Bidding

The following means are available for placing bids:

1) NO PUBLIC ATTENDANCE AT AUCTION: Due to current state restrictions, there will not be a floor auction open to bidders. All live bidding will be via mail, phone or internet.

2) Live Internet Bidding: Instructions for participating as a Live Internet Bidder are provided on the page opposite.

3) Phone Bidding: Bidders can be connected to the sale by phone and bid through a member of staff. Requests for phone bidding are subject to approval (please contact our office at least 24 hours before the sale). A signed Bid Form is required.

4) Absentee Bids. All bids received in advance of the sale, either by mail, fax, phone, email or internet, are Absentee Bids, which instruct the auctioneer to bid up to a specific amount on one or more lots in the sale. Absentee Bids sent by phone, fax or email should arrive at least one hour prior to the start of the sale session. Bids entered through Live Internet Bidding will be visible to the auctioneer during the sale. Written bids should be entered legibly on the Bid Form in the sale catalogue. Email and internet bids should be carefully typed and double-checked. All new bidders must provide references. We recommend calling or e-mailing to confirm that Absentee Bids sent by mail, fax or email have been received and entered.

Registering with STAMP AUCTION NETWORK & SIEGEL AUCTION GALLERIES

Live Internet Bidding is managed by Stamp Auction Network (SAN).

To bid, you must be registered and approved by both SAN and Siegel.

To decide what you need to do, choose the description below that best fits you.



I've already registered with SAN and have been approved by Siegel for internet bidding

I'm a Siegel client, but I'm not registered with SAN

Go to stampauctionnetwork.com/siegel and click on "Register" at the top. Check the box for Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries (under "R") and submit the form, indicating you are a Siegel client. Once registered at SAN, you're ready for internet bidding.

I've bid through SAN before, but this is the first time I've bid in a Siegel sale

Then you just need to be approved by Siegel. Go to stampauctionnetwork.com/siegel and click on "Update Registration" at the top. Your SAN account information will be sent to us for approval (you might be asked for other trade references). Once approved by Siegel for bidding, you're ready for internet bidding.

I've never bid with Siegel, nor registered with SAN

Go to stampauctionnetwork.com/siegel and click on "Register" at the top. Check the box for Robert A. Siegel Auction Galleries (under "R") and submit the form with your trade references (please, no family members or credit card companies as references). Once registered at SAN and approved by Siegel for bidding, you're ready for internet bidding.

Live Internet Bidding works by allowing registered bidders to observe and place bids.

Live Internet Bidding will work with any browser on both PC and Mac operating systems.

Before bidding by internet for the first time, we recommend finding a sale in progress and listening to the public broadcast or logging in as a registered bidder. This will help you develop a feel for the sale tempo and bidding interface.

Log on to the auction at stampauctionnetwork.com

When you're logged on as a Live Internet Bidder, the bidding interface shows a photo and description of the lot, the current bid (and your bidding status), options for placing competitive bids and buttons with bid increments.

- After you click on a bid amount, the auctioneer is immediately notified of your bid.
- Retracting a bid is usually not acceptable, so please bid carefully.
- If you bid and then decide to stop, the "Pass" button will tell the auctioneer you are no longer bidding.
- You can send messages to the auctioneer (for example, a request for extension).
- You can track prior realizations from the bidding screen.



Conditions of Sale (please read carefully before bidding)

