A black grid cancel is on the two cent Boyd's stamp. The black on green Boyd's stamp is on a folded letter dated September 7, 1848. The folded letter also has two red "PAID J.B.T." hand stamps and two red "BOYD CITY EXPRESS POST SEP 9" and a "SEP 17" date stamps on the front. It is addressed to 196 Pearl Street, and then redirected to 298 Pearl Street.

The folded letter was sent by Mr. Disboid, saying that he has enclosed his notes for the amount of his debt to Mr. Studuell.

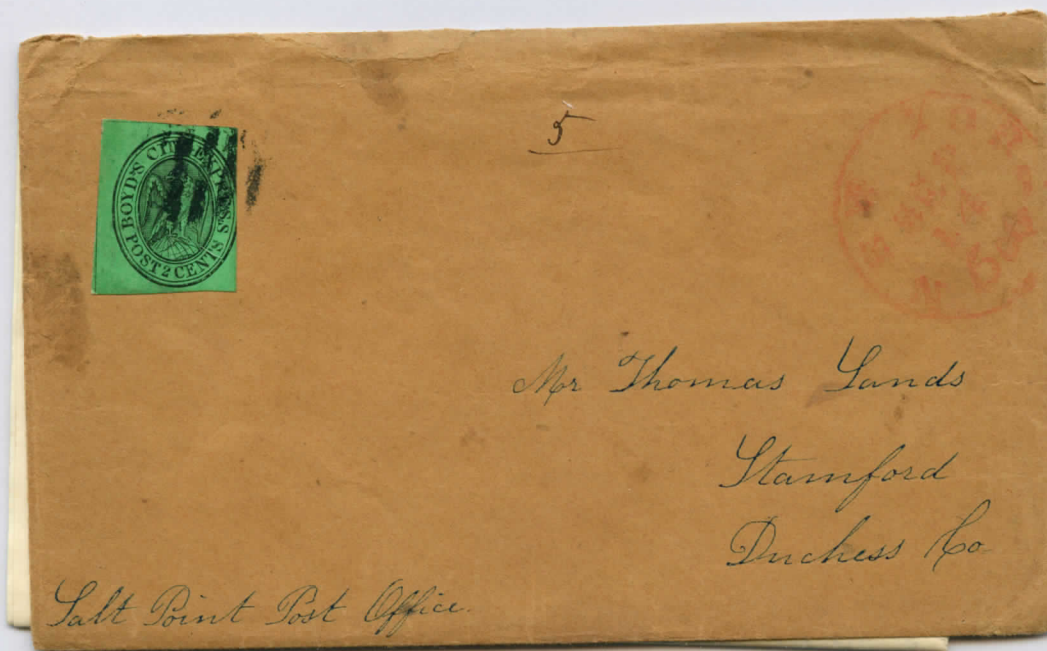

An acid cancelled two cent Boyd's stamp, black on green is on a folded letter dated Jan 19, 1846. The Boyd stamp is also tied by a red "PAID J.B.T." hand stamp, and the folded letter has an additional red "BOYD CITY EXPRESS POST JAN 21 96" date stamp on the front.

The content of the folded letter from Mr. Little, is an request for 500 assorted issues since last September and 500 of the second quality issues at \$4.00 per hundred from Nathl Currier. Mr. Currier notes inside the folded letter that Mr. Little's request has been fulfilled and sent to Albany.

Two cent engraved black on green glazed surfaced-colored paper Boyd stamp is tied by a barred grid hand stamp. The stamp does not have a period after "CENTS", and the inner oval frame has a heavy inner frame line. The cover also has a red "NEW YORK SEP 14 6 CTS" date stamp. The envelope is addressed to Stamford Duchess Co., with a manuscript note at the lower left that says, "Salt Point Post Office".

The enclosed letter is dated "New York 11th mo 18th 1851" and is simply from Mary C., addressed to (Mr. Thomas Lands), and she opens the letter with: "My Dear Friends". The content of Mary's three page letter is update of family and friends, and their trials and tribulations. She apologizes for not writing sooner, but she has not had time to write as she has been traveling and just recently returned form the South of Hamburg. She states that, "We had a short agreeable visit with the Indians and would have stayed longer with them but many were going away to attend the Council at Tonewanda".

