87L9 Hussey's Post 1858 (1 cent) blue Greek Temple design. Large to very large margins. Tied on an orange cover bearing a blue embossed Adams Express Company Frank.



87L10

This is a 1859 one cent rose red Hussey Post stamp that is tied by a black circular company one cent paid September 11 handstamp cancel (1ct Paid Sep 11). Margins to just in.

Hussy's Post was local mailing and circular delivery service, the bulk of which consisted of Bank and Insurance notices, bills, circulars and other commercial mail matter. Hussey was a philatelist and many of his issues and reprintings were for collecting purposes, but were available to pre-pay the charges on matter passing through his post. In 1873 Hussey sold the post to Robert Eason, who continued the operation untdil 1889.



Hussey's Post 1872 black on wove paper. Cover is tied by a purple Hussey's Special Messenger 54 Pine St. oval handstamp. Very well margined. Ex. Hale.

Hussey's Post 1872, red brown, Scott type L184. Cover is tied by a "Hussey's Post Paid 54 Pine Street" marking on locally used buff cover paper usage. Very Fine, large margins all around.

This is a 1873 two cent black Hussey's Post stamp which is tied by a company hand stamp to a Knickerbockers Fire Insurance Company preprinted return address envelope.

Blue Hussey Messenger on thin wove paper, perforated 12½ and tied by a violet Hussey Messenger oval hand stamp on cover. Addressed locally to William Street, New York, N.Y.

Rose Hussey Messenger on thin wove paper perforated 12½ and tied by a violet Hussey Messenger oval hand stamp on the cover. Addressed locally to William Street, New York, N.Y.

The Hussey's type V stamp is a blue "running messenger", perforated 12 by 11 and is tied to the cover by a light black hand stamp. Type V is easily identified from type IV by the slightly larger words "TRADE MARK" and the "T" of "TRADE MARK" is touching the second "s" of Easson. This particular Hussey stamp is without the word, "EXPRESS" and the stamp has no expressed value.

This is a red 1880 Type II, Hussey's stamp perforated 12 X11.5, tied by a very light black circular hand stamp cancel, on a cover addressed to American Lead Pencil Company in New York. Scott Catalog states, "The authenticity of Scott Numbers 87L69 through 87L72 has not been fully established." Both Lyons and Patton recognize this issue as authentic.

This is an 1880 Hussey's Post, type I, perforated 12; brown stamp on glazed surface wove paper. The stamp is tied to a preprinted Irving Insurance Company return envelope by a purple straight line "SPECIAL MESSAGE" hand stamp cancel.

Type I of Hussey's Express can be identified by the imprint of "N.F. SEEBECK 97 WALL ST. N.Y." appearing within the design in the lower tablet just below "R. EASSON PROP' R".

This Hussey running messenger stamp is the first and only Hussey design for adhesive stamps on which the word "EXPRESS was used. It may be supposed that Hussey's use of "POST" violated an Act of Congress in 1880.

Hussey's Post 1880 Ultramarine. Tied on a cover by purple "SPECIAL MESSAGE" handstamp. The cover is addressed to Irving Insurance Company.



87LUP3

An 1858 black Hussey wrapper, with a clear black strike "PAID/G. HUSSEY" on a manila cover to a local street address.

(Wrappers: All specimens that have been seen are hand stamped in black on dark manila paper, cut approximately 6 X 8 3/4 inches, with an impression of the Letter Box design in the upper left corner, as folded. In addition they are hand stamped "PAID/ G. HUSSEY" in two lines, often applied diagonally, in the upper right hand corner. The letter box designs are not obliterated, and there are no other markings. ("The Identifier for Carriers, Locals, Fakes, Forgeries and Bogus Posts of the United States", Volume II, by Larry Lyons.)