THE PROPERTY IN THIS CATALOGUE WILL BE OFFERED AT PUBLIC AUCTION BY ROBERT A. SIEGEL AUCTION GALLERIES, INC. ("GALLERIES") ON BEHALF OF VARIOUS CONSIGNORS AND ITSELF OR AFFILIATED COMPANIES. BY BIDDING ON ANY LOT, WHETHER DIRECTLY OR THROUGH A THIRD PARTY, IN PERSON, BY TELEPHONE, FACSIMILE, INTERNET OR BY ANY OTHER MEANS, THE BIDDER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES TO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the buyer. The term "final bid" means the last bid acknowledged by the auctioneer, which is normally the highest bid offered. The purchase price payable by the buyer will be the sum of the final bid and a commission of 18% of the final bid ("buyer's premium"), together with any sales tax, use tax or customs duties due on the sale.
- 2. The auctioneer has the right to reject any bid, to advance the bidding at his discretion and, in the event of a dispute, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding or to reoffer and resell the lot in dispute. The Galleries' record of the final sale shall be conclusive.
- 3. All bids are per numbered lot in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots, to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. The Galleries will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for the failure to execute such bids or for any errors in the execution of such bids.
- 4. Lots with numbers followed by the symbol ° are offered subject to a confidential minimum bid ("reserve"), below which the lot will not be sold. The absence of the symbol ° means that the lot is offered without a reserve. If there is no reserve, the auctioneer has sole discretion to establish a minimum opening bid and may refuse an offer of less than half of the published estimate. Any lot that does not reach its reserve or opening bid requested by the auctioneer will be announced as "passed" and excluded from the prices realized lists after the sale. The Galleries may have a direct or indirect ownership interest in any or all lots in the sale resulting from an advance of monies or goods-in-trade or a guarantee of minimum net proceeds made by the Galleries to the seller.
- 5. Subject to the exclusions listed in 5(A), the Galleries will accept the return of lots which have been misidentified or which have obvious faults that were present when the lot was in the Galleries' custody, but not so noted in the lot description. All disputed lots must be received by the Galleries intact with the original packing material within 5 days of delivery to the buyer but no later than 30 days from the sale date. (5A) EXCLUSIONS: The following lots may not be returned for any reason, or may not be returned for the reasons stated: i) lots containing 5 or more items; ii) lots from buyers who registered for the pre-sale exhibition or received lots by postal viewing, thereby having had the opportunity to inspect them before the sale; iii) any lot described with "faults," "defects" or a specific fault may not be returned because of any secondary fault; iv) photographed lots may not be returned because of centering, margins, short/nibbed perforations or other factors shown in the illustrations; v) the color of the item does not match the color reproduction in the sale catalogue or website listing; vi) the description contains inaccurate information about the quantity known or reported; or vii) a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description or on an accompanying certificate.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they have established credit with the Galleries prior to the sale, must make payment in full before the lots will be delivered. Buyers not known to the Galleries must make payment in full within 3 days from the date of sale. The Galleries retains the right to demand a cash deposit from anyone prior to bidder registration and/or to demand payment at the time the lot is knocked down to the highest bidder, for any reason whatsoever. In the event that any buyer refuses or fails to make payment in cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. Credit cards (Visa, Mastercard and Discover only) can be accepted as payment but will be subject to a 3% non-refundable Convenience Fee, which will be added to the total of the entire invoice (including hammer price, buyer's premium, shipping and transit insurance charges and any applicable taxes). The buyer waives the right to dispute all credit card charges.

- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit specified above, nor lots taken up within 7 days from the date of sale, the lots will be resold by whatever means deemed appropriate by the Galleries, and any loss incurred from resale will be charged to the defaulting buyer. Any account more than 30 days in arrears will be subject to a late payment charge of 1½% per month as long as the account remains in arrears. Any expenses incurred in securing payment from delinquent accounts will be charged to the defaulter. A fee of \$250.00 per check will be charged for each check returned for insufficient funds.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine. Any lot accompanied by a certificate issued by The Philatelic Foundation, British Philatelic Association, Royal Philatelic Society of London or any other authority recognized by the A.I.E.P. in a specific area of expertise, and dated within 5 years of the sale date, is sold "as is" and in accordance with the description on the certificate. Such lots may not be returned for any reason, including but not limited to a contrary certificate of opinion. Buyers who wish to obtain a certificate for any item that does not have a certificate (dated as above) may do so, provided that the following conditions are met: (i) the purchase price must be paid in full, (ii) the item must be submitted to an acceptable expertizing committee with a properly executed application form within 21 days of the sale, (iii) a copy of the application form must be given to the Galleries, (iv) the Galleries retains the right to resubmit the item for reconsideration, without time limit or other restrictions, for the purpose of obtaining a satisfactory opinion, (v) lots submitted for certification will be considered cleared 90 days from the date of sale, whether or not a certificate has been issued, unless the Galleries issues written approval of a further extension of return privileges, and (vi) in the event the lot is determined to be misidentified or misdescribed, pursuant to 5 and 5(A) of these Conditions, the Galleries will issue a refund to the buyer for the full purchase price and actual certification fees up to \$800.00, but the reimbursement for certificate fees (and related costs) shall not exceed 10% of the hammer price of the lot.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of the Galleries on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Agents executing bids on behalf of clients will be held responsible for all purchases made on behalf of clients unless otherwise arranged prior to the sale.
- 11. The buyer assumes all risk for delivery of purchased lots and agrees to pay for prescribed shipping costs. Buyers who receive lots in the U.S. are obligated to pay whatever sales tax or compensating use tax might be due, at any time, and buyers outside the U.S. are responsible for all customs duties.
- 12. The bidder consents that any action or proceeding against it may be commenced and maintained in any court within the State of New York or in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, that the courts of the State of New York and United States District Court for the Southern District of New York shall have jurisdiction with respect to the subject matter hereof and the person of the bidder. The bidder agrees not to assert any defense to any action or proceeding initiated by Galleries based upon improper venue or inconvenient forum. The bidder agrees that any action brought by the bidder shall be commenced and maintained only in a Federal Court in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or the State Court in the county in which Galleries has its principal place of business in New York. The bidder agrees not to use a public conflict resolution service and not to use any form of social media to publish comments or information about the Galleries and its employees which might harm the Galleries' reputation or business. These Conditions of Sale shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of New York, and shall constitute an agreement that shall be binding on the parties, and their respective heirs, administrators, distributees, successors and assignees.