The two cent Boyd's Local Post, black on green glazed paper stamp is tied by a black hand stamp, the Valentines Day cover is also tied by a orange brown Scott #11 that is cancelled by a "NEW YORK FEB 14" black circular date stamp.

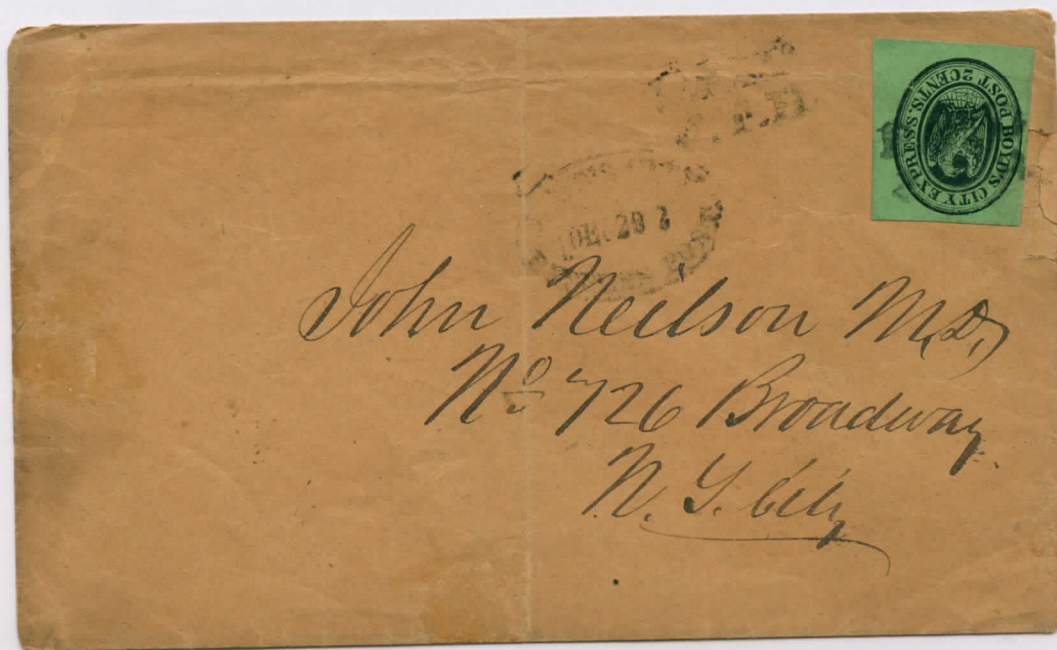

The two cent Boyd's black on olive green unglazed paper colored through is tied by two "PAID J.B.T." hand stamps. The small envelope also has Boyd's City Express black oval hand stamp with the date "AUG 12".

Boyd's City Express 20L10, is easily identified by the three oval frame lines, the heaviest being the outermost oval frame line, and the stamp's solid color background.

Boyd's City Express stamp has been cancelled by a black "PAID J.B.T." hand stamp. 20L11 is easily identified by the outer oval frame of three lines; the outermost frame line is the heaviest. The stamp is printed on a solid background.

