


Illustration 3: Closeup of Agent's Mark







Competition between railroads and steamboats grew in the early 1900's. In 1905 Captain L.V. Cooley steamed his boat, the "America" to Camden, Artaknsas to pick up 500 bales of cotton for delivery to New Orleans. Upon arrival, Coooley found the railroads also bidding for the same delivery ended in a war with Cooley finally winning. Cooley deliverd the cotton to New Orleans for only one dollar.