Grades, Abbreviations and Values Used in Descriptions

Grades and Centering

Our descriptions contain detailed information and observations about each item's condition. We have also assigned grades to stamps and covers, which reflect our subjective assessment. For stamps, the margin width, centering and gum are described and graded according to generally-accepted standards (an approximate correlation to numeric grades is provided at right). Although we believe our grades are accurate, they are not always exactly aligned with third-party grading terms or standards for all issues. A lot may not be returned because a certification service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description. Information from the P.S.E. Stamp Market Quarterly and P.S.E. Population Report^{5M} is the most current available, but lots may not be returned due to errors or changes in statistics or data.

Extremely Fine Gem (90-100): The term "Gem" describes condition that is the finest possible for the issue. This term is equivalent to "Superb" used by grading services.

Extremely Fine (80-90): Exceptionally large/wide margins or near perfect centering.

Very Fine (70-85): Normal-size margins for the issue and well-centered with the design a bit closer to one side. "Very Fine and choice" applies to stamps that have desirable traits such as rich color, sharp impression, freshness or clarity of cancel.

Fine (60-70): Smaller than usual margins or noticeably off center. Pre-1890 issues may have the design touched in places.

Very Good (below 60): Attractive appearance, but margins or perforations cut into the design.

Covers

Minor nicks, short edge tears, flap tears and slight reduction at one side are normal conditions for 19th century envelopes. Folded letters should be expected to have at least one file fold. Light cleaning of covers and small mends along the edges are accepted forms of conservation. Unusual covers may have a common stamp with a slight crease or tiny tear. These flaws exist in virtually all 19th century covers and are not always described. They are not grounds for return.

Catalogue Values and Estimates

For our International auctions, the number range in the right-hand column (e.g. E. 1,000-1,500) is our valuation in U.S. dollars. Our estimates tend to be conservative, as the vast majority of lots sell in the estimate range or above. These are not start prices, and if there is a reserve on a lot the reserve will never exceed the low end of the estimate range. We have quoted the Scott Catalogue value (if applicable) at the end of the description, along with any other appropriate catalogue values such as Stanley Gibbons (SG), Michel, Yvert, Unitrade, etc.).

Because of certain pricing inconsistencies in the *Scott Catalogue*—for example, blocks that have no gum, the absence of premiums for Mint N.H. items, etc.—we cannot guarantee the accuracy of values quoted for multiples, specialized items and collection lots. We generally try to be conservative, but buyers may not return a lot because of a discrepancy in catalogue value due to Scott pricing inconsistencies.





This is the first act of Parliament that created the "Setling of one General Post Office, for the speedy Conveying, Carrying, and Re-carrying of Letters by Post, to, and from all Places within England, Scotland, and Ireland". THE GORDON N. JOHN COLLECTION OF COLOMBIA AND URUGUAY

We are pleased to present another offering from the Gordon N. John collection, comprising the 1859 first issue of Colombia and the Uruguay 1859 Thin Numerals and 1860 Thick Numerals issues. These issues are represented mainly by what G.N.J. refers to as "mint multiples," a facet of philately he has held in high regard for many years. The Colombia section contains noteworthy se-tenant and tête-bêche errors in pairs and blocks, and the Uruguay is replete with scarce shades and varieties. For the serious philatelist, this offering is of monumental importance.

The printer attempted to correct the error by retouching Position 38; however, instead of making a well-defined "5" denomination, the retouching created a stamp that appears to be a "50" centavos value. Some sheets were issued with the "50" error, as evidenced by five known used examples. The two recorded unused examples both have the central vignette cut out, which was the means used by Colombian postal authorities to invalidate the "50" centavos stamps (one of the cut-out stamps is offered in lot 1334).

The stamp offered here is from the Dr. Hugo Goeggel collection (Part 2, Corinphila sale, Sep. 18-19, 2013, lot 3055). In that sale it was incorrectly assigned Scott number 3b (Violet), but it is obviously Blue and from Stone B, so it is correctly classified as Scott 2b. All seven recorded examples of the "50" error come from Stone B, and they are in shades of blue, so the Scott Catalogue listing for a Violet stamp with the "50" error should be deleted (this number should really only apply to Stone A stamps). The catalogue values 3b at \$15,000.00 and 2b at \$7,500.00.