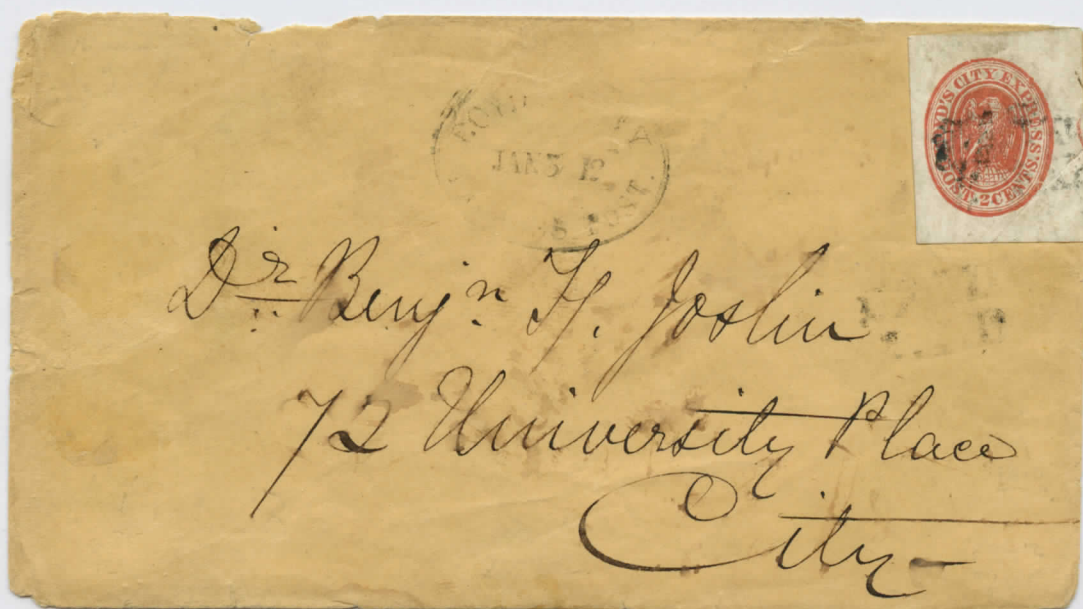

1857 two cent, brick red on white unglazed paper colored through. Boyd's City Express stamp has been cancelled by a black "PAID J.B.T." hand stamp. 20L12 is easily identified by the outer oval frame of three lines; the outermost frame line is the heaviest.

A letter is enclosed. It is dated September 26th with no identifiable year date. The letter signed "From Your Little Baby" talks about a trip to a friend's house, and informs M. T. Holmes on the latest trials and tribulations of all her friends.

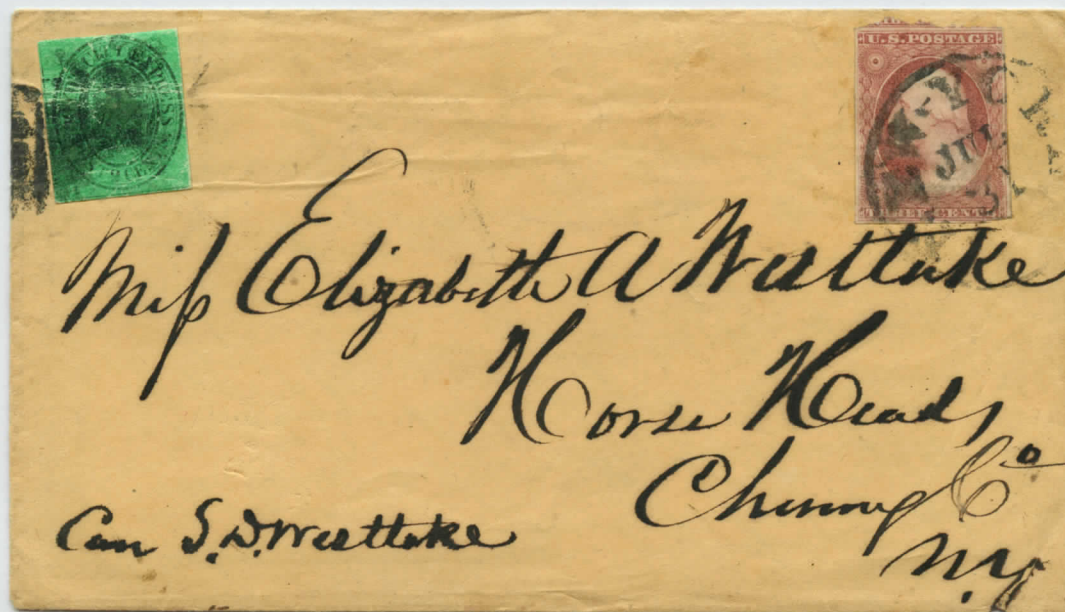

1857 two cent Boyd's local post, dull orange, white on unglazed paper colored through. Boyd's City Express stamp has been cancelled by a black "PAID J.B.T." hand stamp. 20L13 is easily identified by the outer oval frame of three lines; the outermost frame line is the heaviest.

