

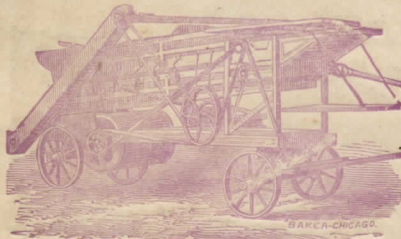

Battle Creek was known throughout the world as the home of the greatest threshing machine plants in existence. The threshing machine industry began in Battle Creek in a modest way in 1848 when John Nichols and David Shepard opened a foundry and machine shop on North State Street in the center of the growing village. Nichols and Shepard manufactured plows, harrows and other agricultural implements.

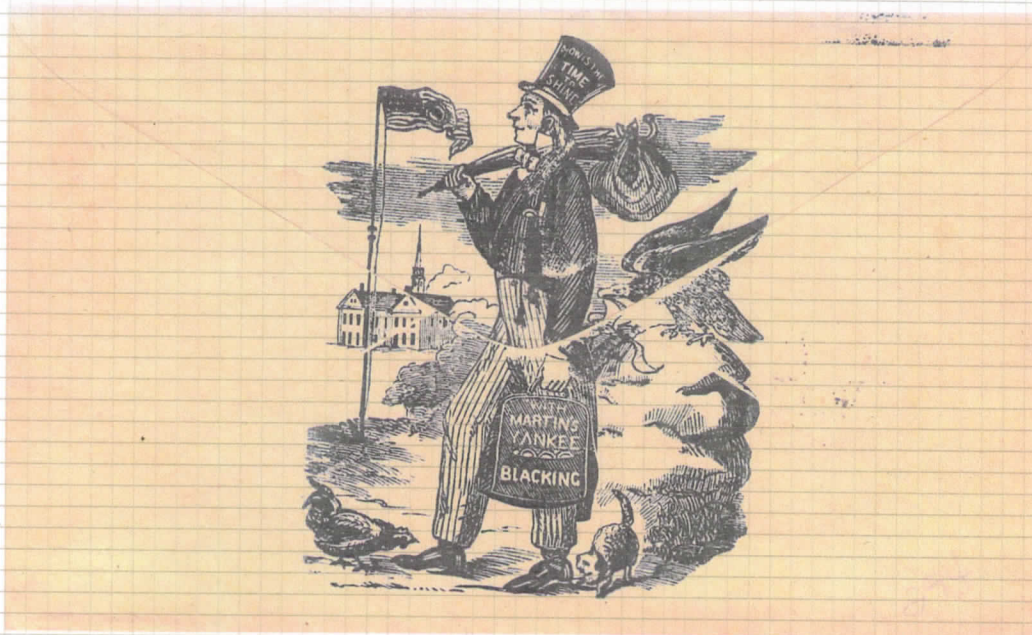

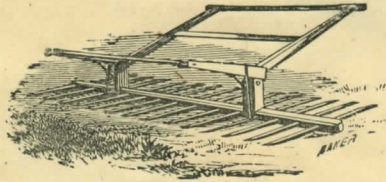
Crosby Opera House Art Association Advertising Chicago, Ill.



Crosby's Opera House (1865–1871) was an opera house in Chicago, Illinois. It was founded by Uranus H. Crosby in 1865 in an effort to bring a great opera hall to the city. The building was designed by William W. Boyington; the great expense of its construction ruined Crosby. After holding only occasional performances, an association formed to relieve the house of its great debt. A lottery was held that distributed over 210,000 tickets, awarding purchasers

great works of art and even the building itself. After it was sold back to Crosby by the lottery winner, the hall saw more consistent performances. The hall hosted the 1868 Republican National Convention. It was destroyed in the Great Chicago Fire of 1871 and never rebuilt.

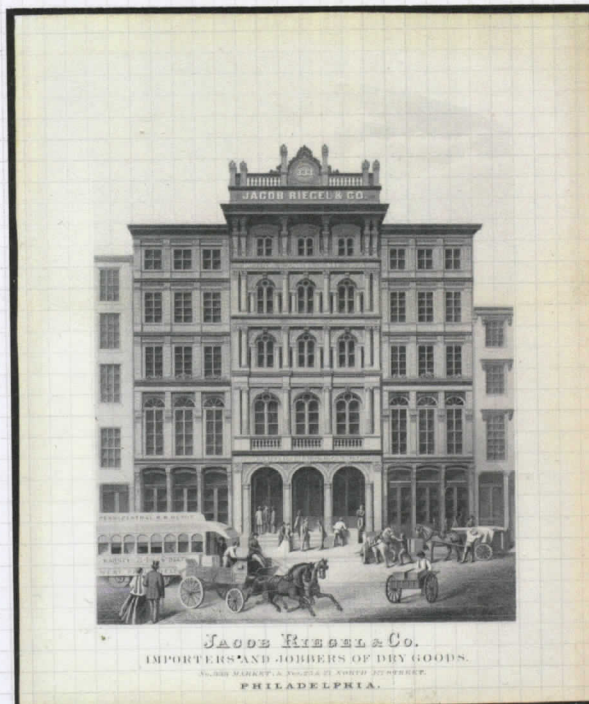

Philadelphia to Denton, MD – April 20, Circa 1867



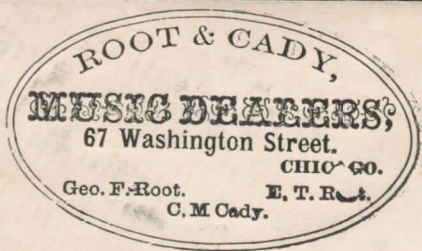
Exterior view of the multi-story storefront at 333 Market Street of the dry goods store originally established in 1832 as Siegers & Vogel. Patrons stand in the doorway of the building, while pedestrians converse and a couple passes by on the sidewalk in front of the entrance. Laborers load and unload horse-drawn drays stationed nearby across from street traffic, including a Pennsylvania Central R.R. Depot street car, a racing Adams Express Co. wagon transporting crates, and an African American delivery man pushing a handcart carrying boxes. Also shows partial views of adjacent buildings. Jacob Riegel operated Jacob Riegel & Co. from 1866 until his death in 1880.