The printer attempted to correct the error by retouching Position 38; however, instead of making a well-defined "5" denomination, the retouching created a stamp that appears to be a "50" centavos value. Some sheets were issued with the "50" error, as evidenced by five known used examples, one of which is offered in lot 1333. The two recorded unused examples both have the central vignette cut out, which was the means used by Colombian postal authorities to invalidate the "50" centavos stamps. The other unused example is a cut-out "50" error in the block of 40, ex Dr. Hugo Goeggel (Part 1, Corinphila sale, Feb. 27, 2013, lot 4312) and illustrated in the Bortfeldt book (page 25). All known examples of the "50" error come from Stone B and are in shades of blue, and therefore should be classified as Scott number 2b. RECONSTRUCTION OF THE 20-CENTAVOS STONE A FROM FOUR BLOCKS IN THE GORDON N. JOHN COLLECTION



Colombia's 1859 Issue is of profound philatelic cinterest, owing to the existence of the 5c and 20c se-tenant and tête-bêche multiples. Examples of these errors have been regarded as extremely desirable philatelic items as far back as the 19th century, when the early titans of philately were forming their monumental collections.

The se-tenant and tête-bêche multiples resulted from errors in transferring subjects to the lithographic printing stones. The two-denomination se-tenant multiples were created when the 5c value was transferred to the 20c stone. The tête-bêche multiples were created when a transfer was inverted in relation to its adjoining transfers.

The first 20c lithographic printing stone, which specialists call Stone A, produced the 5c/20c se-tenant and the 20c tête-bêche errors. It was one of several stones used by the Martinez Brothers to print stamps for the Colombian government, starting shortly after the first printing order was placed on July 24, 1859.

On Stone A (and only on this stone), one of the 20c transfers was inverted—Position 13, the second stamp in the second row. The 5c design was transferred to one position instead of the correct 20c value—Position 35, the second stamp in the fourth row. In addition to these two errors, one of the 20c positions was so poorly transferred, it required retouching—Position 25, the third stamp in the third row.

As the reconstruction above shows, there were 55 subjects on the 20c Stone A. Confusion over the sheet size was caused by the existence of a block of 50, comprising the ten vertical rows starting from the left,

which was believed by early specialists to be a full sheet. The block of 50 is illustrated in the *Edition d'Or* book on Dr. Hugo Goeggel's Colombia collection (it was not offered in the Corinphila sales of Dr. Goeggel's collection). It was acquired in the 19th century by Robert Ehrenbach, a prominent collector and Fellow of The Royal Philatelic Society London.

In the February 1899 London Philatelist, T. W. Hall described the Ehrenbach block as a "sheet," despite the fact that sheets of the 20c from Stone B were known to be arranged in a five-by-eleven format for a total of 55 stamps. This misinformation, originating with T. W. Hall, continued to confuse collectors for much of the next century.

Remarkably, the 5c/20c se-tenant block of nine and 20c tête-bêche block of eight offered in this sale (lots 1338 and 1341), together with the block of 15 and block of four shown on the opposite page (lots 1342 and 1343), originated from the same sheet. The digital reconstruction above shows these four blocks in their places in the sheet.

The key element is the top right corner-margin block of four, which provides absolute proof that the size of the Stone A sheet was 55 stamps, arranged in five rows of eleven stamps, just like Stone B (see lots 1344 and 1345).

This is the first time a collector has brought together all four multiples. Not only is this offering of these rare blocks from Stone A an opportunity for collectors, it is philatelically significant, since their reunion proves beyond doubt the correct configuration of the remarkable 20c Stone A.







There are two recorded blocks of the 1859 80c Thin Numerals issue, both unused; the only other unused multiple is a pair, and the largest used multiple is a strip of three. The block offered here is the Lichtenstein-Dale-Hoffmann block. It was exhibited by Alfred F. Lichtenstein in his display of Uruguay at the May 1940 Collectors Club Centenary Exhibition. After Alfred's death in 1947, his daughter, Louise Boyd Dale, sold a number of major Uruguay rarities to Robert Hoffmann, whose exhibit captured the Grand Award at the 1956 FIPEX exhibition in New York City. The presence of this block in both exhibitions is confirmed by photographs of the exhibit pages.

The other recorded block, also an unused block of four (Positions 21-22/33-34), is ex Sciarra and was offered in the Spink-Investphila sale of the "Tito" collection (Part 1, Mar. 16, 2012, lot 1057). The description states "orange-yellow" and the shade in the catalogue photo appears to be a bit more yellow than the color of the block offered here. We do not know if the two blocks are actually in different shades.