1857 two cent black on green, glazed surface paper. The Boyd's City Express two cent 20L14 stamp is tied by a black hand stamp, the cover also has #11 Washington dull red stamp that is tied by a black date stamp, "New York July 31".

The letter enclosed is dated July 30, 1857, and is addressed to Elizabeth. It's from her brother giving her an update on friends and relatives.

20L14 is similar to Boyd's two cent 20L10, but the eagle's tail is square. The upper part of the "2" is closed in well printed specimens forming a symmetrical "o". The "2" is closer to the "T" in "POST" than it is to the "C" in "CENTS".

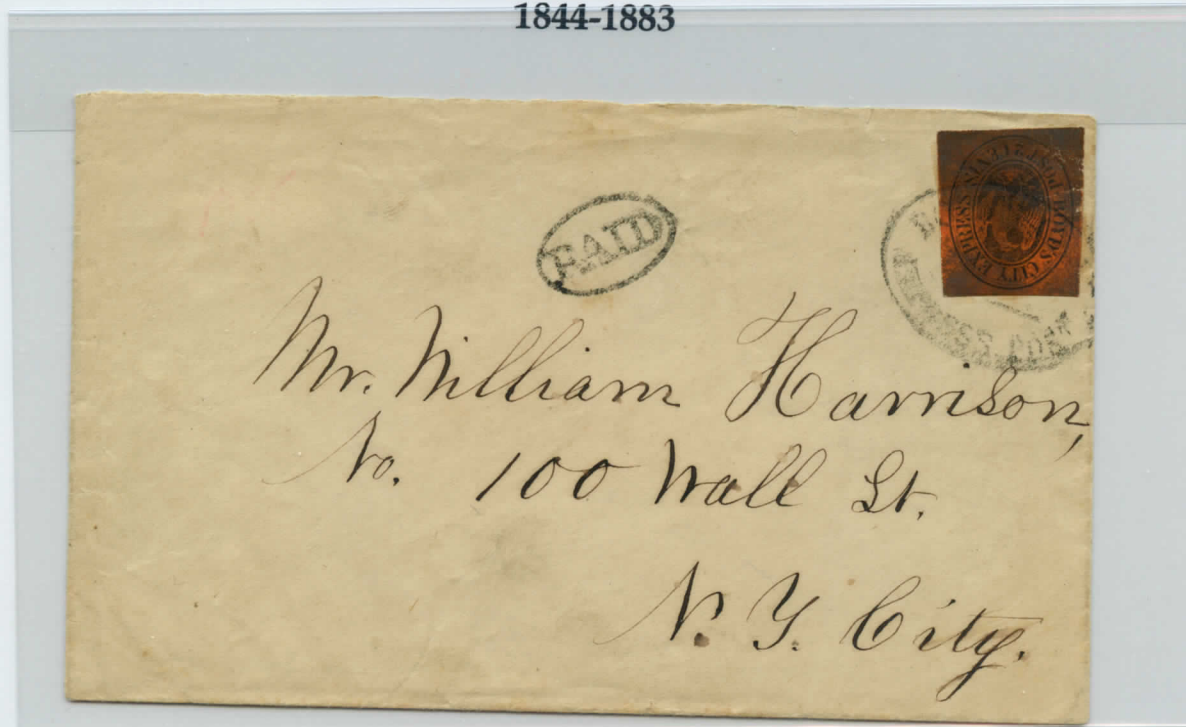

1857 two cent black on green, glazed surface paper. The Boyd's City Express two cent stamp has been cancelled by a black "PAID J.B.T." hand stamp. 20L14 is similar to Boyd's two cent 20L10, but the eagle's tail is square. The upper part of the "2" is closed in well printed specimens forming a symmetrical "o". The "2" is closer to the "T" in "POST" than it is to the "C" in "CENTS".

