red Jacket Bitters, and their business expanding beyond the limits of their former building, has erected and now occupies a store of palatial proportions—solid stone and brick, five stories high."

In the early 1860's Philander Ring (1824-1910) began selling "Hall's Vegetable Sicilian Hair Renewer" (Reuben P. Hall's own private die stamp is Scott RS94). Ring was persuaded by Dr. Elisha M. Tubbs, a friend, dentist and chemist in Petersborough N.H., to manufacture their own product — "Ring's Vegetable Ambrosia" — and, together with a third partner, they started E. M. Tubbs & Co in 1864. The company was located in Petersborough until 1866, when it moved to Manchester. Sometime prior to this, Ring had sold out his interest in the firm. E. M. Tubbs & Company ordered the  $2 \ell$  and  $4 \ell$  dies, which depict Dr. Tubbs. Stamps from these plates were printed from 1867 to 1881. Dr. Tubbs died in 1878, and Ring returned to the business. His partners were Colby Cheney and Ira Cross, and the reconstituted firm was named Ring's Ambrosia Company. Sometime between 1878 and 1882, they moved the business to Nashua, N.H. Stamps ordered during this period were invoiced to Ring's Ambrosia Company.

## DR. MILES A. SIMMONS IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, AND ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

Dr. Miles Alexander Simmons (ca 1820-1901) started practicing medicine in Georgia in 1840 and sold "Simmons Liver Medicine" from a cart-mounted five-gallon keg. Dr. Simmons moved to Mississippi in 1842 and was involved in newspaper publishing. In 1850, B. S. Kenyon bought the *Iuka Reporter* from Dr. Simmons (http://msgw.org/tishomingo/newspapers.html).

Dr. Simmons began production of "Dr. M. A. Simmons Vegetable Liver Medicine" around 1875 in Iuka. He moved to St. Louis in 1878 and sold the business shortly after to his son, Calvin F. Simmons, who continued to produce and sell the products at the C. F. Simmons Medicine Company in St. Louis. The firm also manufactured "Dr. Simmons' Squaw Vine Wine." The "Iuka, Miss." private die stamp, depicting Dr. Simmons, was issued from December 1875 through December 1879. A new die with "St. Louis, Mo." was prepared, and stamps from the new plate were issued from January 1879 through November 25, 1881.

The Dr. Simmons stamps were originally engraved and printed with the Iuka inscription. After the firm moved to St. Louis, the inscription was changed. The "Iuka" stamps were normally printed on silk paper, and the "St. Louis" stamps on Bureau watermarked paper. The "Iuka "on watermarked paper is a great rarity. Richard Friedberg offers the theory that the first supply delivered by the Bureau was printed with the "Iuka" inscription, and that Simmons returned the stamps with a request to change the address to St. Louis. This stamp probably comes from the returned sheets and has a faint pencil "St. Louis" notation in the margin. Only six examples of the "Iuka" on watermarked paper are recorded in the Aldrich census.

### JAMES AND WILLIAM SWAIM, PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA

The stamps used on the popular "Swaim's Panacea" were issued with facsimile signatures of Dr. James Swaim and his son, William. The product was originally created in 1820 by James' father, William Swaim, a New York City bookbinder located at 241 Pearl Street, who started selling his medicinal cure for "diseases arising from impurity of the blood and juices — also, those who suffer by directed Liver, Rheumatic affections, or from indiscretion of their youth [syphilis]." William died in 1846, and the business continued under the supervision of Dr. James Swaim. When James died in 1870, his son William took over.

# UNITED STATES PROPRIETARY MEDICINE CO. CINCINNATI. OHIO

The United States Proprietary Medicine Company filed for incorporation in Ohio on May 18, 1866. They took over the manufacture and marketing of three different Dr. Roback products: "Scandinavian Blood Pills," "Scandinavian Blood Purifier," and "Scandinavian Stomach Bitters." A proof for the 6¢ stamp was approved on October 15, 1866. The company turned over this product line to F E. Squire & Co. in late 1870 or early 1871. In July 1874 the business was acquired by J. S. Bursdal & Co. (see lots 627-628)



### E. W. HOYT & COMPANY, LOWELL, MASSACHUSETTS

Hoyt eventually became Staniels' partner and, by 1863, when Staniels died, he took over the business. Hoyt's famous cologne was first developed for sale in his apothecary shop.