1861 two cent black on red glazed surface paper. Boyd's 20L16 has center dots before "Post" and after "Cents". 20L16 is cancelled by a black Boyd's oval hand stamp. The cover also has a small black oval hand stamp marked "PAID" in the center.

Boyd's City Express 1860, one cent denomination, black on lilac paper, tied by a New York town datestamp on a cover tied with a three cent dull red 1857 Scott #26 which is grid cancelled. Locally addressed to Mrs. Mary E Black Goshen, Orange County, N.Y.

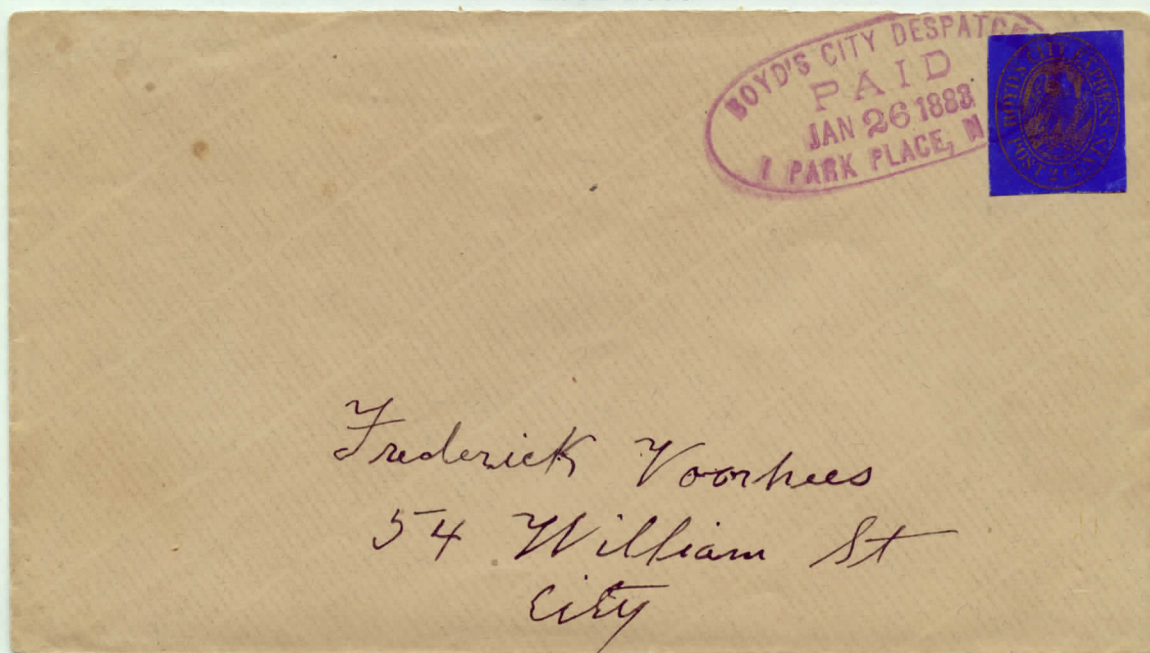

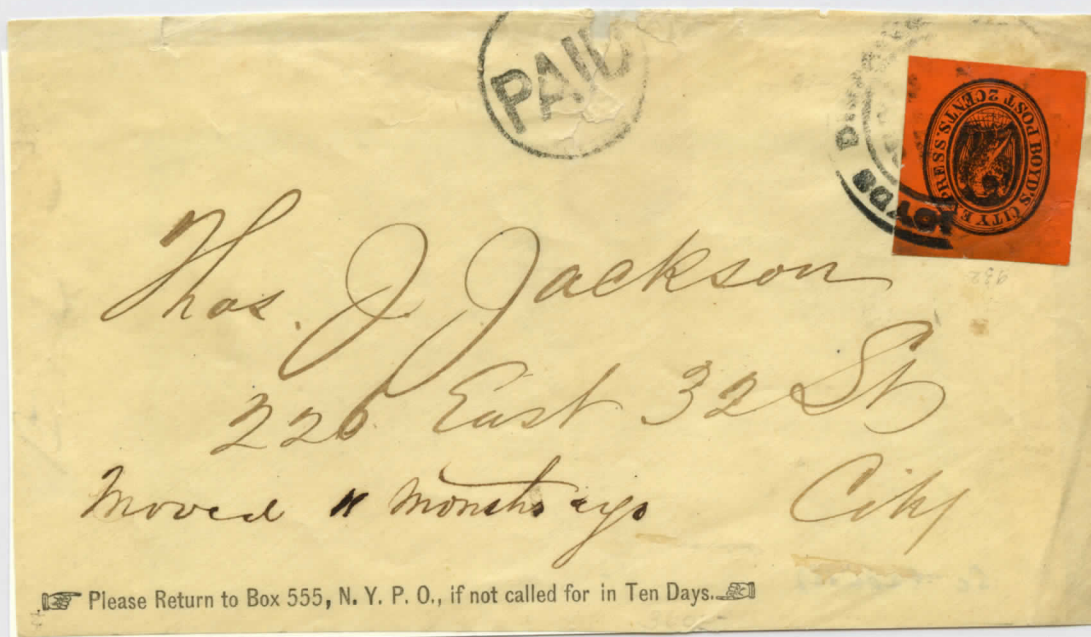

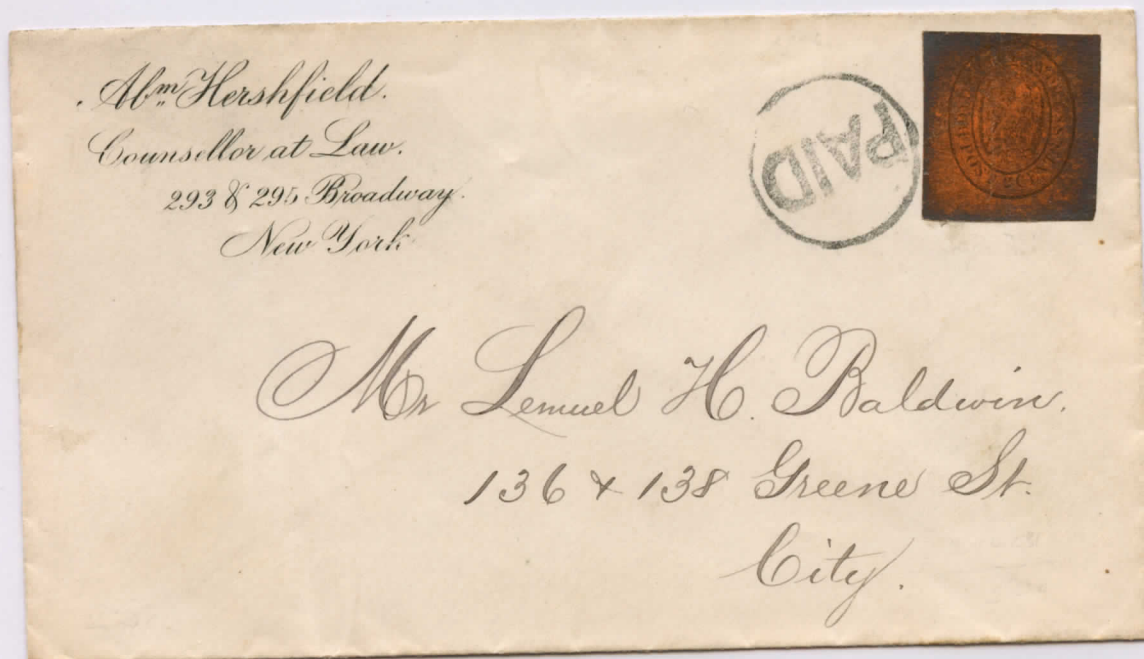

20L23 was reprinted from a new stone on paper of normal color.
